#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes appropriations for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, as follows:

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A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

12           Whenever it becomes necessary for the State or any  
13 governmental unit to furnish in a disaster area emergency  
14 services directly related to or required by a disaster and  
15 existing funds are insufficient to provide such services, the  
16 Governor may, when he considers such action in the best  
17 interest of the State, release funds from the General Revenue  
18 disaster relief appropriation in order to provide such  
19 services or to reimburse local governmental bodies furnishing  
20 such services. Such appropriation may be used for payment of  
21 the Illinois National Guard when called to active duty in  
22 case of disaster, and for the emergency purchase or renting  
23 of equipment and commodities. Such appropriation shall be  
24 used for emergency services and relief to the disaster area  
25 as a whole and shall not be used to provide private relief to  
26 persons sustaining property damages or personal injury as a  
27 result of a disaster.

13 Section 3. The amount of \$400,000, or so much thereof as  
14 may be necessary and as remains unexpended at the close of  
15 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore  
16 made in Public Act 93-68, Article 1, Section 8, is  
17 reappropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois  
18 Emergency Management Agency for providing services and for  
19 costs associated with homeland security.

20 Section 4. The sum of \$63,300, or so much thereof as may  
21 be necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation Protection  
22 Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for  
23 licensing facilities where radioactive uranium and thorium  
24 mill tailings are generated or located, and related costs for  
25 regulating the decontamination and decommissioning of such  
26 facilities and for identification, decontamination and  
27 environmental monitoring of unlicensed properties  
28 contaminated with such radioactive mill tailings.

29 Section 5. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof as  
30 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Illinois Emergency

1 Management Agency from the September 11<sup>th</sup> Fund for grants,  
 2 contracts and administrative expenses pursuant to 625 ILCS  
 3 5/3-653, including prior year costs.

4 Section 6. The following named amounts, or so much

9 Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency  
10 for reimbursing other governmental agencies for their  
11 assistance in responding to radiological emergencies.

12 Section 9. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as  
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation  
14 Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency  
15 for recovery and remediation of radioactive materials and  
16 contaminated facilities or properties when such expenses  
17 cannot be paid by a responsible person or an available  
18 surety.

19 Section 10. The amount of \$380,000, or so much thereof  
20 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Indoor Radon  
21 Mitigation Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency  
22 for expenses relating to the federally funded State Indoor  
23 Radon Abatement Program.

24 Section 11. The following named amounts, or so much  
25 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated  
26 to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for the objects  
27 and purposes hereinafter enumerated:

26 Section 14. The sum of \$1,865,450, or so much thereof as  
27 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation  
28 Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency  
29 for licensing facilities where radioactive uranium and  
30 thorium mill tailings are generated or located, and related  
31 costs for regulating the decontamination and decommissioning  
32 of such facilities and for identification, decontamination  
33 and environmental monitoring of unlicensed properties

1 contaminated with such radioactive mill tailings.

2 Section 15. The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as  
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation  
4 Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency  
5 to conduct studies, investigations, training, research and  
6 demonstrations relating to the control or measurement of  
7 radiation, the effects on health of exposure to radiation,  
8 and related problems under funding agreements with the  
9 Federal Government, interstate agencies or other sources.

10 Section 16. The sum of \$713,700, or so much thereof as  
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation  
12 Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency  
13 for the purpose of funding costs related to environmental  
14 cleanup of the Ottawa Radiation Areas Superfund Project under  
15 cooperative agreements with the Federal Government.

16 Section 17. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as  
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Nuclear Safety  
18 Emergency Preparedness Fund to the Illinois Emergency  
19 Management Agency for related training and travel expenses  
20 and to reimburse the Illinois State Police and the Illinois  
21 Commerce Commission for costs incurred for activities related  
22 to inspecting and escorting shipments of spent nuclear fuel,  
23 high-level radioactive waste, and transuranic waste in  
24 Illinois as provided under the rules of the Agency.

25 Section 18. The sum of \$200,000, or so much thereof as  
26 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Sheffield Agreed  
27 Order Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for  
28 the care, maintenance, monitoring, testing, remediation and  
29 insurance of the low-level radioactive waste disposal site  
30 near Sheffield, Illinois.

1           Section 19. The sum of \$828,550, or so much thereof as  
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Low-Level  
3 Radioactive Waste Facility Development and Operation Fund to  
4 the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for use in  
5 accordance with Section 14(a) of the Illinois Low-Level  
6 Radioactive Waste Management Act for costs related to  
7 establishing a low-level radioactive waste disposal facility.

8           Section 20. Certain Federal receipts shall be placed in  
9 the General Revenue Fund, pursuant to law and regulation, as  
10 reimbursement for the Federal share of expenditures made from  
11 General Revenue appropriations in Sections 1, 6 and 12 of  
12 this Article. Other Federal receipts shall be paid into the  
13 proper trust fund and shall be available for expenditure only  
14 pursuant to the trust fund appropriations in Sections 1, 2,  
15 6, 10 and 12 of this Article or suitable appropriation made  
16 by the General Assembly.

17           Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect on July 1,  
18 2004.
