SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

35 ILCS 105/9	from Ch. 120, par. 439.9
35 ILCS 110/9	from Ch. 120, par. 439.39
35 ILCS 115/9	from Ch. 120, par. 439.109
35 ILCS 120/3	from Ch. 120, par. 442

Amends the Use Tax Act, the Service Use Tax Act, the Service Occupation Tax Act, and the Retailer's Occupation Tax Act. Provides that 0.4% of the net revenues realized for the preceding month from the State's portion of the general rate of tax imposed under the Acts shall be paid by the Department of Revenue into the Local Government Distributive Fund (reverting to the distribution in place prior to State fiscal year 2003). Effective July 1, 2009.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT in relation to taxes.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of**
3 **Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Use Tax Act is amended by changing Section 9
5 as follows:

6 (35 ILCS 105/9) (from Ch. 120, par. 439.9)

7 Sec. 9. Except as to motor vehicles, watercraft, aircraft,
8 and trailers that are required to be registered with an agency
9 of this State, each retailer required or authorized to collect
10 the tax imposed by this Act shall pay to the Department the
11 amount of such tax (except as otherwise provided) at the time
12 when he is required to file his return for the period during
13 which such tax was collected, less a discount of 2.1% prior to
14 January 1, 1990, and 1.75% on and after January 1, 1990, or \$5
15 per calendar year, whichever is greater, which is allowed to
16 reimburse the retailer for expenses incurred in collecting the
17 tax, keeping records, preparing and filing returns, remitting
18 the tax and supplying data to the Department on request. In the
19 case of retailers who report and pay the tax on a transaction
20 by transaction basis, as provided in this Section, such
21 discount shall be taken with each such tax remittance instead
22 of when such retailer files his periodic return. A retailer
23 need not remit that part of any tax collected by him to the

1 extent that he is required to remit and does remit the tax
2 imposed by the Retailers' Occupation Tax Act, with respect to
3 the sale of the same property.

4 Where such tangible personal property is sold under a
5 conditional sales contract, or under any other form of sale
6 wherein the payment of the principal sum, or a part thereof, is
7 extended beyond the close of the period for which the return is
8 filed, the retailer, in collecting the tax (except as to motor
9 vehicles, watercraft, aircraft, and trailers that are required
10 to be registered with an agency of this State), may collect for
11 each tax return period, only the tax applicable to that part of
12 the selling price actually received during such tax return
13 period.

14 Except as provided in this Section, on or before the
15 twentieth day of each calendar month, such retailer shall file
16 a return for the preceding calendar month. Such return shall be
17 filed on forms prescribed by the Department and shall furnish
18 such information as the Department may reasonably require.

19 The Department may require returns to be filed on a
20 quarterly basis. If so required, a return for each calendar
21 quarter shall be filed on or before the twentieth day of the
22 calendar month following the end of such calendar quarter. The
23 taxpayer shall also file a return with the Department for each
24 of the first two months of each calendar quarter, on or before
25 the twentieth day of the following calendar month, stating:

26 1. The name of the seller;

1 2. The address of the principal place of business from
2 which he engages in the business of selling tangible
3 personal property at retail in this State;

4 3. The total amount of taxable receipts received by him
5 during the preceding calendar month from sales of tangible
6 personal property by him during such preceding calendar
7 month, including receipts from charge and time sales, but
8 less all deductions allowed by law;

9 4. The amount of credit provided in Section 2d of this
10 Act;

11 5. The amount of tax due;

12 5-5. The signature of the taxpayer; and

13 6. Such other reasonable information as the Department
14 may require.

15 If a taxpayer fails to sign a return within 30 days after
16 the proper notice and demand for signature by the Department,
17 the return shall be considered valid and any amount shown to be
18 due on the return shall be deemed assessed.

19 Beginning October 1, 1993, a taxpayer who has an average
20 monthly tax liability of \$150,000 or more shall make all
21 payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
22 funds transfer. Beginning October 1, 1994, a taxpayer who has
23 an average monthly tax liability of \$100,000 or more shall make
24 all payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
25 funds transfer. Beginning October 1, 1995, a taxpayer who has
26 an average monthly tax liability of \$50,000 or more shall make

1 all payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
2 funds transfer. Beginning October 1, 2000, a taxpayer who has
3 an annual tax liability of \$200,000 or more shall make all
4 payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
5 funds transfer. The term "annual tax liability" shall be the
6 sum of the taxpayer's liabilities under this Act, and under all
7 other State and local occupation and use tax laws administered
8 by the Department, for the immediately preceding calendar year.
9 The term "average monthly tax liability" means the sum of the
10 taxpayer's liabilities under this Act, and under all other
11 State and local occupation and use tax laws administered by the
12 Department, for the immediately preceding calendar year
13 divided by 12. Beginning on October 1, 2002, a taxpayer who has
14 a tax liability in the amount set forth in subsection (b) of
15 Section 2505-210 of the Department of Revenue Law shall make
16 all payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
17 funds transfer.

18 Before August 1 of each year beginning in 1993, the
19 Department shall notify all taxpayers required to make payments
20 by electronic funds transfer. All taxpayers required to make
21 payments by electronic funds transfer shall make those payments
22 for a minimum of one year beginning on October 1.

23 Any taxpayer not required to make payments by electronic
24 funds transfer may make payments by electronic funds transfer
25 with the permission of the Department.

26 All taxpayers required to make payment by electronic funds

1 transfer and any taxpayers authorized to voluntarily make
2 payments by electronic funds transfer shall make those payments
3 in the manner authorized by the Department.

4 The Department shall adopt such rules as are necessary to
5 effectuate a program of electronic funds transfer and the
6 requirements of this Section.

7 Before October 1, 2000, if the taxpayer's average monthly
8 tax liability to the Department under this Act, the Retailers'
9 Occupation Tax Act, the Service Occupation Tax Act, the Service
10 Use Tax Act was \$10,000 or more during the preceding 4 complete
11 calendar quarters, he shall file a return with the Department
12 each month by the 20th day of the month next following the
13 month during which such tax liability is incurred and shall
14 make payments to the Department on or before the 7th, 15th,
15 22nd and last day of the month during which such liability is
16 incurred. On and after October 1, 2000, if the taxpayer's
17 average monthly tax liability to the Department under this Act,
18 the Retailers' Occupation Tax Act, the Service Occupation Tax
19 Act, and the Service Use Tax Act was \$20,000 or more during the
20 preceding 4 complete calendar quarters, he shall file a return
21 with the Department each month by the 20th day of the month
22 next following the month during which such tax liability is
23 incurred and shall make payment to the Department on or before
24 the 7th, 15th, 22nd and last day of the month during which such
25 liability is incurred. If the month during which such tax
26 liability is incurred began prior to January 1, 1985, each

1 payment shall be in an amount equal to 1/4 of the taxpayer's
2 actual liability for the month or an amount set by the
3 Department not to exceed 1/4 of the average monthly liability
4 of the taxpayer to the Department for the preceding 4 complete
5 calendar quarters (excluding the month of highest liability and
6 the month of lowest liability in such 4 quarter period). If the
7 month during which such tax liability is incurred begins on or
8 after January 1, 1985, and prior to January 1, 1987, each
9 payment shall be in an amount equal to 22.5% of the taxpayer's
10 actual liability for the month or 27.5% of the taxpayer's
11 liability for the same calendar month of the preceding year. If
12 the month during which such tax liability is incurred begins on
13 or after January 1, 1987, and prior to January 1, 1988, each
14 payment shall be in an amount equal to 22.5% of the taxpayer's
15 actual liability for the month or 26.25% of the taxpayer's
16 liability for the same calendar month of the preceding year. If
17 the month during which such tax liability is incurred begins on
18 or after January 1, 1988, and prior to January 1, 1989, or
19 begins on or after January 1, 1996, each payment shall be in an
20 amount equal to 22.5% of the taxpayer's actual liability for
21 the month or 25% of the taxpayer's liability for the same
22 calendar month of the preceding year. If the month during which
23 such tax liability is incurred begins on or after January 1,
24 1989, and prior to January 1, 1996, each payment shall be in an
25 amount equal to 22.5% of the taxpayer's actual liability for
26 the month or 25% of the taxpayer's liability for the same

