Sec. 8.1. Temporary license. On and after January 1, 2004, a person who has met the requirements of items (a) through (e) of Section 8 and intends to undertake supervised professional experience as a speech-language pathologist, as required by subsection (f) of Section 8 and the rules adopted by the Department, must first obtain a temporary license from the Department. A temporary license may be issued by the Department only to an applicant pursuing licensure as a speech-language pathologist in this State. A temporary license shall be issued to an applicant upon receipt of the required fee as set forth by rule and documentation on forms prescribed by the Department demonstrating that a licensed speech-language pathologist has agreed to supervise the professional experience of the applicant. A temporary license shall be issued for a period of 12 months and may be renewed
