AN ACT concerning elections.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

Section 5. The Election Code is amended by adding Sections 5 4-50, 5-50, and 6-100 as follows:

(10 ILCS 5/4-50 new) 6

7 Sec. 4-50. Grace period. Notwithstanding any other 8 provision of this Code to the contrary, each election authority shall establish procedures for the registration of voters and 9 for change of address during the period from the close of 10 registration for a primary or election and until the 14th day 11 before the primary or election. During this grace period, an 12 unregistered qualified elector may register to vote, and a 13 14 registered voter may submit a change of address form, in person 15 in the office of the election authority or at a voter registration location specifically designated for this purpose 16 by the election authority. The election authority shall 17 register that individual, or change a registered voter's 18 19 address, in the same manner as otherwise provided by this Article for registration and change of address. 20

21 If a voter who registers or changes address during this grace period wishes to vote at the first election or primary 22 occurring after the grace period, he or she must do so by grace 23 period voting, either in person in the office of the election 24 authority or at a location specifically designated for this 25 26 purpose by the election authority, or by mail, at the discretion of the election authority. Grace period voting shall 27 be in a manner substantially similar to voting under Article 28 19. Ballots cast by persons who register or change address 29 30 during the grace period must be transmitted to and counted at the election authority's central ballot counting location and 31 shall not be transmitted to and counted at precinct polling 32

31 <u>Sec. 6-100. Grace period. Notwithstanding any other</u> 32 provision of this Code to the contrary, each election authority 33 <u>shall establish procedures for the registration of voters and</u> 34 <u>for change of address during the period from the close of</u> SB2133 Enrolled

1 registration for a primary or election and until the 14th day 2 before the primary or election. During this grace period, an unregistered qualified elector may register to vote, and a 3 registered voter may submit a change of address form, in person 4 5 in the office of the election authority or at a voter registration location specifically designated for this purpose 6 by the election authority. The election authority shall 7 register that individual, or change a registered voter's 8 9 address, in the same manner as otherwise provided by this Article for registration and change of address. 10

11 If a voter who registers or changes address during this 12 grace period wishes to vote at the first election or primary occurring after the grace period, he or she must do so by grace 13 period voting, either in person in the office of the election 14 authority or at a location specifically designated for this 15 16 purpose by the election authority, or by mail, at the 17 discretion of the election authority. Grace period voting shall be in a manner substantially similar to voting under Article 18 19. Ballots cast by persons who register or change address 19 20 during the grace period must be transmitted to and counted at the election authority's central ballot counting location and 21 shall not be transmitted to and counted at precinct polling 22 23 places.
