1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 6348

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 6348, by deleting
3 everything after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu
4 thereof the following:

5 "ARTICLE 1

6 Section 10. The following amounts or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, which shall be used by the Illinois State
8 Board of Education exclusively for the foregoing purposes and
9 not, under any circumstances, for personal services
10 expenditures or other operational or administrative costs,
11 are appropriated to the Illinois State Board of Education for
12 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008:

3 Section 70. The amount of \$8,484,800, or so much of that
4 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State
5 Board of Education Special Purpose Trust Fund to the State
6 Board of Education for expenditures by the Board in
7 accordance with grants, gifts or donations that the Board has
8 received or may receive from any source, public or private,
9 in support of projects that are within the lawful powers of
10 the Board.

11 Section 75. The amount of \$7,015,200, or so much of that
12 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State
13 Board of Education Special Purpose Trust Fund to the State
14 Board of Education for its ordinary and contingent expenses.

15 Section 80. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
17 Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for all costs
18 associated with implementation of the State Board of
19 Education Strategic Plan.

20 Section 100. The amount of \$29,982,000, or so much
21 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General

1 Revenue Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for
2 Student Assessments, including Bilingual Assessments.

3 Section 105. The amount of \$23,780,300, or so much
4 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State
5 Board of Education Federal Department of Education Fund to
6 the Illinois State Board of Education for Student
7 Assessments.

8 Section 110. The amount of \$4,000,000, or so much
9 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
10 Revenue Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for all
11 costs associated with Growth Models.

12 Section 120. The amount of \$2,000,000, or so much
13 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
14 Revenue Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for all
15 costs associated with the Response to Intervention
16 Initiative.

17 Section 125. The amount of \$4,000,000, or so much
18 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
19 Revenue Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for all
20 costs with associated Targeted Interventions.

1 Section 130. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much
2 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
3 Revenue Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for all
4 costs associated with the Technology Immersion Pilot Program.

5 Section 135. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
7 Fund for deposit into the Temporary Relocation Assistance
8 Revolving Grant Fund.

9 Section 140. The amount of \$200,000, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
11 Fund to the Illinois State Board of Education for Adler
12 Planetarium.

13 Section 145. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
15 Fund to the State Board of Education for grants to
16 agriculture science teacher education programs in accordance
17 with Public Act 95-153.

18 Section 150. The amount of \$150,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Civic Education
20 Trust Fund to the State Board of Education for grants to
21 public high schools that have completed and submitted a Civic

1 Audit in accordance with Public Act 95-225.

2 Section 155. The amount of \$21,000,000, or so much
3 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for fiscal year
4 2009 from the General Revenue Fund to the State Board of
5 Education to be used by the State Board of Education
6 exclusively for school districts that will receive less
7 funding in the 2008-2009 school year than they received in
8 the 2006-2007 school year as a result of Public Act 93-1022.

9 ARTICLE 998

10 Section 998. Each of the amounts appropriated in this
11 Act (after all actions by the Governor and the General
12 Assembly) controls over any lower amount appropriated in any
13 other Public Act (after all actions by the Governor and the
14 General Assembly) for the same purpose unless that other
15 Public Act expressly states otherwise.

16 ARTICLE 999

17 Section 999. Effective Date. This Act takes effect
18 July 1, 2008."
