SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

720 ILCS 5/12-20.6 new

Amends the Criminal Code of 1961. Provides that it is a Class A misdemeanor for any person to display any plastinated human remains in the State of Illinois until: (1) the person submits to the Illinois Attorney General written documentation of the cause of death and origin of the remains; and (2) the person submits to the Illinois Attorney General proof that the decedent consented to the use of his or her remains in such a manner.

- Section 5. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by adding Section 12-20.6 as follows:
- 6 (720 ILCS 5/12-20.6 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 12-20.6. Display of plastinated human remains.</u>
- 8 (a) Definition. For the purposes of this Section,
- 9 <u>"plastinated human remains" means human remains, including</u>
- 10 <u>tissues</u>, organs, and other body parts, that are preserved from
- decay by replacing the water and fats in the human remains with
- 12 <u>a polymer.</u>
- 13 (b) Offense. It is unlawful for any person to display any
 14 plastinated human remains in the State of Illinois until:
- (1) the person submits to the Illinois Attorney General
 written documentation of the cause of death and origin of
- 17 the remains; and
- 18 (2) the person submits to the Illinois Attorney General
- proof that the decedent consented to the use of his or her
- 20 <u>remains in such a manner.</u>
- 21 (c) Sentence. Any person who violates this Section is
- 22 quilty of a Class A misdemeanor.
