ARTICLE 998 1

Section 998. Each of the amounts appropriated in this 2 3 Act (after all actions by the Governor and the General Assembly) controls over any lower amount appropriated in any 4 other Public Act (after all actions by the Governor and the 5 General Assembly) for the same purpose unless that other 6 7 Public Act expressly states otherwise.

ARTICLE 999 8

Section 999. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July 9 1, 2008. 10
