- 3 Chicago was suddenly closed, leaving over 3,000 employees
- 4 jobless and without their contracted benefits; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Wisconsin Steelworkers formed the Save Our
- 6 Jobs Committee led by Frank Lumpkin to explore efforts to
- 7 reopen the mill and win payment of their benefits; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The Save Our Jobs Committee finally won \$19
- 9 million in court settlements after a 16 year effort that
- 10 included attending committee hearings of the Illinois
- 11 Legislature in Springfield, an hour on the agenda of the
- 12 House of Representatives in Washington, D.C., meetings with
- 13 Mayor Harold Washington's Task Forces on Steel, Displaced
- 14 Workers, and Hunger, and numerous sessions of several
- 15 different courts; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The former Wisconsin Steelworkers have joined
- 17 with other steelworker retirees and other retirees to form
- 18 Seniors Organized for Justice, affiliated with the Illinois
- 19 Alliance for Retired Americans, and are now actively pursuing
- 20 a better healthcare system that provides prescription drugs
- 21 under Medicare and includes healthcare for all; therefore, be
- 22 it

- 25 we congratulate these fighting senior citizens for their
