## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

820 ILCS 320/4 new

Amends the Public Safety Employee Benefits Act. Provides the benefits of that Act to a person who is employed as a security guard by the State on a full-time, part-time, temporary, or contractual-payroll basis and whose death or catastrophic injury in the line of duty occurs on or after September 1, 2004. Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Public Safety Employee Benefits Act is amended by adding Section 4 as follows:
- 6 (820 ILCS 320/4 new)
- 7 Sec. 4. State security guards.
- 8 (a) A person who is employed as a security guard by the
- 9 State on a full-time, part-time, temporary, or
- 10 <u>contractual-payroll basis and who suffers a catastrophic</u>
- 11 <u>injury or is killed in the line of duty on or after September</u>
- 12 1, 2004 under circumstances described in subsection (b) of
- 13 <u>Section 10 is entitled to the benefits provided in that</u>
- 14 <u>Section, notwithstanding the "full-time" requirement of</u>
- subsection (a) of that Section.
- 16 (b) A person who is employed as a security guard by the
- 17 State on a full-time, part-time, temporary, or
- 18 <u>contractual-payroll</u> basis and who is accidentally or
- 19 unlawfully and intentionally killed on or after September 1,
- 20 <u>2004 under circumstances described in subsection (b) of Section</u>
- 21 10 is entitled to the benefits provided in Section 15,
- 22 notwithstanding the "full-time" requirement of subsection (a)
- of Section 10.
- (c) "State" means the State of Illinois and any of its
- 25 <u>departments</u>, <u>divisions</u>, <u>boards</u>, <u>bureaus</u>, <u>commissions</u>,
- 26 <u>authorities</u>, colleges, and universities.
- 27 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 28 becoming law.
