AN ACT concerning schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing
5 Section 24-2 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/24-2) (from Ch. 122, par. 24-2)

7 Sec. 24-2. Holidays.

8 (a) Teachers shall not be required to teach on 9 Saturdays; nor, except as provided in subsection (b) of this Section, shall teachers or other school employees, other than 10 noncertificated school employees whose presence is necessary 11 because of an emergency or for the continued operation and 12 13 maintenance of school facilities or property, be required to work on legal school holidays, which are January 1, New 14 15 Year's Day; the third Monday in January, the Birthday of Dr. 16 Martin Luther King, Jr.; February 12, the Birthday of President Abraham Lincoln; the first Monday in March (to be 17 18 known as Casimir Pulaski's birthday); Good-Friday; the day 19 designated as Memorial Day by federal law; July 4, 20 Independence Day; the first Monday in September, Labor Day; the second Monday in October, Columbus Day; November 21 11, 22 Veterans' Veteran's Day; the Thursday in November commonly called Thanksgiving Day; and December 25, Christmas Day. 23 School boards may grant special holidays whenever in their 24 judgment such action is advisable, except that no school 25 26 board or board of education may designate or observe as a 27 special holiday on which teachers or other school employees are not required to work the days on which general elections 28 29 for members of the Illinois House of Representatives are deduction shall be made from the time or 30 held. No 31 compensation of a school employee on account of any legal or 1 special holiday.

2 (b) A school board is authorized to hold school on the following legal school holidays or to use the holidays for 3 4 teachers' institutes, parent-teacher conferences, staff 5 development, or other purposes, provided the person or 6 persons honored by the holiday are recognized through 7 instructional activities conducted on that day or at another 8 time during the school year: the third Monday in January, the 9 Birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.; February 12, the 10 Birthday of President Abraham Lincoln; the first Monday in March, Casimir Pulaski's birthday; the second Monday in 11 October, Columbus Day; and November 11, Veterans' Day. 12

13 (c) Commemorative holidays, which recognize specified patriotic, civic, cultural or historical persons, activities, 14 15 or events, are regular school days. Commemorative holidays 16 are: January 28 (to be known as Christa McAuliffe Day and observed as a commemoration of space exploration), February 17 15 (the birthday of Susan B. Anthony), March 29 (Viet Nam War 18 19 Veterans' Veterans Day), September 11 (September 11th Day of 20 Remembrance), the school day immediately preceding Veterans' 21 Veteran's Day (Korean War Veterans' Veterans Day), October 1 22 (Recycling Day), December 7 (Pearl Harbor Veterans' Veterans 23 Day) and any day so appointed by the President or Governor. School boards may establish commemorative holidays whenever 24 25 in their judgment such action is advisable. School boards shall include instruction relative to commemorated persons, 26 27 activities, or events on the commemorative holiday or at any other time during the school year and at any point in the 28 29 curriculum when such instruction may be deemed appropriate. 30 The State Board of Education shall prepare and make available to school boards instructional materials relative 31 to 32 commemorated persons, activities, or events which may be used 33 by school boards in conjunction with any instruction provided 34 pursuant to this subsection (c) paragraph.

(d) City of Chicago School District 299 shall observe 1 March 4 of each year as a commemorative holiday. This 2 3 holiday shall be known as Mayors' Day which shall be a day to 4 commemorate and be reminded of the past Chief Executive Officers of the City of Chicago, and in particular the late 5 Mayor Richard J. Daley and the late Mayor Harold Washington. 6 7 If March 4 falls on a Saturday or Sunday, Mayors' Day shall be observed on the following Monday. 8
