         (a) The Department shall develop and implement a child
     care capital investment program. The purposes of the program
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     are as follows:
              (1) To assess the need for additional licensed
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         child care providers in low-income communities.
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              (2) To provide planning and technical assistance to
         prepare child care providers for making capital
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         investments.
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              (3) To provide grants as part of a financing
         package to build new child care capacity in high-need
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         communities throughout the State.
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         (b) The Department's implementation of the program must
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     include the following features:
              (1) Completion of a demographics-based needs
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         assessment of subsidized full-day, full-year child care
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         in Illinois.
              (2) Issuance of requests for proposals to child
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         care providers who are seeking new facilities or seeking
         renovations to expand existing capacity. Proposals must
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         be submitted in 2 parts:
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                   (A) An initial indication of interest,
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              including a project description, community benefits
