AN ACT concerning criminal law.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by changing
Section 1-2 as follows:

6 (720 ILCS 5/1-2) (from Ch. 38, par. 1-2)

Sec. 1-2. General purposes. <u>The</u> provisions of this Code shall be construed in accordance with the general purposes hereof, to:

10 (a) Forbid and prevent the commission of offenses;

(b) Define adequately the act and mental state which constitute each offense, and limit the condemnation of conduct as criminal when it is without fault;

14 (c) Prescribe penalties which are proportionate to the 15 seriousness of offenses and which permit recognition of 16 differences in rehabilitation possibilities among individual 17 offenders;

18 (d) Prevent arbitrary or oppressive treatment of persons19 accused or convicted of offenses.
