AN ACT in relation to physician assistants and advance
 practice nurses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

5 Section 5. The Illinois Identification Card Act is 6 amended by changing Section 4 as follows:

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(15 ILCS 335/4) (from Ch. 124, par. 24)

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Sec. 4. Identification Card.

The Secretary of State shall issue a standard 9 (a) Illinois Identification Card to any natural person who is a 10 resident of the State of Illinois who applies for such card, 11 or renewal thereof, or who applies for a standard 12 Illinois 13 Identification Card upon release as a committed person on parole, mandatory supervised release, final discharge, or 14 15 pardon from the Department of Corrections by submitting an 16 identification card issued by the Department of Corrections under Section 3-14-1 of the Unified Code of Corrections, 17 18 together with the prescribed fees. The card shall be 19 prepared and supplied by the Secretary of State and shall 20 include a photograph of the applicant. The applicant, upon receipt of a card and prior to its use for any purpose, shall 21 22 affix his signature thereon in the space provided therefor. Illinois Identification Card 23 The may be used for identification purposes in any lawful situation only 24 by the 25 to whom it was issued. As used in this Act, person "photograph" means any color photograph or digitally produced 26 27 and captured image of an applicant for an identification As used in this Act, "signature" means the name of a 28 card. 29 person as written by that person and captured in a manner acceptable to the Secretary of State. 30

31 (b) The Secretary of State shall issue a special

1 Illinois Identification Card, which shall be known as an Illinois Disabled Person Identification Card, to any natural 2 person who is a resident of the State of Illinois, who is 3 a 4 disabled person as defined in Section 4A of this Act, who 5 applies for such card, or renewal thereof. The Secretary of 6 State shall charge no fee to issue such card. The card shall 7 be prepared and supplied by the Secretary of State, and shall 8 include a photograph of the applicant, a designation 9 indicating that the card is an Illinois Disabled Person Identification Card, and shall include a comprehensible 10 11 designation of the type and classification of the applicant's disability as set out in Section 4A of this Act. If the 12 applicant so requests, the card shall include a description 13 of the applicant's disability and any information about the 14 applicant's disability or medical history which the Secretary 15 16 determines would be helpful to the applicant in securing emergency medical care. The applicant, upon receipt of such 17 a card and prior to its use for any purpose, shall have 18 19 affixed thereon in the space provided therefor his signature or mark. If a mark is used in lieu of a signature, such mark 20 21 shall be affixed to the card in the presence of two witnesses 22 who attest to the authenticity of the mark. The Illinois 23 Disabled Person Identification Card may be used for identification purposes in any lawful situation by the person 24 25 to whom it was issued.

The Illinois Disabled Person Identification Card may be 26 27 used adequate documentation of disability in lieu of a as physician's determination of disability, a determination of 28 29 disability from a physician assistant who has been delegated 30 the authority to make this determination by his or her supervising physician, a determination of disability from an 31 32 advanced practice nurse who has a written collaborative 33 agreement with a collaborating physician that authorizes the 34 advanced practice nurse to make this determination, or any

1 other documentation of disability whenever any State law 2 requires that a disabled person provide such documentation of Illinois Disabled 3 disability, however an Person 4 Identification Card shall not qualify the cardholder to participate in any program or to receive any benefit which is 5 6 not available to all persons with like disabilities. 7 Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, an Illinois Disabled Person Identification Card, or evidence that 8 the 9 Secretary of State has issued an Illinois Disabled Person Identification Card, shall not be used by any person other 10 11 than the person named on such card to prove that the person named on such card is a disabled person or for any other 12 purpose unless the card is used for the benefit of the person 13 named on such card, and the person named on such card 14 consents to such use at the time the card is so used. 15

16 When medical information is contained on an Illinois 17 Disabled Person Identification Card, the Office of the 18 Secretary of State shall not be liable for any actions taken 19 based upon that medical information.

(c) Beginning January 1, 1986, the Secretary of State 20 shall provide that each original or renewal Illinois 21 22 Identification Card or Illinois Disabled Person 23 Identification Card issued to a person under the age of 21, shall be of a distinct nature 24 from those Illinois 25 Identification Cards or Illinois Disabled Person Identification Cards issued to individuals 21 years of age or 26 older. The color designated for Illinois Identification Cards 27 or Illinois Disabled Person Identification Cards for persons 28 29 under the age of 21 shall be at the discretion of the 30 Secretary of State.

31 (c-1) Beginning January 1, 2003, each original or 32 renewal Illinois Identification Card or Illinois Disabled 33 Person Identification Card issued to a person under the age 34 of 21 shall display the date upon which the person becomes 18 years of age and the date upon which the person becomes 21
 years of age.

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(d) The Secretary of State may issue a Senior Citizen 3 4 discount card, to any natural person who is a resident of the 5 State of Illinois who is 60 years of age or older and who б applies for such a card or renewal thereof. The Secretary of 7 State shall charge no fee to issue such card. The card shall 8 be issued in every county and applications shall be made 9 available at, but not limited to, nutrition sites, senior citizen centers and Area Agencies on Aging. 10 The applicant, 11 upon receipt of such card and prior to its use for any purpose, shall have affixed thereon in the space provided 12 therefor his signature or mark. 13

Section 10. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing Sections 1-159.1 and 3-616 as follows:

17 (625 ILCS 5/1-159.1) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 1-159.1)

Sec. 1-159.1. Person with disabilities. A natural person 18 19 who, as determined by a licensed physician, by a physician 20 assistant who has been delegated the authority to make this 21 determination by his or her supervising physician, or by an 22 advanced practice nurse who has a written collaborative 23 agreement with a collaborating physician that authorizes the 24 advanced practice nurse to make this determination: (1) cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from, a brace, 25 cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device, wheelchair, 26 or other assistive device; (2) is restricted by lung disease 27 28 to such an extent that his or her forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one second, 29 when measured by 30 is less than one liter, or the arterial oxygen spirometry, tension is less than 60 mm/hg on room air at rest; (3) uses 31 portable oxygen; (4) has a cardiac condition to the extent 32

1 that the person's functional limitations are classified in 2 severity as Class III or Class IV, according to standards set by the American Heart Association; (5) is severely limited in 3 4 person's ability to walk due to an arthritic, the 5 neurological, or orthopedic condition; or (6) cannot walk 200 б feet without stopping to rest because of one of the above 5 7 conditions.

