

94TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2005 and 2006 HB1176

Introduced 02/08/05, by Rep. Angelo Saviano

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

70 ILCS 805/8

from Ch. 96 1/2, par. 6315

Amends the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act. Provides that contracts for supplies, material, or work involving an expenditure in excess of \$20,000 must be let to the lowest bidder, except contracts that involve skill, system integration, and other factors, such as contracts for or requiring: personal confidence; professional skill, fitness, or ability; utilities; services or supplies that require integration with existing systems, such as a computer system or a security system; magazines, books, and periodicals of an educational nature; telecommunication systems; supplies available from only one source; maintenance, repair, and replacement parts by authorized service agents; or an emergency that affects public health, safety, and welfare.

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1 AN ACT concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Downstate Forest Preserve District Act is amended by changing Section 8 as follows:
- 6 (70 ILCS 805/8) (from Ch. 96 1/2, par. 6315)
- Sec. 8. Powers and duties of corporate authority and officers; contracts; salaries.
- (a) The board shall be the corporate authority of such 9 forest preserve district and shall have power to pass and 10 enforce all necessary ordinances, rules and regulations for the 11 12 management of the property and conduct of the business of such district. The president of such board shall have power to 13 14 appoint such employees as may be necessary. In counties with 15 population of less than 3,000,000, within 60 days after their selection the commissioners appointed under the provisions of 16 17 Section 3a of this Act shall organize by selecting from their members a president, secretary, treasurer and such other 18 19 officers as are deemed necessary who shall hold office for the 20 fiscal year in which elected and until their successors are selected and qualify. In the one district in existence on July 21 22 1, 1977, that managed by an appointed board of is commissioners, the incumbent president and the other officers 23 appointed in the manner as originally prescribed in this Act 24 25 shall hold such offices until the completion of their 26 respective terms or in the case of the officers other than their successors 27 president until are appointed 28 president, but in all cases not to extend beyond January 1, 1980 and until their successors are selected and qualify. 29 30 Thereafter, the officers shall be selected in the manner as prescribed in this Section except that their first term of 31 32 office shall not expire until June 30, 1981 and until their

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successors are selected and qualify.

(b) In any county, city, village, incorporated town or sanitary district where the corporate authorities act as the governing body of a forest preserve district, the person exercising the powers of the president of the board shall have power to appoint a secretary and an assistant secretary and treasurer and an assistant treasurer and such other officers and such employees as may be necessary. The assistant secretary and assistant treasurer shall perform the duties of the secretary and treasurer, respectively in case of death of such officers or when such officers are unable to perform the duties of their respective offices. All contracts for supplies, material or work involving an expenditure in excess of \$20,000 shall be let to the lowest responsible bidder, after advertising at least once in one or more newspapers of general circulation within the district, excepting (1) work requiring personal confidence; (2) work of individuals possessing a high degree of professional skill when the ability or fitness of the individual plays an important part; (3) contracts for utility service, such as gas or electric; (4) contracts for services or supplies that require integration with existing systems or existing computer hardware or software, such as security systems and integrated computer systems and related services; (5) contracts for the purchase of magazines, books, periodicals, and similar articles of an educational or instructional nature; (6) contracts that, by their nature, are not adapted to award by competitive bidding, such as telecommunications systems; (7) contracts for services or supplies that are available only from a single source; (8) contracts for maintenance or service of equipment that is available only through an authorized service agent; (9) contracts for the supply of repair parts for equipment, when the parts are available only through the manufacturer or an authorized service agent; and (10) contracts required to meet an immediate emergency that affects the public health, safety, or welfare, in which case the board of commissioners shall set

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- 1 forth the nature of the danger to the public health, safety, or welfare or necessary supplies under the control of monopolies, 2 3 where competitive bidding is impossible. Contracts for 4 supplies, material or work involving an expenditure of \$20,000 or less may be let without advertising for bids, but whenever 5 practicable, at least 3 competitive bids shall be obtained 6 7 before letting such contract. All contracts for supplies, 8 material or work shall be signed by the president of the board 9 of commissioners or by any such other officer as the board in 10 its discretion may designate.
 - (c) The president of any board of commissioners appointed under the provisions of Section 3a of this Act shall receive a salary not to exceed the sum of \$2500 per annum and the salary of other members of the board so appointed shall not exceed \$1500 per annum. Salaries of the commissioners, officers and employees shall be fixed by ordinance.