1 calendar month of the preceding year or 100% of the taxpayer's
2 actual liability for the quarter monthly reporting period. The
3 amount of such quarter monthly payments shall be credited
4 against the final tax liability of the taxpayer's return for
5 that month. Before October 1, 2000, once applicable, the
6 requirement of the making of quarter monthly payments to the
7 Department shall continue until such taxpayer's average
8 monthly liability to the Department during the preceding 4
9 complete calendar quarters (excluding the month of highest
10 liability and the month of lowest liability) is less than
11 \$9,000, or until such taxpayer's average monthly liability to
12 the Department as computed for each calendar quarter of the 4
13 preceding complete calendar quarter period is less than
14 \$10,000. However, if a taxpayer can show the Department that a
15 substantial change in the taxpayer's business has occurred
16 which causes the taxpayer to anticipate that his average
17 monthly tax liability for the reasonably foreseeable future
18 will fall below the \$10,000 threshold stated above, then such
19 taxpayer may petition the Department for change in such
20 taxpayer's reporting status. On and after October 1, 2000, once
21 applicable, the requirement of the making of quarter monthly
22 payments to the Department shall continue until such taxpayer's
23 average monthly liability to the Department during the
24 preceding 4 complete calendar quarters (excluding the month of
25 highest liability and the month of lowest liability) is less
26 than \$19,000 or until such taxpayer's average monthly liability

1 to the Department as computed for each calendar quarter of the
2 4 preceding complete calendar quarter period is less than
3 \$20,000. However, if a taxpayer can show the Department that a
4 substantial change in the taxpayer's business has occurred
5 which causes the taxpayer to anticipate that his average
6 monthly tax liability for the reasonably foreseeable future
7 will fall below the \$20,000 threshold stated above, then such
8 taxpayer may petition the Department for a change in such
9 taxpayer's reporting status. The Department shall change such
10 taxpayer's reporting status unless it finds that such change is
11 seasonal in nature and not likely to be long term. If any such
12 quarter monthly payment is not paid at the time or in the
13 amount required by this Section, then the taxpayer shall be
14 liable for penalties and interest on the difference between the
15 minimum amount due and the amount of such quarter monthly
16 payment actually and timely paid, except insofar as the
17 taxpayer has previously made payments for that month to the
18 Department in excess of the minimum payments previously due as
19 provided in this Section. The Department shall make reasonable
20 rules and regulations to govern the quarter monthly payment
21 amount and quarter monthly payment dates for taxpayers who file
22 on other than a calendar monthly basis.

23 If any such payment provided for in this Section exceeds
24 the taxpayer's liabilities under this Act, the Retailers'
25 Occupation Tax Act, the Service Occupation Tax Act and the
26 Service Use Tax Act, as shown by an original monthly return,

1 the Department shall issue to the taxpayer a credit memorandum
2 no later than 30 days after the date of payment, which
3 memorandum may be submitted by the taxpayer to the Department
4 in payment of tax liability subsequently to be remitted by the
5 taxpayer to the Department or be assigned by the taxpayer to a
6 similar taxpayer under this Act, the Retailers' Occupation Tax
7 Act, the Service Occupation Tax Act or the Service Use Tax Act,
8 in accordance with reasonable rules and regulations to be
9 prescribed by the Department, except that if such excess
10 payment is shown on an original monthly return and is made
11 after December 31, 1986, no credit memorandum shall be issued,
12 unless requested by the taxpayer. If no such request is made,
13 the taxpayer may credit such excess payment against tax
14 liability subsequently to be remitted by the taxpayer to the
15 Department under this Act, the Retailers' Occupation Tax Act,
16 the Service Occupation Tax Act or the Service Use Tax Act, in
17 accordance with reasonable rules and regulations prescribed by
18 the Department. If the Department subsequently determines that
19 all or any part of the credit taken was not actually due to the
20 taxpayer, the taxpayer's 2.1% or 1.75% vendor's discount shall
21 be reduced by 2.1% or 1.75% of the difference between the
22 credit taken and that actually due, and the taxpayer shall be
23 liable for penalties and interest on such difference.

24 If the retailer is otherwise required to file a monthly
25 return and if the retailer's average monthly tax liability to
26 the Department does not exceed \$200, the Department may

1 authorize his returns to be filed on a quarter annual basis,
2 with the return for January, February, and March of a given
3 year being due by April 20 of such year; with the return for
4 April, May and June of a given year being due by July 20 of such
5 year; with the return for July, August and September of a given
6 year being due by October 20 of such year, and with the return
7 for October, November and December of a given year being due by
8 January 20 of the following year.

9 If the retailer is otherwise required to file a monthly or
10 quarterly return and if the retailer's average monthly tax
11 liability to the Department does not exceed \$50, the Department
12 may authorize his returns to be filed on an annual basis, with
13 the return for a given year being due by January 20 of the
14 following year.

15 Such quarter annual and annual returns, as to form and
16 substance, shall be subject to the same requirements as monthly
17 returns.

18 Notwithstanding any other provision in this Act concerning
19 the time within which a retailer may file his return, in the
20 case of any retailer who ceases to engage in a kind of business
21 which makes him responsible for filing returns under this Act,
22 such retailer shall file a final return under this Act with the
23 Department not more than one month after discontinuing such
24 business.

25 In addition, with respect to motor vehicles, watercraft,
26 aircraft, and trailers that are required to be registered with

1 an agency of this State, every retailer selling this kind of
2 tangible personal property shall file, with the Department,
3 upon a form to be prescribed and supplied by the Department, a
4 separate return for each such item of tangible personal
5 property which the retailer sells, except that if, in the same
6 transaction, (i) a retailer of aircraft, watercraft, motor
7 vehicles or trailers transfers more than one aircraft,
8 watercraft, motor vehicle or trailer to another aircraft,
9 watercraft, motor vehicle or trailer retailer for the purpose
10 of resale or (ii) a retailer of aircraft, watercraft, motor
11 vehicles, or trailers transfers more than one aircraft,
12 watercraft, motor vehicle, or trailer to a purchaser for use as
13 a qualifying rolling stock as provided in Section 3-55 of this
14 Act, then that seller may report the transfer of all the
15 aircraft, watercraft, motor vehicles or trailers involved in
16 that transaction to the Department on the same uniform
17 invoice-transaction reporting return form. For purposes of
18 this Section, "watercraft" means a Class 2, Class 3, or Class 4
19 watercraft as defined in Section 3-2 of the Boat Registration
20 and Safety Act, a personal watercraft, or any boat equipped
21 with an inboard motor.

22 The transaction reporting return in the case of motor
23 vehicles or trailers that are required to be registered with an
24 agency of this State, shall be the same document as the Uniform
25 Invoice referred to in Section 5-402 of the Illinois Vehicle
26 Code and must show the name and address of the seller; the name

1 and address of the purchaser; the amount of the selling price
2 including the amount allowed by the retailer for traded-in
3 property, if any; the amount allowed by the retailer for the
4 traded-in tangible personal property, if any, to the extent to
5 which Section 2 of this Act allows an exemption for the value
6 of traded-in property; the balance payable after deducting such
7 trade-in allowance from the total selling price; the amount of
8 tax due from the retailer with respect to such transaction; the
9 amount of tax collected from the purchaser by the retailer on
10 such transaction (or satisfactory evidence that such tax is not
11 due in that particular instance, if that is claimed to be the
12 fact); the place and date of the sale; a sufficient
13 identification of the property sold; such other information as
14 is required in Section 5-402 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, and
15 such other information as the Department may reasonably
16 require.

