- Sec. 8.1. Temporary license. On and after January 1,
- 14 <u>2004</u>, a <u>person who undertakes supervised professional</u>

- 16 <u>subsection</u> (f) of <u>Section</u> 8 and the rules adopted by the
- 17 <u>Department, must obtain a temporary license from the</u>
