AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 6433, by deleting everything after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

Whenever it becomes necessary for the State any governmental unit to furnish in a disaster area 11 or emergency services directly related to or required by a 12 13 disaster and existing funds are insufficient to provide such services, the Governor may, when he considers such action in 14 15 the best interest of the State, release funds from the General Revenue Disaster Relief appropriation in order to 16 provide such services or to reimburse local governmental 17 18 bodies furnishing such services.