17 The transaction reporting return in the case of watercraft
18 and aircraft must show the name and address of the seller; the
19 name and address of the purchaser; the amount of the selling
20 price including the amount allowed by the retailer for
21 traded-in property, if any; the amount allowed by the retailer
22 for the traded-in tangible personal property, if any, to the
23 extent to which Section 2 of this Act allows an exemption for
24 the value of traded-in property; the balance payable after
25 deducting such trade-in allowance from the total selling price;
26 the amount of tax due from the retailer with respect to such

1 transaction; the amount of tax collected from the purchaser by
2 the retailer on such transaction (or satisfactory evidence that
3 such tax is not due in that particular instance, if that is
4 claimed to be the fact); the place and date of the sale, a
5 sufficient identification of the property sold, and such other
6 information as the Department may reasonably require.

7 Such transaction reporting return shall be filed not later
8 than 20 days after the date of delivery of the item that is
9 being sold, but may be filed by the retailer at any time sooner
10 than that if he chooses to do so. The transaction reporting
11 return and tax remittance or proof of exemption from the tax
12 that is imposed by this Act may be transmitted to the
13 Department by way of the State agency with which, or State
14 officer with whom, the tangible personal property must be
15 titled or registered (if titling or registration is required)
16 if the Department and such agency or State officer determine
17 that this procedure will expedite the processing of
18 applications for title or registration.

19 With each such transaction reporting return, the retailer
20 shall remit the proper amount of tax due (or shall submit
21 satisfactory evidence that the sale is not taxable if that is
22 the case), to the Department or its agents, whereupon the
23 Department shall issue, in the purchaser's name, a tax receipt
24 (or a certificate of exemption if the Department is satisfied
25 that the particular sale is tax exempt) which such purchaser
26 may submit to the agency with which, or State officer with

1 whom, he must title or register the tangible personal property
2 that is involved (if titling or registration is required) in
3 support of such purchaser's application for an Illinois
4 certificate or other evidence of title or registration to such
5 tangible personal property.

6 No retailer's failure or refusal to remit tax under this
7 Act precludes a user, who has paid the proper tax to the
8 retailer, from obtaining his certificate of title or other
9 evidence of title or registration (if titling or registration
10 is required) upon satisfying the Department that such user has
11 paid the proper tax (if tax is due) to the retailer. The
12 Department shall adopt appropriate rules to carry out the
13 mandate of this paragraph.

14 If the user who would otherwise pay tax to the retailer
15 wants the transaction reporting return filed and the payment of
16 tax or proof of exemption made to the Department before the
17 retailer is willing to take these actions and such user has not
18 paid the tax to the retailer, such user may certify to the fact
19 of such delay by the retailer, and may (upon the Department
20 being satisfied of the truth of such certification) transmit
21 the information required by the transaction reporting return
22 and the remittance for tax or proof of exemption directly to
23 the Department and obtain his tax receipt or exemption
24 determination, in which event the transaction reporting return
25 and tax remittance (if a tax payment was required) shall be
26 credited by the Department to the proper retailer's account

1 with the Department, but without the 2.1% or 1.75% discount
2 provided for in this Section being allowed. When the user pays
3 the tax directly to the Department, he shall pay the tax in the
4 same amount and in the same form in which it would be remitted
5 if the tax had been remitted to the Department by the retailer.

6 Where a retailer collects the tax with respect to the
7 selling price of tangible personal property which he sells and
8 the purchaser thereafter returns such tangible personal
9 property and the retailer refunds the selling price thereof to
10 the purchaser, such retailer shall also refund, to the
11 purchaser, the tax so collected from the purchaser. When filing
12 his return for the period in which he refunds such tax to the
13 purchaser, the retailer may deduct the amount of the tax so
14 refunded by him to the purchaser from any other use tax which
15 such retailer may be required to pay or remit to the
16 Department, as shown by such return, if the amount of the tax
17 to be deducted was previously remitted to the Department by
18 such retailer. If the retailer has not previously remitted the
19 amount of such tax to the Department, he is entitled to no
20 deduction under this Act upon refunding such tax to the
21 purchaser.

22 Any retailer filing a return under this Section shall also
23 include (for the purpose of paying tax thereon) the total tax
24 covered by such return upon the selling price of tangible
25 personal property purchased by him at retail from a retailer,
26 but as to which the tax imposed by this Act was not collected

1 from the retailer filing such return, and such retailer shall
2 remit the amount of such tax to the Department when filing such
3 return.

4 If experience indicates such action to be practicable, the
5 Department may prescribe and furnish a combination or joint
6 return which will enable retailers, who are required to file
7 returns hereunder and also under the Retailers' Occupation Tax
8 Act, to furnish all the return information required by both
9 Acts on the one form.

10 Where the retailer has more than one business registered
11 with the Department under separate registration under this Act,
12 such retailer may not file each return that is due as a single
13 return covering all such registered businesses, but shall file
14 separate returns for each such registered business.

15 Beginning January 1, 1990, each month the Department shall
16 pay into the State and Local Sales Tax Reform Fund, a special
17 fund in the State Treasury which is hereby created, the net
18 revenue realized for the preceding month from the 1% tax on
19 sales of food for human consumption which is to be consumed off
20 the premises where it is sold (other than alcoholic beverages,
21 soft drinks and food which has been prepared for immediate
22 consumption) and prescription and nonprescription medicines,
23 drugs, medical appliances and insulin, urine testing
24 materials, syringes and needles used by diabetics.

25 Beginning January 1, 1990, each month the Department shall
26 pay into the County and Mass Transit District Fund 4% of the

1 net revenue realized for the preceding month from the 6.25%
2 general rate on the selling price of tangible personal property
3 which is purchased outside Illinois at retail from a retailer
4 and which is titled or registered by an agency of this State's
5 government.

6 Beginning January 1, 1990, each month the Department shall
7 pay into the State and Local Sales Tax Reform Fund, a special
8 fund in the State Treasury, 20% of the net revenue realized for
9 the preceding month from the 6.25% general rate on the selling
10 price of tangible personal property, other than tangible
11 personal property which is purchased outside Illinois at retail
12 from a retailer and which is titled or registered by an agency
13 of this State's government.

14 Beginning August 1, 2000, each month the Department shall
15 pay into the State and Local Sales Tax Reform Fund 100% of the
16 net revenue realized for the preceding month from the 1.25%
17 rate on the selling price of motor fuel and gasohol.

18 Beginning January 1, 1990, each month the Department shall
19 pay into the Local Government Tax Fund 16% of the net revenue
20 realized for the preceding month from the 6.25% general rate on
21 the selling price of tangible personal property which is
22 purchased outside Illinois at retail from a retailer and which
23 is titled or registered by an agency of this State's
24 government.

25 Of the remainder of the moneys received by the Department
26 pursuant to this Act, (a) 1.75% thereof shall be paid into the

1 Build Illinois Fund and (b) prior to July 1, 1989, 2.2% and on
2 and after July 1, 1989, 3.8% thereof shall be paid into the
3 Build Illinois Fund; provided, however, that if in any fiscal
4 year the sum of (1) the aggregate of 2.2% or 3.8%, as the case
5 may be, of the moneys received by the Department and required
6 to be paid into the Build Illinois Fund pursuant to Section 3
7 of the Retailers' Occupation Tax Act, Section 9 of the Use Tax
8 Act, Section 9 of the Service Use Tax Act, and Section 9 of the
9 Service Occupation Tax Act, such Acts being hereinafter called
10 the "Tax Acts" and such aggregate of 2.2% or 3.8%, as the case
11 may be, of moneys being hereinafter called the "Tax Act
12 Amount", and (2) the amount transferred to the Build Illinois
13 Fund from the State and Local Sales Tax Reform Fund shall be
14 less than the Annual Specified Amount (as defined in Section 3
15 of the Retailers' Occupation Tax Act), an amount equal to the
16 difference shall be immediately paid into the Build Illinois
17 Fund from other moneys received by the Department pursuant to
18 the Tax Acts; and further provided, that if on the last
19 business day of any month the sum of (1) the Tax Act Amount
20 required to be deposited into the Build Illinois Bond Account
21 in the Build Illinois Fund during such month and (2) the amount
22 transferred during such month to the Build Illinois Fund from
23 the State and Local Sales Tax Reform Fund shall have been less
24 than 1/12 of the Annual Specified Amount, an amount equal to
25 the difference shall be immediately paid into the Build
26 Illinois Fund from other moneys received by the Department

1 pursuant to the Tax Acts; and, further provided, that in no
2 event shall the payments required under the preceding proviso
3 result in aggregate payments into the Build Illinois Fund
4 pursuant to this clause (b) for any fiscal year in excess of
5 the greater of (i) the Tax Act Amount or (ii) the Annual
6 Specified Amount for such fiscal year; and, further provided,
7 that the amounts payable into the Build Illinois Fund under
8 this clause (b) shall be payable only until such time as the
9 aggregate amount on deposit under each trust indenture securing
10 Bonds issued and outstanding pursuant to the Build Illinois

5 for the period during which such tax was collectible, less a
6 discount of 2.1% prior to January 1, 1990, and 1.75% on and
7 after January 1, 1990, or \$5 per calendar year, whichever is
8 greater, which is allowed to reimburse the serviceman for
9 expenses incurred in collecting the tax, keeping records,
10 preparing and filing returns, remitting the tax and supplying
11 data to the Department on request.

