SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

110 ILCS 520/8

from Ch. 144, par. 658

Amends the Southern Illinois University Management Act. Makes a technical change in a Section concerning the Board of Trustees' powers and duties.

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AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Southern Illinois University Management Act
is amended by changing Section 8 as follows:

(110 ILCS 520/8) (from Ch. 144, par. 658)

Sec. 8. Powers and Duties of the Board. <u>The</u> Board shall
have power and it shall be its duty:

9 1. To make rules, regulations and by-laws, not
10 inconsistent with law, for the government and management of
11 Southern Illinois University and its branches;

employ, and, for good cause, to remove a 12 2. То 13 president of Southern Illinois University, and all 14 necessary deans, professors, associate professors, assistant professors, instructors, and other educational 15 16 and administrative assistants, and all other necessary 17 employees, and contract with them upon matters relating to tenure, salaries and retirement benefits in accordance 18 19 with the State Universities Civil Service Act; the Board shall, upon the written request of an employee of Southern 20 Illinois University, withhold from the compensation of 21 that employee any dues, payments or contributions payable 22 23 by such employee to any labor organization as defined in the Illinois Educational Labor Relations Act. Under such 24 25 arrangement, an amount shall be withheld from each regular 26 payroll period which is equal to the pro rata share of the 27 annual dues plus any payments or contributions, and the Board shall transmit such withholdings to the specified 28 29 labor organization within 10 working days from the time of 30 the withholding. Whenever the Board establishes a search committee to fill the position of president of Southern 31 University, there 32 Illinois shall be minority

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representation, including women, on that search committee;

3. To prescribe the course of study to be followed, and textbooks and apparatus to be used at Southern Illinois University;

To issue upon the recommendation of the faculty, 6 diplomas to such persons as have satisfactorily completed 7 the required studies of Southern Illinois University, and 8 confer such professional and literary degrees as are 9 usually conferred by other institutions of like character 10 for similar or equivalent courses of study, or such as the 11 Board may deem appropriate;

12 5. To examine into the conditions, management, and administration of Southern Illinois University, to provide 13 requisite buildings, apparatus, equipment 14 the and auxiliary enterprises, and to fix 15 and collect 16 matriculation fees; tuition fees; fees for student 17 activities; fees for student facilities such as student union buildings or field houses or stadium or other 18 recreational facilities; student welfare fees; laboratory 19 fees and similar fees for supplies and material; 20

6. To succeed to and to administer all trusts, trust
property, and gifts now or hereafter belonging or
pertaining to Southern Illinois University;

7. To accept endowments of professorships or
departments in the University from any person who may
proffer them and, at regular meetings, to prescribe rules
and regulations in relation to endowments and declare on
what general principles they may be accepted;

8. To enter into contracts with the Federal government for providing courses of instruction and other services at Southern Illinois University for persons serving in or with the military or naval forces of the United States, and to provide such courses of instruction and other services;

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9. To provide for the receipt and expenditures of
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1 for persons serving in or with the military or naval forces 2 of the United States and to provide for audits of such 3 funds;

10. To appoint, subject to the applicable civil service 4 5 law, persons to be members of the Southern Illinois 6 University Police Department. Members of the Police Department shall be conservators of the peace and as such 7 have all powers possessed by policemen in cities, and 8 9 sheriffs, including the power to make arrests on view or warrants of violations of state statutes, university rules 10 11 and regulations and city or county ordinances, except that 12 they may exercise such powers only within counties wherein 13 the university and any of its branches or properties are located when such is required for the protection of 14 university properties and interests, and its students and 15 16 personnel, and otherwise, within such counties, when 17 requested by appropriate State or local law enforcement officials. However, such officers shall have no power to 18 serve and execute civil processes. 19

20 The Board must authorize to each member of the Southern Illinois University Police Department and to any other 21 employee of Southern Illinois University exercising the 22 23 powers of a peace officer a distinct badge that, on its face, (i) clearly states that the badge is authorized by 24 Southern Illinois University and (ii) contains a unique 25 identifying number. No other badge shall be authorized by 26 27 Southern Illinois University.

28 11. To administer a plan or plans established by the 29 clinical faculty of the School of Medicine for the billing, 30 collection and disbursement of charges made by individual 31 faculty members for professional services performed by 32 them in the course of or in support of their academic responsibilities, provided that such plan has been first 33 approved by Board action. All such collections shall be 34 deposited into a special fund or funds administered by the 35 36 Board from which disbursements may be made according to the

1 provisions of said plan. The reasonable costs incurred, by 2 the University, administering the billing, collection and 3 disbursement provisions of a plan shall have first priority for payment before distribution or disbursement for any 4 5 other purpose. Charges established pursuant to this plan 6 must be itemized in any billing and any amounts collected which are not used to off-set the cost of operating or 7 maintaining the activity which generated the 8 funds collected, 9 must be accounted for separately. This 10 accounting must clearly show the use and application made 11 of the funds and the Board shall report such accountings for the previous fiscal year to the Legislative Audit 12 Commission annually by December 31 of each fiscal year. 13

14 The Board of Trustees may own, operate, or govern, by 15 or through the School of Medicine, a managed care community 16 network established under subsection (b) of Section 5-11 of 17 the Illinois Public Aid Code.

18 12. The Board of Trustees may, directly or in cooperation with other institutions of higher education, 19 20 acquire by purchase or lease or otherwise, and construct, 21 enlarge, improve, equip, complete, operate, control and manage medical research and high 22 technology parks, 23 together with the necessary lands, buildings, facilities, 24 equipment, and personal property therefor, to encourage 25 and facilitate (a) the location and development of business 26 and industry in the State of Illinois, and (b) the 27 increased application and development of technology and 28 (c) the improvement and development of the State's economy. The Board of Trustees may lease to nonprofit corporations 29 30 all or any part of the land, buildings, facilities, 31 equipment or other property included in a medical research 32 and high technology park upon such terms and conditions as the Board of Trustees may deem advisable and enter into any 33 contract or agreement with such nonprofit corporations as 34 35 be necessary or suitable for the construction, may financing, operation and maintenance and management of any 36

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1 such park; and may lease to any person, firm, partnership 2 or corporation, either public or private, any part or all of the land, building, facilities, equipment or other 3 property of such park for such purposes and upon such 4 5 rentals, terms and conditions as the Board of Trustees may deem advisable; and may finance all or part of the cost of 6 7 including the purchase, any such park, lease, construction, reconstruction, improvement, remodeling, 8 9 addition to, and extension and maintenance of all or part 10 of such high technology park, and all equipment and 11 furnishings, by legislative appropriations, government 12 grants, contracts, private gifts, loans, receipts from the operation of such high technology park, rentals and similar 13 receipts; and may make its other facilities and services 14 available to tenants or other occupants of any such park at 15 16 rates which are reasonable and appropriate.

17 The powers of the Board as herein designated are subject to18 the Board of Higher Education Act.
