SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

40 ILCS 5/5-154 30 ILCS 805/8.28 new from Ch. 108 1/2, par. 5-154

Amends the Chicago Police Article of the Illinois Pension Code. Beginning January 1, 2005, increases the duty disability benefit to 75% of the current salary attached from time to time to the rank held by the policeman at the time of removal from the police department payroll. Amends the State Mandates Act to require implementation without reimbursement. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Pension Code is amended by changing
Section 5-154 as follows:

(40 ILCS 5/5-154) (from Ch. 108 1/2, par. 5-154)

7 Sec. 5-154. Duty disability benefit; child's disability8 benefit.

(a) An active policeman who becomes disabled on or after 9 the effective date as the result of injury incurred on or after 10 such date in the performance of an act of duty, has a right to 11 receive duty disability benefit during any period of such 12 disability for which he does not have a right to receive 13 14 salary, equal to 75% of his salary, as salary is defined in 15 this Article, at the time the disability is allowed; or in the case of a policeman on duty disability who returns to active 16 17 employment at any time for a period of at least 2 years and is again disabled from the same cause or causes, 75% of his 18 19 salary, as salary is defined in this Article, at the time disability is allowed; provided, however, that: 20

(i) If the disability resulted from any physical defect
or mental disorder or any disease which existed at the time
the injury was sustained, or if the disability is less than
50% of total disability for any service of a remunerative
character, the duty disability benefit shall be 50% of
salary as defined in this Article.

(ii) Beginning January 1, 1996, no duty disability benefit that has been payable under this Section for at least 10 years shall be less than 50% of the current salary attached from time to time to the rank held by the policeman at the time of removal from the police department payroll, regardless of whether that removal occurred - 2 - LRB093 20980 LRD 46977 b

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1 before the effective date of this amendatory Act of 1995. 2 Beginning on January 1, 2000, no duty disability benefit 3 that has been payable under this Section for at least 7 years shall be less than 60% of the current salary attached 4 5 from time to time to the rank held by the policeman at the 6 time of removal from the police department payroll, regardless of whether that removal occurred before the 7 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 92nd General 8 9 Assembly. Beginning on January 1, 2005, no duty disability benefit that is payable under this Section shall be less 10 11 than 75% of the current salary attached from time to time 12 to the rank held by the policeman at the time of removal from the police department payroll, regardless of whether 13 that removal occurred before the effective date of this 14 amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly. 15

16 (iii) If the Board finds that the disability of the 17 policeman is of such a nature as to permanently render him totally disabled for any service of a remunerative 18 character, the duty disability benefit shall be 75% of the 19 20 salary attached from time to time to the rank held by the policeman at the time of removal from the police 21 department payroll. In the case of a policeman receiving a 22 duty disability benefit under this Section on the effective 23 of this amendatory Act of the 92nd General Assembly, 24 25 the increase in benefit provided by this amendatory Act, if 26 any, shall begin to accrue as of the date that the Board 27 makes the required finding of permanent total disability, 28 regardless of whether removal from the payroll occurred 29 before the effective date of this amendatory Act.

30 (b) The policeman shall also have a right to child's 31 disability benefit of \$100 per month for each unmarried child, 32 the issue of the policeman, less than age 18, but the total 33 amount of child's disability benefit shall not exceed 25% of 34 his salary as defined in this Article. The increase in child's 35 disability benefit provided by this amendatory Act of the 92nd 36 General Assembly applies beginning January 1, 2000 to all such - 3 - LRB093 20980 LRD 46977 b

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benefits payable on or after that date, regardless of whether the disabled policeman is in active service on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act.

4 (c) Duty disability benefit shall be payable until the 5 policeman becomes age 63 or would have been retired by 6 operation of law, whichever is later, and child's disability 7 benefit shall be paid during any such period of disability 8 until the child attains age 18. Thereafter the policeman shall 9 receive the annuity provided in accordance with the other 10 provisions of this Article.

(d) A policeman who suffers a heart attack during the 11 12 performance and discharge of his or her duties as a policeman shall be considered injured in the performance of an act of 13 duty and shall be eligible for all benefits that the City 14 15 provides for police officers injured in the performance of an 16 act of duty. This subsection (d) is a restatement of existing 17 law and applies without regard to whether the policeman is in service on or after the effective date of Public Act 89-12 or 18 19 this amendatory Act of 1996.

21 Section 90. The State Mandates Act is amended by adding 22 Section 8.28 as follows:

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(30 ILCS 805/8.28 new)

24 Sec. 8.28. Exempt mandate. Notwithstanding Sections 6 and 8
25 of this Act, no reimbursement by the State is required for the
26 implementation of any mandate created by this amendatory Act of
27 the 93rd General Assembly.

28 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 29 becoming law.
