SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Volunteer Firefighter Job Protection Act to also provide volunteer emergency workers with job protections. Changes the short title of the Act to the Volunteer Emergency Worker Job Protection Act. Provides that the Act does not apply to municipalities of 3,500 or more. Defines volunteer emergency worker. Makes other changes.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The Volunteer Firefighter Job Protection Act is 5 amended by changing Sections 1, 3, 5, and 20 as follows:

Sec. 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
Volunteer <u>Emergency Worker Firefighter</u> Job Protection Act.

11 Sec. 3. Definitions. As used in this Act:

12 "Volunteer emergency worker firefighter" means а 13 firefighter who does not receive monetary compensation for his 14 or her services to a fire department or fire protection 15 district and who does not work for any other fire department or fire protection district for monetary compensation. <u>"Volunteer</u> 16 17 emergency worker" also means a person who does not receive 18 monetary compensation for his or her services as a volunteer Emergency Medical Technician (licensed as an EMT-B, EMT-I, or 19 20 EMT-P under the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems Act), a volunteer ambulance driver or attendant, or a volunteer 21 "First Responder", as defined in Sec. 3.60 of the Emergency 22 Medical Services (EMT) Systems Act, to a fire department, fire 23 24 protection district, or other governmental entity and who does 25 not work in one of these capacities for any other fire department, fire protection district, or governmental entity 26 27 for monetary compensation.

28 "Monetary compensation" does not include a monetary 29 incentive awarded to a firefighter by the board of trustees of 30 a fire protection district under Section 6 of the Fire 31 Protection District Act. - 2 - LRB094 05165 AJO 36388 b

3 Sec. 5. Volunteer <u>emergency worker</u> firefighter; when
4 termination of employment prohibited.

5 (a) No public or private employer may terminate an employee 6 who is a volunteer <u>emergency worker</u> firefighter because the 7 employee, when acting as a volunteer <u>emergency worker</u> 8 firefighter, is absent from or late to his or her employment in 9 order to respond to an emergency prior to the time the employee 10 is to report to his or her place of employment.

(b) An employer may charge, against the employee's regular pay, any time that an employee who is a volunteer <u>emergency</u> <u>worker firefighter</u> loses from employment because of the employee's response to an emergency in the course of performing his or her duties as a volunteer <u>emergency worker firefighter</u>.

16 (c) In the case of an employee who is a volunteer emergency worker firefighter and who loses time from his or her 17 18 employment in order to respond to an emergency in the course of 19 performing his or her duties as a volunteer <u>emergency worker</u> 20 firefighter, the employer has the right to request the employee to provide the employer with a written statement from the 21 22 supervisor or acting supervisor of the volunteer fire 23 department or governmental entity that the volunteer emergency 24 worker serves stating that the employee responded to an 25 emergency and stating the time and date of the emergency.

(d) An employee who is a volunteer <u>emergency worker</u> firefighter and who may be absent from or late to his or her employment in order to respond to an emergency in the course of performing his or her duties as a volunteer <u>emergency worker</u> firefighter must make a reasonable effort to notify his or her employer that he or she may be absent or late.