12 Where such tangible personal property is sold under a
13 conditional sales contract, or under any other form of sale
14 wherein the payment of the principal sum, or a part thereof, is
15 extended beyond the close of the period for which the return is
16 filed, the serviceman, in collecting the tax may collect, for
17 each tax return period, only the tax applicable to the part of
18 the selling price actually received during such tax return
19 period.

20 Except as provided hereinafter in this Section, on or
21 before the twentieth day of each calendar month, such
22 serviceman shall file a return for the preceding calendar month
23 in accordance with reasonable rules and regulations to be
24 promulgated by the Department of Revenue. Such return shall be
25 filed on a form prescribed by the Department and shall contain

1 such information as the Department may reasonably require.

2 The Department may require returns to be filed on a
3 quarterly basis. If so required, a return for each calendar
4 quarter shall be filed on or before the twentieth day of the
5 calendar month following the end of such calendar quarter. The
6 taxpayer shall also file a return with the Department for each
7 of the first two months of each calendar quarter, on or before
8 the twentieth day of the following calendar month, stating:

9 1. The name of the seller;

10 2. The address of the principal place of business from
11 which he engages in business as a serviceman in this State;

12 3. The total amount of taxable receipts received by him
13 during the preceding calendar month, including receipts
14 from charge and time sales, but less all deductions allowed
15 by law;

16 4. The amount of credit provided in Section 2d of this
17 Act;

18 5. The amount of tax due;

19 5-5. The signature of the taxpayer; and

20 6. Such other reasonable information as the Department
21 may require.

22 If a taxpayer fails to sign a return within 30 days after
23 the proper notice and demand for signature by the Department,
24 the return shall be considered valid and any amount shown to be
25 due on the return shall be deemed assessed.

26 Prior to October 1, 2003, and on and after September 1,

1 2004 a serviceman may accept a Manufacturer's Purchase Credit
2 certification from a purchaser in satisfaction of Service Use
3 Tax as provided in Section 3-70 of the Service Use Tax Act if
4 the purchaser provides the appropriate documentation as
5 required by Section 3-70 of the Service Use Tax Act. A
6 Manufacturer's Purchase Credit certification, accepted prior
7 to October 1, 2003 or on or after September 1, 2004 by a
8 serviceman as provided in Section 3-70 of the Service Use Tax
9 Act, may be used by that serviceman to satisfy Service
10 Occupation Tax liability in the amount claimed in the
11 certification, not to exceed 6.25% of the receipts subject to
12 tax from a qualifying purchase. A Manufacturer's Purchase
13 Credit reported on any original or amended return filed under
14 this Act after October 20, 2003 for reporting periods prior to
15 September 1, 2004 shall be disallowed. Manufacturer's Purchase
16 Credit reported on annual returns due on or after January 1,
17 2005 will be disallowed for periods prior to September 1, 2004.
18 No Manufacturer's Purchase Credit may be used after September
19 30, 2003 through August 31, 2004 to satisfy any tax liability
20 imposed under this Act, including any audit liability.

21 If the serviceman's average monthly tax liability to the
22 Department does not exceed \$200, the Department may authorize
23 his returns to be filed on a quarter annual basis, with the
24 return for January, February and March of a given year being
25 due by April 20 of such year; with the return for April, May
26 and June of a given year being due by July 20 of such year; with

1 the return for July, August and September of a given year being
2 due by October 20 of such year, and with the return for
3 October, November and December of a given year being due by
4 January 20 of the following year.

5 If the serviceman's average monthly tax liability to the
6 Department does not exceed \$50, the Department may authorize
7 his returns to be filed on an annual basis, with the return for
8 a given year being due by January 20 of the following year.

9 Such quarter annual and annual returns, as to form and
10 substance, shall be subject to the same requirements as monthly
11 returns.

12 Notwithstanding any other provision in this Act concerning
13 the time within which a serviceman may file his return, in the
14 case of any serviceman who ceases to engage in a kind of
15 business which makes him responsible for filing returns under
16 this Act, such serviceman shall file a final return under this
17 Act with the Department not more than 1 month after
18 discontinuing such business.

19 Beginning October 1, 1993, a taxpayer who has an average
20 monthly tax liability of \$150,000 or more shall make all
21 payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
22 funds transfer. Beginning October 1, 1994, a taxpayer who has
23 an average monthly tax liability of \$100,000 or more shall make
24 all payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
25 funds transfer. Beginning October 1, 1995, a taxpayer who has
26 an average monthly tax liability of \$50,000 or more shall make

1 all payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
2 funds transfer. Beginning October 1, 2000, a taxpayer who has
3 an annual tax liability of \$200,000 or more shall make all
4 payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
5 funds transfer. The term "annual tax liability" shall be the
6 sum of the taxpayer's liabilities under this Act, and under all
7 other State and local occupation and use tax laws administered
8 by the Department, for the immediately preceding calendar year.
9 The term "average monthly tax liability" means the sum of the
10 taxpayer's liabilities under this Act, and under all other
11 State and local occupation and use tax laws administered by the
12 Department, for the immediately preceding calendar year
13 divided by 12. Beginning on October 1, 2002, a taxpayer who has
14 a tax liability in the amount set forth in subsection (b) of
15 Section 2505-210 of the Department of Revenue Law shall make
16 all payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
17 funds transfer.

18 Before August 1 of each year beginning in 1993, the
19 Department shall notify all taxpayers required to make payments
20 by electronic funds transfer. All taxpayers required to make
21 payments by electronic funds transfer shall make those payments
22 for a minimum of one year beginning on October 1.

23 Any taxpayer not required to make payments by electronic
24 funds transfer may make payments by electronic funds transfer
25 with the permission of the Department.

26 All taxpayers required to make payment by electronic funds

1 transfer and any taxpayers authorized to voluntarily make
2 payments by electronic funds transfer shall make those payments
3 in the manner authorized by the Department.

4 The Department shall adopt such rules as are necessary to
5 effectuate a program of electronic funds transfer and the
6 requirements of this Section.

7 Where a serviceman collects the tax with respect to the
8 selling price of tangible personal property which he sells and
9 the purchaser thereafter returns such tangible personal
10 property and the serviceman refunds the selling price thereof
11 to the purchaser, such serviceman shall also refund, to the
12 purchaser, the tax so collected from the purchaser. When filing
13 his return for the period in which he refunds such tax to the
14 purchaser, the serviceman may deduct the amount of the tax so
15 refunded by him to the purchaser from any other Service
16 Occupation Tax, Service Use Tax, Retailers' Occupation Tax or
17 Use Tax which such serviceman may be required to pay or remit
18 to the Department, as shown by such return, provided that the
19 amount of the tax to be deducted shall previously have been
20 remitted to the Department by such serviceman. If the
21 serviceman shall not previously have remitted the amount of
22 such tax to the Department, he shall be entitled to no
23 deduction hereunder upon refunding such tax to the purchaser.

