Amends the State Employee Indemnification Act. Includes as "employees" for State indemnification purposes Department of Children and Family Services contractors providing child welfare services. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The State Employee Indemnification Act is 5 amended by changing Section 1 as follows:

6 (5 ILCS 350/1) (from Ch. 127, par. 1301)

Sec. 1. Definitions. For the purpose of this Act:

(a) The term "State" means the State of Illinois, the 8 9 General Assembly, the court, or any State office, department, bureau, board, commission, or committee, 10 division. the governing boards of the public institutions of higher education 11 created by the State, the Illinois National Guard, the 12 13 Comprehensive Health Insurance Board, any poison control 14 center designated under the Poison Control System Act that receives State funding, or any other agency or instrumentality 15 16 of the State. It does not mean any local public entity as that 17 term is defined in Section 1-206 of the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act or a pension fund. 18

(b) The term "employee" means any present or former elected or appointed officer, trustee or employee of the State, or of a pension fund, any present or former commissioner or employee of the Executive Ethics Commission or of the Legislative Ethics Commission, any present or former Executive, Legislative, or

1 Auditor General's Inspector General, any present or former 2 employee of an Office of an Executive, Legislative, or Auditor General's Inspector General, any present or former member of 3 the Illinois National Guard while on active duty, individuals 4 5 organizations who contract with the Department or of 6 Corrections, the Comprehensive Health Insurance Board, or the to 7 Department of Veterans' Affairs provide services, 8 individuals or organizations who contract with the Department 9 of Human Services (as successor to the Department of Mental 10 Health and Developmental Disabilities) to provide services 11 including but not limited to treatment and other services for 12 sexually violent persons, individuals or organizations who 13 contract with the Department of Military Affairs for youth 14 programs, individuals or organizations who contract to perform 15 carnival and amusement ride safety inspections for the 16 Department of Labor, individual representatives of or 17 designated organizations authorized to represent the Office of State Long-Term Ombudsman for the Department on 18 Aging, 19 individual representatives of or organizations designated by 20 the Department on Aging in the performance of their duties as elder abuse provider agencies or regional administrative 21 22 agencies under the Elder Abuse and Neglect Act, individuals or 23 organizations who perform volunteer services for the State where such volunteer relationship is reduced to writing, 24 25 individuals who serve on any public entity (whether created by 26 law or administrative action) described in paragraph (a) of

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this Section, individuals or not for profit organizations who, 1 2 either as volunteers, where such volunteer relationship is 3 reduced to writing, or pursuant to contract, furnish professional advice or consultation to 4 any agency or 5 instrumentality of the State, individuals who or organizations that contract with the Department of Children and Family 6 7 Services to provide child welfare services, individuals who 8 serve as foster parents for the Department of Children and 9 Family Services when caring for a Department ward, and 10 individuals who serve as arbitrators pursuant to Part 10A of 11 Article II of the Code of Civil Procedure and the rules of the 12 Supreme Court implementing Part 10A, each as now or hereafter 13 amended, but does not mean an independent contractor except as provided in this Section. The term includes an individual 14 15 appointed as an inspector by the Director of State Police when 16 performing duties within the scope of the activities of a 17 Metropolitan Enforcement Group or а law enforcement established under 18 organization the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act. An individual who renders professional advice 19 and consultation to the State through an organization which 20 qualifies as an "employee" under the Act is also an employee. 21 22 The term includes the estate or personal representative of an 23 employee.

(c) The term "pension fund" means a retirement system or
pension fund created under the Illinois Pension Code.
