1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 6433

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 6433, by deleting
3 everything after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu
4 thereof the following:

5 "ARTICLE 1

6 Section 5. The sum of \$4,112,300, new appropriation, is
7 appropriated, and the sum of \$14,430,478, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary and as remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2008, from appropriations heretofore
10 made in Article 250, Section 5 of Public Act 95-348, are
11 reappropriated from the Partners for Conservation Fund to the
12 Department of Natural Resources for the Partners for
13 Conservation Program to implement ecosystem-based management
14 for Illinois' natural resources.

1 Section 85. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 2 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and
 3 purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to meet the
 4 ordinary and contingent expenses of the Department of Natural
 5 Resources:

6 for awards and grants as directed by the Environmental
7 Protection Trust Fund Commission.

13 Section 10. Whenever it becomes necessary for the State
 14 or any governmental unit to furnish in a disaster area
 15 emergency services directly related to or required by a
 16 disaster and existing funds are insufficient to provide such
 17 services, the Governor may, when he considers such action in
 18 the best interest of the State, release funds from the
 19 General Revenue Disaster Relief appropriation in order to
 20 provide such services or to reimburse local governmental
 21 bodies furnishing such services. Such appropriation may be
 22 used for payment of the Illinois National Guard when called

1 to active duty in case of disaster, and for the emergency
 2 purchase or renting of equipment and commodities. Such
 3 appropriation shall be used for emergency services and relief
 4 to the disaster area as a whole and shall not be used to
 5 provide private relief to persons sustaining property damages
 6 or personal injury as a result of a disaster.

14 Public Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Illinois
15 Historic Sites Fund to the Historic Preservation Agency for
16 awards and grants for historic preservation programs made
17 either independently or in cooperation with the Federal
18 Government or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation,
19 or political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
20 private corporation, organization, or individual.

8 Section 999. Effective Date. This Act takes effect
 9 July 1, 2008."
