SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Appropriates \$1,900,000 to the Illinois Department of Human Services, Division of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse, to fund the expansion of drug school programs throughout the state of Illinois modeled after the current Cook County drug school program. Effective July 1, 2007.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The sum of \$1,900,000, or so much of that
5 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Illinois
6 Department of Human Services, Division of Alcoholism and
7 Substance Abuse to fund the expansion of drug school programs
8 throughout the State of Illinois by allocating the following:

9 (1) \$700,000 to allow the expansion of the Cook
10 County drug school program by providing for greater drug
11 school staffing, drug school operational costs including
12 but not limited to drug school teachers and expansion of
13 drug school classroom size and treatment assessment
14 programs.

15 (2) \$350,000 to be divided among 7 counties in the
16 State of Illinois to facilitate the building of
17 infrastructure and costs for implementation of drug
18 schools in each of the respective counties selected by the
19 Illinois Department of Human Services, Division of
20 Alcoholism and Substance Abuse.

21 (3) \$350,000 to allow community organizations to work
22 in conjunction with the State's Attorneys office for
23 implementation of education workshops focused on the

1 benefits of drug schools and the harms of drug addition
2 and incarceration in communities most impacted by drug
3 offense convictions.

4 (4) \$500,000 to establish a drug school program for
5 juveniles in Cook County.

6 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
7 2007.
