- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Act on the Aging is amended by
- 5 adding Section 4.07 as follows:
- 6 (20 ILCS 105/4.07 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 4.07. Home-delivered meals. Every citizen of the</u>
- 8 State of Illinois who qualifies for home-delivered meals
- 9 <u>under the federal Older Americans Act shall be provided</u>
- 10 <u>services</u>, <u>subject to appropriation</u>. <u>The Department shall</u>
- 11 <u>file a report with the General Assembly and the Illinois</u>
- 12 <u>Council on Aging by January 1 of each year. The report shall</u>
- include, but not be limited to, the following information:
- 14 (i) estimates, by county, of citizens denied service due to
- 15 <u>insufficient funds during the preceding fiscal year and the</u>
- 16 potential impact on service delivery of any additional funds
- 17 <u>appropriated for the current fiscal year; (ii) geographic</u>
- 18 <u>areas and special populations unserved and underserved in the</u>
- 19 preceding fiscal year; (iii) estimates of additional funds

needed to permit the full funding of the program and the

- 21 <u>statewide provision of services in the next fiscal year,</u>
- 22 <u>including staffing and equipment needed to prepare and</u>
- 23 <u>deliver meals; (iv) recommendations for increasing the amount</u>
- 24 of federal funding captured for the program; (v)
- 25 <u>recommendations for serving unserved and underserved areas</u>
- 26 <u>and special populations, to include rural areas, dietetic</u>
- 27 <u>meals</u>, <u>weekend meals</u>, <u>and 2 or more meals per day</u>; <u>and (vi)</u>
- 28 any other information needed to assist the General Assembly
- 29 <u>and the Illinois Council on Aging in developing a plan to</u>
- 30 <u>address unserved and underserved areas of the State.</u>
