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AN ACT in relation to public aid.

- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:
- Section 5. The Illinois Public Aid Code is amended by
 adding Section 4-23 as follows:
- 6 (305 ILCS 5/4-23 new)

Sec. 4-23. Civil rights impact statement. The Department 7 8 of Human Services must submit to the Governor and the General Assembly on January 1 of each even-numbered year a written 9 report that details the disparate impact of various 10 provisions of the TANF program on people of different racial 11 or ethnic groups who identify themselves in an application 12 for benefits as (i) White, not of Hispanic origin, (ii) 13 Black, not of Hispanic origin, (iii) Asian or Pacific 14 Islander, (iv) Hispanic (includes Mexican, Puerto Rican, 15 16 Cuban, Dominican, or other South or Central American culture, regardless of race), (v) other, or (vi) racial or ethnic 17 group not available. The report must at least compare the 18 number of persons in each group: 19

21 <u>(2) whose 60-month lifetime limit on receiving</u>
22 <u>assistance has expired;</u>

(1) who are receiving TANF assistance;

23 (3) who have left TANF due to earned income;

24 (4) who have left TANF due to non-compliance with 25 program rules;

- 26(5) whose TANF grants have been reduced by27sanctions for non-compliance with program rules;
- 28 (6) who have returned to TANF 6 months after
 29 leaving due to earned income;
- 30 <u>(7) who have returned to TANF 12 months after</u>
 31 <u>leaving due to earned income;</u>

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1	(8) who have one or more children excluded from
2	receiving TANF cash assistance due to the child exclusion
3	<u>rule;</u>
4	(9) who have been granted an exemption from work
5	requirements; and
б	(10) who are participating in post-secondary
7	education activities.
8	Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
9	becoming law.
