## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, William "Bill" C. Harris of Pontiac, a longtime state lawmaker, former President of the Illinois Senate, and former Illinois Commissioner of Banks and Trust Companies, died on December 30, 2004; and

WHEREAS, He was born May 7, 1921 in Pontiac, the son of Raleigh J. and Bernadine (Cullen) Harris; he graduated from Pontiac Grade School and Pontiac Township High School; he entered Michigan State University in the fall of 1941, and in December 1941, he enlisted in the U.S. Navy; while at Great Lakes, he was named honor man out of a class of 750 in the naval program; during World War II, he served as aviation chief ordinance man in the South Pacific; he was honorably discharged in December of 1945 after serving four years; after returning to Pontiac, he joined the R.J. Harris Funeral Home as a partner; on May 31, 1947, he married Jeanne Turck in Pontiac at the original Grace Episcopal Church on the square; and

WHEREAS, In May 1948, he became the charter president of Pontiac Jaycees; he was also a charter member of the Saint James Hospital advisory board, a member of the Moose, Pontiac Elks Lodge, Lions Club, Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion, and the Voiture 8 et 8 in Pontiac; and

WHEREAS, William Harris was a public official who was committed to serving the people of Illinois; first elected to the Illinois House of Representatives in 1954 at the age of 33, he was the House Whip during his six years of service in that body; in 1960, he was elected to the Senate, and during his 16 years of service, he held the position of assistant majority leader and was elected the first president of the Senate, a position created under the 1970 Illinois Constitution; Senator Harris was elected "Most Effective Senator" three successive years; in 1977, he was appointed by then Gov. Jim Thompson as

- 1 Illinois Commissioner of Banks and Trust Companies; he held
- that position until he retired in January 1991; and
- WHEREAS, William Harris was a delegate to the Republican National Convention in Miami in 1968; he served as trustee of the Humiston Haven Nursing Home, trustee of the Appolos Camp, Bennet Humiston Trust since 1975, and trustee on the Floyd and Alta Byrne Trust; he served as a senior vice president of Cole Taylor Bank, as a board member of the Community Bank of Pittsfield, and as ambassador at-large to the Community Bankers of Illinois; he was chairman of the World Trade Association of Illinois for two years, a board member of the Cradle in Evanston for many years, and then was an Emeritus Member of the Cradle Board; he was a member of Grace Episcopal Church in Pontiac; and
  - WHEREAS, A staunch Republican, he was well-respected regardless of one's political persuasion and was a man who saw his strength as getting people to see others' viewpoints and in being able to make accommodations to solve problems in this unique and diverse State; he will be remembered as a legislator who was truly committed to making Illinois a better place to live for all its citizens, and he was known to "reach across the political aisle" and was a great people person who positively impacted the lives of many people whose lives he touched; and
  - WHEREAS, On the statewide scene, the City of Pontiac was synonymous with Bill Harris; he was a part of the history and depth of Pontiac and of Illinois history, serving when the State government was undergoing major reforms from biennial budgets to annual budgets, from six-month legislative sessions every two years to annual sessions; he worked at making the legislative branch an equal branch of government, engaging in the efforts to implement many provisions of the 1970 Illinois Constitution; and

- WHEREAS, Many remember Bill Harris as always having a smile 1
- 2 and an upbeat, can-do attitude; and
- WHEREAS, He was preceded in death by his mother, Bernadine 3
- 4 Harris, his father, Raleigh J. Harris, his sister, Helen
- Elizabeth Harris, and his brother, Raleigh J. Harris Jr.; and 5
- WHEREAS, The passing of William C. Harris will be felt by 6
- 7 all who knew and loved him, especially his wife Jeanne; his two
- 8 children, Barbara A. Harris and Charles M. (Robin) Harris; and
- his two grandchildren, Lindsey J. Schrof and Jenna Harris; 9
