SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 805/805-305 515 ILCS 5/20-47 520 ILCS 5/3.1-4

Amends the Department of Natural Resources (Conservation) Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois, the Fish and Aquatic Life Code, and the Wildlife Code to allow members of the United States Armed Forces, the Illinois National Guard, and the Reserves of the United States Armed Forces returning from service abroad to camp and hunt without paying fees if the qualifying person applies for a pass at the Department office in Springfield "after" (rather than "within 2 years of") returning from service abroad. Effective immediately.

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AN ACT concerning wildlife.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Department of Natural Resources
(Conservation) Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois
is amended by changing Section 805-305 as follows:

7 (20 ILCS 805/805-305) (was 20 ILCS 805/63a23)

8 Sec. 805-305. Campsites and housing facilities. The 9 Department has the power to provide facilities for overnight tent and trailer camp sites and to provide suitable housing 10 facilities for student and juvenile overnight camping groups. 11 12 Department of Natural Resources may regulate, The by 13 administrative order, the fees to be charged for tent and 14 trailer camping units at individual park areas based upon the facilities available. However, for campsites with access to 15 showers or electricity, any Illinois resident who is age 62 or 16 17 older or has a Class 2 disability as defined in Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act shall be charged only 18 19 one-half of the camping fee charged to the general public 20 during the period Monday through Thursday of any week and shall 21 be charged the same camping fee as the general public on all 22 other days. For campsites without access to showers or electricity, no camping fee authorized by this Section shall be 23

any resident of Illinois who has a Class 2 1 charged to 2 defined in Section 4A of the disability as Illinois 3 Identification Card Act. For campsites without access to showers or electricity, no camping fee authorized by this 4 5 Section shall be charged to any resident of Illinois who is age 62 or older for the use of a camp site unit during the period 6 7 Monday through Thursday of any week. No camping fee authorized 8 by this Section shall be charged to any resident of Illinois 9 who is a disabled veteran or a former prisoner of war, as 10 defined in Section 5 of the Department of Veterans Affairs Act. 11 No camping fee authorized by this Section shall be charged to 12 any resident of Illinois after returning from service abroad or 13 mobilization by the President of the United States as an active 14 duty member of the United States Armed Forces, the Illinois 15 National Guard, or the Reserves of the United States Armed 16 Forces for the amount of time that the active duty member spent 17 in service abroad or mobilized if the person applies for a pass at the Department office in Springfield after within 2 years of 18 returning and provides verification of service or mobilization 19 20 to the Department; any portion of a year that the active duty member spent in service abroad or mobilized shall count as a 21 22 full year. Nonresidents shall be charged the same fees as are 23 authorized for the general public regardless of age. The Department shall provide by regulation for suitable proof of 24 25 age, or either a valid driver's license or a "Golden Age 26 Passport" issued by the federal government shall be acceptable

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1 as proof of age. The Department shall further provide by 2 regulation that notice of these reduced admission fees be 3 posted in a conspicuous place and manner.

4 Reduced fees authorized in this Section shall not apply to
5 any charge for utility service.

7 Section 10. The Fish and Aquatic Life Code is amended by8 changing Section 20-47 as follows:

9 (515 ILCS 5/20-47)

Sec. 20-47. Military members returning from mobilization and service outside the United States.

(a) After returning from service abroad or mobilization by 12 13 the President of the United States as an active duty member of 14 the United States Armed Forces, the Illinois National Guard, or 15 the Reserves of the United States Armed Forces, an Illinois resident may fish as permitted by this Code without paying any 16 17 fees required to obtain a fishing license for the time period prescribed by subsection (b) of this Section if the Illinois 18 resident applies for a license after within 2 years of 19 20 returning from service abroad or mobilization. The applicant 21 shall provide verification of service or mobilization to the Department at the Department's office in Springfield. 22

(b) For each year that an applicant is an active dutymember pursuant to subsection (a) of this Section, the

applicant shall receive one free fishing license. For the purposes of this determination, if the period of active duty is a portion of a year (for example, one year and 3 months), the applicant will be credited with a full year for the portion of a year served.

6 (c) The Department shall establish what constitutes 7 suitable verification of service or mobilization under 8 subsection (a) of this Section.

Section 15. The Wildlife Code is amended by changing
Section 3.1-4 as follows:

12 (520 ILCS 5/3.1-4)

Sec. 3.1-4. Military members returning from mobilization and service outside the United States.

15 (a) After returning from service abroad or mobilization by the President of the United States as an active duty member of 16 17 the United States Armed Forces, the Illinois National Guard, or the Reserves of the United States Armed Forces, an Illinois 18 19 resident may hunt any of the species protected by Section 2.2 20 of this Code without paying any fees required to obtain a 21 hunting license for the time period prescribed by subsection (b) of this Section if the Illinois resident applies for a 22 23 license after within 2 years of returning from service abroad 24 or mobilization. The applicant shall provide verification of service or mobilization to the Department at the Department's
office in Springfield.

3 (b) For each year that an applicant is an active duty member pursuant to subsection (a) of this Section, the 4 5 applicant shall receive one free hunting license, one free Deer 6 Hunting Permit as provided in Section 2.26 of this Code and rules adopted pursuant to that Section, and one free State 7 8 Habitat Stamp. For the purposes of this determination, if the 9 period of active duty is a portion of a year (for example, one 10 year and 3 months), the applicant will be credited with a full 11 year for the portion of a year served.

12 (c) The Department shall establish what constitutes 13 suitable verification of service or mobilization under 14 subsection (a) of this Section.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.

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