24 If experience indicates such action to be practicable, the
25 Department may prescribe and furnish a combination or joint
26 return which will enable servicemen, who are required to file

1 returns hereunder and also under the Retailers' Occupation Tax
2 Act, the Use Tax Act or the Service Use Tax Act, to furnish all
3 the return information required by all said Acts on the one
4 form.

5 Where the serviceman has more than one business registered
6 with the Department under separate registrations hereunder,
7 such serviceman shall file separate returns for each registered
8 business.

9 Beginning January 1, 1990, each month the Department shall
10 pay into the Local Government Tax Fund the revenue realized for
11 the preceding month from the 1% tax on sales of food for human
12 consumption which is to be consumed off the premises where it
13 is sold (other than alcoholic beverages, soft drinks and food
14 which has been prepared for immediate consumption) and
15 prescription and nonprescription medicines, drugs, medical
16 appliances and insulin, urine testing materials, syringes and
17 needles used by diabetics.

18 Beginning January 1, 1990, each month the Department shall
19 pay into the County and Mass Transit District Fund 4% of the
20 revenue realized for the preceding month from the 6.25% general
21 rate.

22 Beginning August 1, 2000, each month the Department shall
23 pay into the County and Mass Transit District Fund 20% of the
24 net revenue realized for the preceding month from the 1.25%
25 rate on the selling price of motor fuel and gasohol.

26 Beginning January 1, 1990, each month the Department shall

1 pay into the Local Government Tax Fund 16% of the revenue
2 realized for the preceding month from the 6.25% general rate on
3 transfers of tangible personal property.

4 Beginning August 1, 2000, each month the Department shall
5 pay into the Local Government Tax Fund 80% of the net revenue
6 realized for the preceding month from the 1.25% rate on the
7 selling price of motor fuel and gasohol.

8 Of the remainder of the moneys received by the Department
9 pursuant to this Act, (a) 1.75% thereof shall be paid into the
10 Build Illinois Fund and (b) prior to July 1, 1989, 2.2% and on
11 and after July 1, 1989, 3.8% thereof shall be paid into the
12 Build Illinois Fund; provided, however, that if in any fiscal
13 year the sum of (1) the aggregate of 2.2% or 3.8%, as the case
14 may be, of the moneys received by the Department and required
15 to be paid into the Build Illinois Fund pursuant to Section 3
16 of the Retailers' Occupation Tax Act, Section 9 of the Use Tax
17 Act, Section 9 of the Service Use Tax Act, and Section 9 of the
18 Service Occupation Tax Act, such Acts being hereinafter called
19 the "Tax Acts" and such aggregate of 2.2% or 3.8%, as the case
20 may be, of moneys being hereinafter called the "Tax Act
21 Amount", and (2) the amount transferred to the Build Illinois
22 Fund from the State and Local Sales Tax Reform Fund shall be
23 less than the Annual Specified Amount (as defined in Section 3
24 of the Retailers' Occupation Tax Act), an amount equal to the
25 difference shall be immediately paid into the Build Illinois
26 Fund from other moneys received by the Department pursuant to

1 the Tax Acts; and further provided, that if on the last
2 business day of any month the sum of (1) the Tax Act Amount
3 required to be deposited into the Build Illinois Account in the
4 Build Illinois Fund during such month and (2) the amount
5 transferred during such month to the Build Illinois Fund from
6 the State and Local Sales Tax Reform Fund shall have been less
7 than 1/12 of the Annual Specified Amount, an amount equal to
8 the difference shall be immediately paid into the Build
9 Illinois Fund from other moneys received by the Department
10 pursuant to the Tax Acts; and, further provided, that in no
11 event shall the payments required under the preceding proviso
12 result in aggregate payments into the Build Illinois Fund
13 pursuant to this clause (b) for any fiscal year in excess of
14 the greater of (i) the Tax Act Amount or (ii) the Annual
15 Specified Amount for such fiscal year; and, further provided,
16 that the amounts payable into the Build Illinois Fund under
17 this clause (b) shall be payable only until such time as the
18 aggregate amount on deposit under each trust indenture securing
19 Bonds issued and outstanding pursuant to the Build Illinois
20 Bond Act is sufficient, taking into account any future
21 investment income, to fully provide, in accordance with such
22 indenture, for the defeasance of or the payment of the
23 principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds
24 secured by such indenture and on any Bonds expected to be
25 issued thereafter and all fees and costs payable with respect
26 thereto, all as certified by the Director of the Bureau of the

1 Budget (now Governor's Office of Management and Budget). If on
2 the last business day of any month in which Bonds are
3 outstanding pursuant to the Build Illinois Bond Act, the
4 aggregate of the moneys deposited in the Build Illinois Bond
5 Account in the Build Illinois Fund in such month shall be less
6 than the amount required to be transferred in such month from
7 the Build Illinois Bond Account to the Build Illinois Bond
8 Retirement and Interest Fund pursuant to Section 13 of the
9 Build Illinois Bond Act, an amount equal to such deficiency
10 shall be immediately paid from other moneys received by the
11 Department pursuant to the Tax Acts to the Build Illinois Fund;
12 provided, however, that any amounts paid to the Build Illinois
13 Fund in any fiscal year pursuant to this sentence shall be
14 deemed to constitute payments pursuant to clause (b) of the
15 preceding sentence and shall reduce the amount otherwise
16 payable for such fiscal year pursuant to clause (b) of the
17 preceding sentence. The moneys received by the Department
18 pursuant to this Act and required to be deposited into the
19 Build Illinois Fund are subject to the pledge, claim and charge
20 set forth in Section 12 of the Build Illinois Bond Act.

21 Subject to payment of amounts into the Build Illinois Fund
22 as provided in the preceding paragraph or in any amendment
23 thereto hereafter enacted, the following specified monthly
24 installment of the amount requested in the certificate of the
25 Chairman of the Metropolitan Pier and Exposition Authority
26 provided under Section 8.25f of the State Finance Act, but not

1 in excess of the sums designated as "Total Deposit", shall be
 2 deposited in the aggregate from collections under Section 9 of
 3 the Use Tax Act, Section 9 of the Service Use Tax Act, Section
 4 9 of the Service Occupation Tax Act, and Section 3 of the
 5 Retailers' Occupation Tax Act into the McCormick Place
 6 Expansion Project Fund in the specified fiscal years.

25 the annual return for each month or fraction of a month

25 Net revenue realized for a month shall be the revenue

5 products are sold by numerous servicemen in Illinois, and who

9 not make written objection to the Department to this

11 by him prior to the month or quarter for which the return

13 5. Deductions allowed by law;

14 6. Gross receipts which were received by him during the
15 preceding calendar month or quarter and upon the basis of

20 9. The signature of the taxpayer; and

21 10. Such other reasonable information as the

23 If a taxpayer fails to sign a return within 30 days after

1 Each return shall be accompanied by the statement of
2 prepaid tax issued pursuant to Section 2e for which credit is
3 claimed.

4 Prior to October 1, 2003, and on and after September 1,
5 2004 a retailer may accept a Manufacturer's Purchase Credit
6 certification from a purchaser in satisfaction of Use Tax as
7 provided in Section 3-85 of the Use Tax Act if the purchaser

20 Beginning on October 1, 2003, any person who is not a
21 licensed distributor, importing distributor, or manufacturer,
22 as defined in the Liquor Control Act of 1934, but is engaged in
23 the business of selling, at retail, alcoholic liquor shall file
24 a statement with the Department of Revenue, in a format and at
25 a time prescribed by the Department, showing the total amount
26 paid for alcoholic liquor purchased during the preceding month

1 and such other information as is reasonably required by the
2 Department. The Department may adopt rules to require that this
3 statement be filed in an electronic or telephonic format. Such
4 rules may provide for exceptions from the filing requirements
5 of this paragraph. For the purposes of this paragraph, the term
6 "alcoholic liquor" shall have the meaning prescribed in the
7 Liquor Control Act of 1934.

