#### HB4948

#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/11-212

Amends the Illinois Municipal Code with respect to traffic stop statistical studies. Provides that if a local law enforcement agency neglects or fails to transmit its statistical data in a timely manner or neglects or fails to accurately compile and submit data, then the Department of Transportation shall impose an administrative fine against the local law enforcement agency in an amount to be determined by the Department, by rule, with the amount of the fine based on the population of the jurisdiction of the local law enforcement agency. The amounts collected as fines shall be deposited into the Traffic and Criminal Conviction Surcharge Fund to be used by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board to provide racial and ethnic sensitivity training to law enforcement personnel. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
Section 11-212 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/11-212)

Sec. 11-212. Traffic stop statistical study.

8 (a) From January 1, 2004 until December 31, 2007, whenever 9 a State or local law enforcement officer issues a uniform 10 traffic citation or warning citation for an alleged violation 11 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, he or she shall record at least 12 the following:

(1) the name, address, gender, and the officer's
subjective determination of the race of the person stopped;
the person's race shall be selected from the following
list: Caucasian, African-American, Hispanic, Native
American/Alaska Native, or Asian/Pacific Islander;

18 (2) the alleged traffic violation that led to the stop19 of the motorist;

(3) the make and year of the vehicle stopped;

(4) the date and time of the stop;

(5) the location of the traffic stop;

(6) whether or not a search contemporaneous to the stop was conducted of the vehicle, driver, passenger, or passengers; and, if so, whether it was with consent or by other means; and

(7) the name and badge number of the issuing officer.

(b) From January 1, 2004 until December 31, 2007, whenever
a State or local law enforcement officer stops a motorist for
an alleged violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code and does not
issue a uniform traffic citation or warning citation for an
alleged violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code, he or she shall

1 complete a uniform stop card, which includes field contact 2 cards, or any other existing form currently used by law 3 enforcement containing information required pursuant to this 4 Act, that records at least the following:

5 (1) the name, address, gender, and the officer's
6 subjective determination of the race of the person stopped;
7 the person's race shall be selected from the following
8 list: Caucasian, African-American, Hispanic, Native
9 American/Alaska Native, or Asian/Pacific Islander;

(3) the make and year of the vehicle stopped;

(4) the date and time of the stop;

(5) the location of the traffic stop;

14 (6) whether or not a search contemporaneous to the stop 15 was conducted of the vehicle, driver, passenger, or 16 passengers; and, if so, whether it was with consent or by 17 other means; and

(7) the name and badge number of the issuing officer.

(2) the reason that led to the stop of the motorist;

19 (c) The Illinois Department of Transportation shall 20 provide a standardized law enforcement data compilation form on 21 its website.

(d) Every law enforcement agency shall, by March 1 in each 22 23 of the years 2004, 2005, 2006, and 2007, compile the data described in subsections (a) and (b) on the standardized law 24 enforcement data compilation form provided by the Illinois 25 26 Department of Transportation and transmit the data to the 27 Department. If a local law enforcement agency neglects or fails to transmit its data in a timely manner or neglects or fails to 28 accurately compile and submit data, then the Department of 29 30 Transportation shall impose an administrative fine against the 31 local law enforcement agency in an amount to be determined by the Department, by rule, with the amount of the fine based on 32 the population of the jurisdiction of the local law enforcement 33 agency. The amounts collected as fines shall be deposited into 34 35 the Traffic and Criminal Conviction Surcharge Fund to be used by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board to 36

## 1 provide racial and ethnic sensitivity training to law 2 enforcement personnel.

3 The Illinois Department of Transportation shall (e) analyze the data provided by law enforcement agencies required 4 5 by this Section and submit a report of the findings to the Governor, the General Assembly, and each law enforcement agency 6 no later than July 1 in each of the years 2005, 2006, 2007, and 7 2008. The Illinois Department of Transportation may contract 8 9 with an outside entity for the analysis of the data provided. In analyzing the data collected under this Section, the 10 11 analyzing entity shall scrutinize the data for evidence of 12 statistically significant aberrations. The following list, which is illustrative, and not exclusive, contains examples of 13 areas in which statistically significant aberrations may be 14 found: 15

(1) The percentage of minority drivers or passengers
being stopped in a given area is substantially higher than
the proportion of the overall population in or traveling
through the area that the minority constitutes.

(2) A substantial number of false stops including stops
 not resulting in the issuance of a traffic ticket or the
 making of an arrest.

(3) A disparity between the proportion of citations
issued to minorities and proportion of minorities in the
population.

(4) A disparity among the officers of the same law
 enforcement agency with regard to the number of minority
 drivers or passengers being stopped in a given area.

(5) A disparity between the frequency of searches
 performed on minority drivers and the frequency of searches
 performed on non-minority drivers.

32 (f) Any law enforcement officer identification information 33 or driver identification information that is compiled by any 34 law enforcement agency or the Illinois Department of 35 Transportation pursuant to this Act for the purposes of 36 fulfilling the requirements of this Section shall be - 4 - LRB094 18292 HLH 53603 b

1 confidential and exempt from public inspection and copying, as 2 provided under Section 7 of the Freedom of Information Act, and 3 the information shall not be transmitted to anyone except as 4 needed to comply with this Section. This Section shall not 5 exempt those materials that, prior to the effective date of 6 this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly, were 7 available under the Freedom of Information Act.

8 (g) Funding to implement this Section shall come from 9 federal highway safety funds available to Illinois, as directed 10 by the Governor.

11 (h) The Illinois Department of Transportation, in 12 consultation with law enforcement agencies, officials, and 13 organizations, including Illinois chiefs of police, the Department of State Police, the Illinois Sheriffs Association, 14 15 and the Chicago Police Department, and community groups and 16 other experts, shall undertake a study to determine the best 17 use of technology to collect, compile, and analyze the traffic stop statistical study data required by this Section. The 18 19 Department shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly by March 1, 2004. 20
