- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Procurement Code is amended by
- 5 adding Section 50-10.5 and changing Section 50-60 as follows:

- 7 <u>Sec. 50-10.5. Prohibited bidders and contractors.</u>
- 8 (a) Unless otherwise provided, no business shall bid or
- 9 <u>enter into a contract with the State of Illinois or any State</u>
- 10 agency if the business or any officer, director, partner, or
- 11 other managerial agent of the business has been convicted of
- 12 <u>a felony under the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002 or a Class 3 or</u>
- 13 <u>Class 2 felony under the Illinois Securities Law of 1953 for</u>
- 14 <u>a period of 5 years from the date of conviction.</u>
- (b) Every bid submitted to and contract executed by the
- 16 State shall contain a certification by the bidder or
- 17 <u>contractor that the contractor is not barred from being</u>

- 19 <u>acknowledges that the contracting State agency shall declare</u>

- 3 Sec. 50-60. Voidable contracts.
- 4 (a) If any contract is entered into or purchase or
- 5 expenditure of funds is made in violation of this Code or any
- 6 other law, the contract may be declared void by the chief
- 7 procurement officer or may be ratified and affirmed, provided
- 8 the chief procurement officer determines that ratification is
- 9 in the best interests of the State. If the contract is
- 10 ratified and affirmed, it shall be without prejudice to the
- 11 State's rights to any appropriate damages.
- 12 (b) If, during the term of a contract, the contracting
- 13 agency determines that the contractor is delinquent in the