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(625 ILCS 5/3-616) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-616)

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Sec. 3-616. Person with disabilities license plates.

(a) Upon receiving an application for a certificate of 11 registration for a motor vehicle of the first division or for 12 a motor vehicle of the second division weighing no more than 13 14 8,000 pounds, accompanied with payment of the registration 15 fees required under this Code from a person with disabilities or a person who is deaf or hard of hearing, the Secretary of 16 State, 17 if so requested, shall issue to such person registration plates as provided for in Section 18 3-611, provided that the person with disabilities or person who is 19 20 deaf or hard of hearing must not be disqualified from obtaining a driver's license under subsection 8 of Section 21 22 6-103 of this Code, and further provided that any person making such a request must submit a statement, certified by a 23 24 licensed physician, by a physician assistant who has been 25 delegated the authority to make this certification by his or 26 her supervising physician, or by an advanced practice nurse who has a written collaborative agreement with a 27 28 collaborating physician that authorizes the advanced practice nurse to make this certification, to the effect that such 29 person is a person with disabilities as defined by Section 30 31 1-159.1 of this Code, or alternatively provide adequate documentation that such person has a Class 1A, Class 2A or 32 Type Four disability under the provisions of Section 4A of 33

1 the Illinois Identification Card Act. For purposes of this 2 Section, an Illinois Disabled Person Identification Card 3 issued pursuant to the Illinois Identification Card Act 4 indicating that the person thereon named has a disability 5 shall be adequate documentation of such a disability.

(b) The Secretary shall issue plates under this Section 6 7 to a parent or legal guardian of a person with disabilities 8 if the person with disabilities has a Class 1A or Class 2A 9 disability as defined in Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act or is a person with disabilities as 10 11 defined by Section 1-159.1 of this Code, and does not possess a vehicle registered in his or her name, provided that the 12 person with disabilities relies frequently on the parent or 13 legal guardian for transportation. Only one vehicle per 14 15 family may be registered under this subsection, unless the 16 applicant can justify in writing the need for one additional set of plates. Any person requesting special plates under 17 this subsection shall submit such documentation or such 18 19 physician's, physician assistant's, or advanced practice nurse's statement as is required in subsection (a) and a 20 21 statement describing the circumstances qualifying for 22 issuance of special plates under this subsection.

23 The Secretary may issue a person with disabilities (C) parking decal or device to a person with disabilities as 24 25 defined by Section 1-159.1 without regard to qualification of such person with disabilities for a driver's license or 26 registration of a vehicle by such person with disabilities or 27 such person's immediate family, provided such person with 28 disabilities making such a request has been issued a Disabled 29 30 Person Identification Card indicating that the person named 31 thereon has а Class 1A or Class 2A disability, or 32 alternatively, submits a statement certified by a licensed 33 physician, or by a physician assistant or an advanced 34 practice nurse as provided in subsection (a), to the effect

that such person is a person with disabilities as defined by
 Section 1-159.1.

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(d) The Secretary shall prescribe by rules and 3 4 regulations procedures to certify or re-certify as necessary 5 the eligibility of persons whose disabilities are other than б permanent for special plates or person with disabilities 7 parking decals or devices issued under subsections (a), (b) 8 and (c). Except as provided under subsection (f) of this 9 Section, no such special plates, decals or devices shall be issued by the Secretary of State to or on behalf of any 10 11 person with disabilities unless such person is certified as meeting the definition of a person with disabilities pursuant 12 to Section 1-159.1 or meeting the requirement of a Type Four 13 disability as provided under Section 4A of the Illinois 14 15 Identification Card Act for the period of time that the 16 physician, or the physician assistant or advanced practice nurse as provided in subsection (a), determines the applicant 17 will have the disability, but not to exceed 6 months from the 18 19 date of certification or recertification.

(e) Any person requesting special plates under this
Section may also apply to have the special plates
personalized, as provided under Section 3-405.1.

23 The Secretary of State, upon application, shall (f) issue person with disabilities registration plates or a 24 25 person with disabilities parking decal to corporations, school districts, State or municipal agencies, 26 limited 27 liability companies, nursing homes, convalescent homes, or special education cooperatives which will transport persons 28 with disabilities. The Secretary shall prescribe by rule a 29 30 means to certify or re-certify the eligibility of organizations to receive person with disabilities plates or 31 32 decals and to designate which of the 2 person with 33 disabilities emblems shall be placed on qualifying vehicles. (g) The Secretary of State, or his designee, may enter 34

1 into agreements with other jurisdictions, including foreign 2 jurisdictions, on behalf of this State relating to the 3 extension of parking privileges by such jurisdictions to 4 permanently disabled residents of this State who display a 5 special license plate or parking device that contains the б International symbol of access on his or her motor vehicle, 7 and to recognize such plates or devices issued by such other jurisdictions. This State shall grant the same parking 8 privileges which are granted to disabled residents of this 9 State to any non-resident whose motor vehicle is licensed in 10 11 another state, district, territory or foreign country if such vehicle displays the international symbol of access or a 12 distinguishing insignia on license plates or parking device 13 issued in accordance with the laws of the non-resident's 14 state, district, territory or foreign country. 15
