SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the State Finance Act, the Illinois Income Tax Act, Illinois Vehicle Code, and the Illinois Identification Card Act. Provides that an applicant for a driver's license or instruction permit, a commercial driver's license or instruction permit, or a State identification card shall be asked if he or she wants to donate \$1 to the Juvenile Diabetes Research and Nutritional Health Trust Fund, in addition to any other applicable fees. Creates the Juvenile Diabetes Research and Nutritional Health Trust Fund as a special fund in the State treasury. Provides that all moneys in the Juvenile Diabetes Research and Nutritional Health Trust Fund shall be used by the Department of Public Health for juvenile diabetes research, nutritional health programs, education, and public awareness and to reimburse the Secretary of State for administrative costs relating to the \$1 donations. Creates the Juvenile Diabetes Research and Nutritional Health Fund checkoff. Provides that the Department of Revenue shall print on its standard individual income tax form a provision indicating that if the taxpayer wishes to contribute to the Juvenile Diabetes Research and Nutritional Health Fund he or she may do so by stating the amount of the contribution on the return and that the contribution will reduce the taxpayer's refund or increase the amount of payment to accompany the return.

13 (a) Any natural person who is a resident of the State of Illinois, may file an application for an identification card or 14 for the renewal thereof, in a manner prescribed by the 15 Secretary. Each original application shall be completed by the 16 17 applicant in full and shall set forth the legal name, residence address and zip code, social security number, birth date, sex 18 19 and a brief description of the applicant. The applicant shall 20 be photographed and he shall also submit any other information 21 as the Secretary may deem necessary or such documentation as the Secretary may require to determine the identity of the 22 23 applicant. An applicant for a disabled persons card must also 24 submit with each original or renewal application, on forms 25 prescribed by the Secretary, such documentation as the 26 Secretary may require, establishing that the applicant is a "disabled person" as defined in Section 4A of this Act, and 27 28 setting forth the applicant's type and class of disability as set forth in Section 4A of this Act. 29

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(b) In addition to the fees collected under Section 12 of

| 13 | Sec. 507EE. The Juvenile Diabetes Research and Nutritional |
| 14 | Health Trust Fund checkoff. Beginning with taxable years ending |
| 15 | on or after December 31, 2006, the Department shall print on |

| 17 | that if the taxpayer wishes to contribute to the Juvenile |

| 30 | (a) Every application for any permit or license authorized |

31 to be issued under this Act shall be made upon a form furnished 32 by the Secretary of State. Every application shall be HB1532

accompanied by the proper fee and payment of such fee shall entitle the applicant to not more than 3 attempts to pass the seamination within a period of 1 year after the date of application.

5 (b) Every application shall state the legal name, social 6 security number, zip code, date of birth, sex, and residence address of the applicant; briefly describe the applicant; state 7 whether the applicant has theretofore been licensed as a 8 9 driver, and, if so, when and by what state or country, and 10 whether any such license has ever been cancelled, suspended, revoked or refused, and, if so, the date and reason for such 11 12 cancellation, suspension, revocation or refusal; shall include an affirmation by the applicant that all information set forth 13 is true and correct; and shall bear the applicant's signature. 14 15 The application form may also require the statement of such 16 additional relevant information as the Secretary of State shall 17 deem necessary to determine the applicant's competency and eligibility. The Secretary of State may in his discretion 18 19 substitute a federal tax number in lieu of a social security 20 number, or he may instead assign an additional distinctive number in lieu thereof, where an applicant is prohibited by 21 bona fide religious convictions from applying or is exempt from 22 23 applying for a social security number. The Secretary of State shall, however, determine which religious orders or sects have 24 25 such bona fide religious convictions. The Secretary of State 26 may, in his discretion, by rule or regulation, provide that an 27 application for a drivers license or permit may include a 28 suitable photograph of the applicant in the form prescribed by the Secretary, and he may further provide that each drivers 29 30 license shall include a photograph of the driver. The Secretary 31 of State may utilize a photograph process or system most 32 suitable to deter alteration or improper reproduction of a drivers license and to prevent substitution of another photo 33 34 thereon.

35 (c) The application form shall include a notice to the 36 applicant of the registration obligations of sex offenders 1 under the Sex Offender Registration Act. The notice shall be 2 provided in a form and manner prescribed by the Secretary of 3 State. For purposes of this subsection (c), "sex offender" has 4 the meaning ascribed to it in Section 2 of the Sex Offender 5 Registration Act.

(d) Any male United States citizen or immigrant who applies 6 7 for any permit or license authorized to be issued under this 8 Act or for a renewal of any permit or license, and who is at 9 least 18 years of age but less than 26 years of age, must be registered in compliance with the requirements of the federal 10 11 Military Selective Service Act. The Secretary of State must 12 forward in an electronic format the necessary personal 13 information regarding the applicants identified in this subsection (d) to the Selective Service System. The applicant's 14 15 signature on the application serves as an indication that the 16 applicant either has already registered with the Selective 17 Service System or that he is authorizing the Secretary to to the Selective Service System the necessary 18 forward information for registration. The Secretary must notify the 19 20 applicant at the time of application that his signature constitutes consent to registration with the Selective Service 21 22 System, if he is not already registered.

23 (e) In addition to the fees collected under Section 6-118 of this Act, the Secretary of State shall ask each person 24 applying for or renewing a license or instruction permit 25 26 whether the person wishes to make a \$1 voluntary contribution 27 to the Juvenile Diabetes Research and Nutritional Health Trust Fund established under this Section. All donations collected 28 under this subsection (e) shall be deposited into the Juvenile 29 30 Diabetes Research and Nutritional Health Trust Fund.

31 (f) The Juvenile Diabetes Research and Nutritional Health 32 Trust Fund is created as a special fund in the State treasury. 33 All moneys in the Juvenile Diabetes Research and Nutritional 34 Health Trust Fund shall, subject to appropriation by the 35 General Assembly and approval by the Secretary of State, be 36 used by the Department of Public Health for the following