8 Beginning on October 1, 2003, every distributor, importing
9 distributor, and manufacturer of alcoholic liquor as defined in
10 the Liquor Control Act of 1934, shall file a statement with the
11 Department of Revenue, no later than the 10th day of the month
12 for the preceding month during which transactions occurred, by
13 electronic means, showing the total amount of gross receipts
14 from the sale of alcoholic liquor sold or distributed during
15 the preceding month to purchasers; identifying the purchaser to
16 whom it was sold or distributed; the purchaser's tax
17 registration number; and such other information reasonably
18 required by the Department. A distributor, importing
19 distributor, or manufacturer of alcoholic liquor must
20 personally deliver, mail, or provide by electronic means to
21 each retailer listed on the monthly statement a report
22 containing a cumulative total of that distributor's, importing
23 distributor's, or manufacturer's total sales of alcoholic
24 liquor to that retailer no later than the 10th day of the month
25 for the preceding month during which the transaction occurred.
26 The distributor, importing distributor, or manufacturer shall

1 notify the retailer as to the method by which the distributor,
2 importing distributor, or manufacturer will provide the sales
3 information. If the retailer is unable to receive the sales
4 information by electronic means, the distributor, importing
5 distributor, or manufacturer shall furnish the sales
6 information by personal delivery or by mail. For purposes of
7 this paragraph, the term "electronic means" includes, but is
8 not limited to, the use of a secure Internet website, e-mail,
9 or facsimile.

10 If a total amount of less than \$1 is payable, refundable or
11 creditable, such amount shall be disregarded if it is less than
12 50 cents and shall be increased to \$1 if it is 50 cents or more.

13 Beginning October 1, 1993, a taxpayer who has an average
14 monthly tax liability of \$150,000 or more shall make all
15 payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
16 funds transfer. Beginning October 1, 1994, a taxpayer who has
17 an average monthly tax liability of \$100,000 or more shall make
18 all payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
19 funds transfer. Beginning October 1, 1995, a taxpayer who has
20 an average monthly tax liability of \$50,000 or more shall make
21 all payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
22 funds transfer. Beginning October 1, 2000, a taxpayer who has
23 an annual tax liability of \$200,000 or more shall make all
24 payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
25 funds transfer. The term "annual tax liability" shall be the
26 sum of the taxpayer's liabilities under this Act, and under all

1 other State and local occupation and use tax laws administered
2 by the Department, for the immediately preceding calendar year.
3 The term "average monthly tax liability" shall be the sum of
4 the taxpayer's liabilities under this Act, and under all other
5 State and local occupation and use tax laws administered by the
6 Department, for the immediately preceding calendar year
7 divided by 12. Beginning on October 1, 2002, a taxpayer who has
8 a tax liability in the amount set forth in subsection (b) of
9 Section 2505-210 of the Department of Revenue Law shall make
10 all payments required by rules of the Department by electronic
11 funds transfer.

12 Before August 1 of each year beginning in 1993, the
13 Department shall notify all taxpayers required to make payments
14 by electronic funds transfer. All taxpayers required to make
15 payments by electronic funds transfer shall make those payments
16 for a minimum of one year beginning on October 1.

17 Any taxpayer not required to make payments by electronic
18 funds transfer may make payments by electronic funds transfer
19 with the permission of the Department.

20 All taxpayers required to make payment by electronic funds
21 transfer and any taxpayers authorized to voluntarily make
22 payments by electronic funds transfer shall make those payments
23 in the manner authorized by the Department.

24 The Department shall adopt such rules as are necessary to
25 effectuate a program of electronic funds transfer and the
26 requirements of this Section.

1 Any amount which is required to be shown or reported on any
2 return or other document under this Act shall, if such amount
3 is not a whole-dollar amount, be increased to the nearest
4 whole-dollar amount in any case where the fractional part of a
5 dollar is 50 cents or more, and decreased to the nearest
6 whole-dollar amount where the fractional part of a dollar is
7 less than 50 cents.

8 If the retailer is otherwise required to file a monthly
9 return and if the retailer's average monthly tax liability to
10 the Department does not exceed \$200, the Department may
11 authorize his returns to be filed on a quarter annual basis,
12 with the return for January, February and March of a given year
13 being due by April 20 of such year; with the return for April,
14 May and June of a given year being due by July 20 of such year;
15 with the return for July, August and September of a given year
16 being due by October 20 of such year, and with the return for
17 October, November and December of a given year being due by
18 January 20 of the following year.

19 If the retailer is otherwise required to file a monthly or
20 quarterly return and if the retailer's average monthly tax
21 liability with the Department does not exceed \$50, the
22 Department may authorize his returns to be filed on an annual
23 basis, with the return for a given year being due by January 20
24 of the following year.

25 Such quarter annual and annual returns, as to form and
26 substance, shall be subject to the same requirements as monthly

1 returns.

2 Notwithstanding any other provision in this Act concerning
3 the time within which a retailer may file his return, in the
4 case of any retailer who ceases to engage in a kind of business
5 which makes him responsible for filing returns under this Act,
6 such retailer shall file a final return under this Act with the
7 Department not more than one month after discontinuing such
8 business.

9 Where the same person has more than one business registered
10 with the Department under separate registrations under this
11 Act, such person may not file each return that is due as a
12 single return covering all such registered businesses, but
13 shall file separate returns for each such registered business.

14 In addition, with respect to motor vehicles, watercraft,
15 aircraft, and trailers that are required to be registered with
16 an agency of this State, every retailer selling this kind of
17 tangible personal property shall file, with the Department,
18 upon a form to be prescribed and supplied by the Department, a
19 separate return for each such item of tangible personal
20 property which the retailer sells, except that if, in the same
21 transaction, (i) a retailer of aircraft, watercraft, motor
22 vehicles or trailers transfers more than one aircraft,
23 watercraft, motor vehicle or trailer to another aircraft,
24 watercraft, motor vehicle retailer or trailer retailer for the
25 purpose of resale or (ii) a retailer of aircraft, watercraft,
26 motor vehicles, or trailers transfers more than one aircraft,

1 watercraft, motor vehicle, or trailer to a purchaser for use as
2 a qualifying rolling stock as provided in Section 2-5 of this
3 Act, then that seller may report the transfer of all aircraft,
4 watercraft, motor vehicles or trailers involved in that
5 transaction to the Department on the same uniform
6 invoice-transaction reporting return form. For purposes of
7 this Section, "watercraft" means a Class 2, Class 3, or Class 4
8 watercraft as defined in Section 3-2 of the Boat Registration
9 and Safety Act, a personal watercraft, or any boat equipped
10 with an inboard motor.

11 Any retailer who sells only motor vehicles, watercraft,
12 aircraft, or trailers that are required to be registered with
13 an agency of this State, so that all retailers' occupation tax
14 liability is required to be reported, and is reported, on such
15 transaction reporting returns and who is not otherwise required
16 to file monthly or quarterly returns, need not file monthly or
17 quarterly returns. However, those retailers shall be required
18 to file returns on an annual basis.

19 The transaction reporting return, in the case of motor
20 vehicles or trailers that are required to be registered with an
21 agency of this State, shall be the same document as the Uniform
22 Invoice referred to in Section 5-402 of The Illinois Vehicle
23 Code and must show the name and address of the seller; the name
24 and address of the purchaser; the amount of the selling price
25 including the amount allowed by the retailer for traded-in
26 property, if any; the amount allowed by the retailer for the

1 traded-in tangible personal property, if any, to the extent to
2 which Section 1 of this Act allows an exemption for the value
3 of traded-in property; the balance payable after deducting such
4 trade-in allowance from the total selling price; the amount of
5 tax due from the retailer with respect to such transaction; the
6 amount of tax collected from the purchaser by the retailer on
7 such transaction (or satisfactory evidence that such tax is not
8 due in that particular instance, if that is claimed to be the
9 fact); the place and date of the sale; a sufficient
10 identification of the property sold; such other information as
11 is required in Section 5-402 of The Illinois Vehicle Code, and
12 such other information as the Department may reasonably
13 require.

14 The transaction reporting return in the case of watercraft
15 or aircraft must show the name and address of the seller; the
16 name and address of the purchaser; the amount of the selling
17 price including the amount allowed by the retailer for
18 traded-in property, if any; the amount allowed by the retailer
19 for the traded-in tangible personal property, if any, to the
20 extent to which Section 1 of this Act allows an exemption for
21 the value of traded-in property; the balance payable after
22 deducting such trade-in allowance from the total selling price;
23 the amount of tax due from the retailer with respect to such
24 transaction; the amount of tax collected from the purchaser by
25 the retailer on such transaction (or satisfactory evidence that
26 such tax is not due in that particular instance, if that is

1 claimed to be the fact); the place and date of the sale, a
2 sufficient identification of the property sold, and such other
3 information as the Department may reasonably require.

4 Such transaction reporting return shall be filed not later
5 than 20 days after the day of delivery of the item that is
6 being sold, but may be filed by the retailer at any time sooner
7 than that if he chooses to do so. The transaction reporting
8 return and tax remittance or proof of exemption from the
9 Illinois use tax may be transmitted to the Department by way of
10 the State agency with which, or State officer with whom the
11 tangible personal property must be titled or registered (if
12 titling or registration is required) if the Department and such
13 agency or State officer determine that this procedure will
14 expedite the processing of applications for title or
15 registration.

16 With each such transaction reporting return, the retailer
17 shall remit the proper amount of tax due (or shall submit
18 satisfactory evidence that the sale is not taxable if that is
19 the case), to the Department or its agents, whereupon the
20 Department shall issue, in the purchaser's name, a use tax
21 receipt (or a certificate of exemption if the Department is
22 satisfied that the particular sale is tax exempt) which such
23 purchaser may submit to the agency with which, or State officer
24 with whom, he must title or register the tangible personal
25 property that is involved (if titling or registration is
26 required) in support of such purchaser's application for an

1 Illinois certificate or other evidence of title or registration
2 to such tangible personal property.

3 No retailer's failure or refusal to remit tax under this
4 Act precludes a user, who has paid the proper tax to the
5 retailer, from obtaining his certificate of title or other
6 evidence of title or registration (if titling or registration
7 is required) upon satisfying the Department that such user has
8 paid the proper tax (if tax is due) to the retailer. The
9 Department shall adopt appropriate rules to carry out the
10 mandate of this paragraph.

11 If the user who would otherwise pay tax to the retailer
12 wants the transaction reporting return filed and the payment of
13 the tax or proof of exemption made to the Department before the
14 retailer is willing to take these actions and such user has not
15 paid the tax to the retailer, such user may certify to the fact
16 of such delay by the retailer and may (upon the Department
17 being satisfied of the truth of such certification) transmit
18 the information required by the transaction reporting return
19 and the remittance for tax or proof of exemption directly to
20 the Department and obtain his tax receipt or exemption
21 determination, in which event the transaction reporting return
22 and tax remittance (if a tax payment was required) shall be
23 credited by the Department to the proper retailer's account
24 with the Department, but without the 2.1% or 1.75% discount
25 provided for in this Section being allowed. When the user pays
26 the tax directly to the Department, he shall pay the tax in the

1 same amount and in the same form in which it would be remitted
2 if the tax had been remitted to the Department by the retailer.

3 Refunds made by the seller during the preceding return
4 period to purchasers, on account of tangible personal property
5 returned to the seller, shall be allowed as a deduction under
6 subdivision 5 of his monthly or quarterly return, as the case
7 may be, in case the seller had theretofore included the
8 receipts from the sale of such tangible personal property in a
9 return filed by him and had paid the tax imposed by this Act
10 with respect to such receipts.

11 Where the seller is a corporation, the return filed on
12 behalf of such corporation shall be signed by the president,
13 vice-president, secretary or treasurer or by the properly
14 accredited agent of such corporation.

15 Where the seller is a limited liability company, the return
16 filed on behalf of the limited liability company shall be
17 signed by a manager, member, or properly accredited agent of
18 the limited liability company.

19 Except as provided in this Section, the retailer filing the
20 return under this Section shall, at the time of filing such
21 return, pay to the Department the amount of tax imposed by this
22 Act less a discount of 2.1% prior to January 1, 1990 and 1.75%
23 on and after January 1, 1990, or \$5 per calendar year,
24 whichever is greater, which is allowed to reimburse the
25 retailer for the expenses incurred in keeping records,
26 preparing and filing returns, remitting the tax and supplying

1 data to the Department on request. Any prepayment made pursuant
2 to Section 2d of this Act shall be included in the amount on
3 which such 2.1% or 1.75% discount is computed. In the case of
4 retailers who report and pay the tax on a transaction by
5 transaction basis, as provided in this Section, such discount
6 shall be taken with each such tax remittance instead of when
7 such retailer files his periodic return.

8 Before October 1, 2000, if the taxpayer's average monthly
9 tax liability to the Department under this Act, the Use Tax
10 Act, the Service Occupation Tax Act, and the Service Use Tax
11 Act, excluding any liability for prepaid sales tax to be
12 remitted in accordance with Section 2d of this Act, was \$10,000
13 or more during the preceding 4 complete calendar quarters, he
14 shall file a return with the Department each month by the 20th
15 day of the month next following the month during which such tax
16 liability is incurred and shall make payments to the Department
17 on or before the 7th, 15th, 22nd and last day of the month
18 during which such liability is incurred. On and after October
19 1, 2000, if the taxpayer's average monthly tax liability to the
20 Department under this Act, the Use Tax Act, the Service
21 Occupation Tax Act, and the Service Use Tax Act, excluding any
22 liability for prepaid sales tax to be remitted in accordance
23 with Section 2d of this Act, was \$20,000 or more during the
24 preceding 4 complete calendar quarters, he shall file a return
25 with the Department each month by the 20th day of the month
26 next following the month during which such tax liability is

1 incurred and shall make payment to the Department on or before
2 the 7th, 15th, 22nd and last day of the month during which such
3 liability is incurred. If the month during which such tax
4 liability is incurred began prior to January 1, 1985, each
5 payment shall be in an amount equal to 1/4 of the taxpayer's
6 actual liability for the month or an amount set by the
7 Department not to exceed 1/4 of the average monthly liability
8 of the taxpayer to the Department for the preceding 4 complete
9 calendar quarters (excluding the month of highest liability and
10 the month of lowest liability in such 4 quarter period). If the
11 month during which such tax liability is incurred begins on or
12 after January 1, 1985 and prior to January 1, 1987, each
13 payment shall be in an amount equal to 22.5% of the taxpayer's
14 actual liability for the month or 27.5% of the taxpayer's
15 liability for the same calendar month of the preceding year. If
16 the month during which such tax liability is incurred begins on
17 or after January 1, 1987 and prior to January 1, 1988, each
18 payment shall be in an amount equal to 22.5% of the taxpayer's
19 actual liability for the month or 26.25% of the taxpayer's
20 liability for the same calendar month of the preceding year. If
21 the month during which such tax liability is incurred begins on
22 or after January 1, 1988, and prior to January 1, 1989, or
23 begins on or after January 1, 1996, each payment shall be in an
24 amount equal to 22.5% of the taxpayer's actual liability for
25 the month or 25% of the taxpayer's liability for the same
26 calendar month of the preceding year. If the month during which

1 such tax liability is incurred begins on or after January 1,
2 1989, and prior to January 1, 1996, each payment shall be in an
3 amount equal to 22.5% of the taxpayer's actual liability for
4 the month or 25% of the taxpayer's liability for the same
5 calendar month of the preceding year or 100% of the taxpayer's
6 actual liability for the quarter monthly reporting period. The
7 amount of such quarter monthly payments shall be credited
8 against the final tax liability of the taxpayer's return for
9 that month. Before October 1, 2000, once applicable, the
10 requirement of the making of quarter monthly payments to the
11 Department by taxpayers having an average monthly tax liability
12 of \$10,000 or more as determined in the manner provided above
13 shall continue until such taxpayer's average monthly liability
14 to the Department during the preceding 4 complete calendar
15 quarters (excluding the month of highest liability and the
16 month of lowest liability) is less than \$9,000, or until such
17 taxpayer's average monthly liability to the Department as
18 computed for each calendar quarter of the 4 preceding complete
19 calendar quarter period is less than \$10,000. However, if a
20 taxpayer can show the Department that a substantial change in
21 the taxpayer's business has occurred which causes the taxpayer
22 to anticipate that his average monthly tax liability for the
23 reasonably foreseeable future will fall below the \$10,000
24 threshold stated above, then such taxpayer may petition the
25 Department for a change in such taxpayer's reporting status. On
26 and after October 1, 2000, once applicable, the requirement of

1 the making of quarter monthly payments to the Department by
2 taxpayers having an average monthly tax liability of \$20,000 or
3 more as determined in the manner provided above shall continue
4 until such taxpayer's average monthly liability to the
5 Department during the preceding 4 complete calendar quarters
6 (excluding the month of highest liability and the month of
7 lowest liability) is less than \$19,000 or until such taxpayer's
8 average monthly liability to the Department as computed for
9 each calendar quarter of the 4 preceding complete calendar
10 quarter period is less than \$20,000. However, if a taxpayer can
11 show the Department that a substantial change in the taxpayer's
12 business has occurred which causes the taxpayer to anticipate
13 that his average monthly tax liability for the reasonably
14 foreseeable future will fall below the \$20,000 threshold stated
15 above, then such taxpayer may petition the Department for a
16 change in such taxpayer's reporting status. The Department
17 shall change such taxpayer's reporting status unless it finds
18 that such change is seasonal in nature and not likely to be
19 long term. If any such quarter monthly payment is not paid at
20 the time or in the amount required by this Section, then the
21 taxpayer shall be liable for penalties and interest on the
22 difference between the minimum amount due as a payment and the
23 amount of such quarter monthly payment actually and timely
24 paid, except insofar as the taxpayer has previously made
25 payments for that month to the Department in excess of the
26 minimum payments previously due as provided in this Section.

1 The Department shall make reasonable rules and regulations to
2 govern the quarter monthly payment amount and quarter monthly
3 payment dates for taxpayers who file on other than a calendar
4 monthly basis.

5 The provisions of this paragraph apply before October 1,
6 2001. Without regard to whether a taxpayer is required to make
7 quarter monthly payments as specified above, any taxpayer who
8 is required by Section 2d of this Act to collect and remit
9 prepaid taxes and has collected prepaid taxes which average in
10 excess of \$25,000 per month during the preceding 2 complete
11 calendar quarters, shall file a return with the Department as
12 required by Section 2f and shall make payments to the
13 Department on or before the 7th, 15th, 22nd and last day of the
14 month during which such liability is incurred. If the month
15 during which such tax liability is incurred began prior to the
16 effective date of this amendatory Act of 1985, each payment
17 shall be in an amount not less than 22.5% of the taxpayer's
18 actual liability under Section 2d. If the month during which
19 such tax liability is incurred begins on or after January 1,
20 1986, each payment shall be in an amount equal to 22.5% of the
21 taxpayer's actual liability for the month or 27.5% of the
22 taxpayer's liability for the same calendar month of the
23 preceding calendar year. If the month during which such tax
24 liability is incurred begins on or after January 1, 1987, each
25 payment shall be in an amount equal to 22.5% of the taxpayer's
26 actual liability for the month or 26.25% of the taxpayer's

1 liability for the same calendar month of the preceding year.
2 The amount of such quarter monthly payments shall be credited
3 against the final tax liability of the taxpayer's return for
4 that month filed under this Section or Section 2f, as the case
5 may be. Once applicable, the requirement of the making of
6 quarter monthly payments to the Department pursuant to this
7 paragraph shall continue until such taxpayer's average monthly
8 prepaid tax collections during the preceding 2 complete
9 calendar quarters is \$25,000 or less. If any such quarter
10 monthly payment is not paid at the time or in the amount
11 required, the taxpayer shall be liable for penalties and
12 interest on such difference, except insofar as the taxpayer has
13 previously made payments for that month in excess of the
14 minimum payments previously due.

15 The provisions of this paragraph apply on and after October
16 1, 2001. Without regard to whether a taxpayer is required to
17 make quarter monthly payments as specified above, any taxpayer
18 who is required by Section 2d of this Act to collect and remit
19 prepaid taxes and has collected prepaid taxes that average in
20 excess of \$20,000 per month during the preceding 4 complete
21 calendar quarters shall file a return with the Department as
22 required by Section 2f and shall make payments to the
23 Department on or before the 7th, 15th, 22nd and last day of the
24 month during which the liability is incurred. Each payment
25 shall be in an amount equal to 22.5% of the taxpayer's actual
26 liability for the month or 25% of the taxpayer's liability for

1 the same calendar month of the preceding year. The amount of
2 the quarter monthly payments shall be credited against the
3 final tax liability of the taxpayer's return for that month
4 filed under this Section or Section 2f, as the case may be.
5 Once applicable, the requirement of the making of quarter
6 monthly payments to the Department pursuant to this paragraph
7 shall continue until the taxpayer's average monthly prepaid tax
8 collections during the preceding 4 complete calendar quarters
9 (excluding the month of highest liability and the month of
10 lowest liability) is less than \$19,000 or until such taxpayer's
11 average monthly liability to the Department as computed for
12 each calendar quarter of the 4 preceding complete calendar
13 quarters is less than \$20,000. If any such quarter monthly
14 payment is not paid at the time or in the amount required, the
15 taxpayer shall be liable for penalties and interest on such
16 difference, except insofar as the taxpayer has previously made
17 payments for that month in excess of the minimum payments
18 previously due.

19 If any payment provided for in this Section exceeds the
20 taxpayer's liabilities under this Act, the Use Tax Act, the
21 Service Occupation Tax Act and the Service Use Tax Act, as
22 shown on an original monthly return, the Department shall, if
23 requested by the taxpayer, issue to the taxpayer a credit
24 memorandum no later than 30 days after the date of payment. The
25 credit evidenced by such credit memorandum may be assigned by
26 the taxpayer to a similar taxpayer under this Act, the Use Tax

1 Act, the Service Occupation Tax Act or the Service Use Tax Act,
2 in accordance with reasonable rules and regulations to be
3 prescribed by the Department. If no such request is made, the
4 taxpayer may credit such excess payment against tax liability
5 subsequently to be remitted to the Department under this Act,
6 the Use Tax Act, the Service Occupation Tax Act or the Service
7 Use Tax Act, in accordance with reasonable rules and
8 regulations prescribed by the Department. If the Department
9 subsequently determined that all or any part of the credit
10 taken was not actually due to the taxpayer, the taxpayer's 2.1%
11 and 1.75% vendor's discount shall be reduced by 2.1% or 1.75%
12 of the difference between the credit taken and that actually
13 due, and that taxpayer shall be liable for penalties and
14 interest on such difference.

15 If a retailer of motor fuel is entitled to a credit under
16 Section 2d of this Act which exceeds the taxpayer's liability
17 to the Department under this Act for the month which the
18 taxpayer is filing a return, the Department shall issue the
19 taxpayer a credit memorandum for the excess.

20 Beginning January 1, 1990, each month the Department shall
21 pay into the Local Government Tax Fund, a special fund in the
22 State treasury which is hereby created, the net revenue
23 realized for the preceding month from the 1% tax on sales of
24 food for human consumption which is to be consumed off the
25 premises where it is sold (other than alcoholic beverages, soft
26 drinks and food which has been prepared for immediate

1 consumption) and prescription and nonprescription medicines,
2 drugs, medical appliances and insulin, urine testing
3 materials, syringes and needles used by diabetics.

4 Beginning January 1, 1990, each month the Department shall
5 pay into the County and Mass Transit District Fund, a special
6 fund in the State treasury which is hereby created, 4% of the
7 net revenue realized for the preceding month from the 6.25%
8 general rate.

9 Beginning August 1, 2000, each month the Department shall
10 pay into the County and Mass Transit District Fund 20% of the
11 net revenue realized for the preceding month from the 1.25%
12 rate on the selling price of motor fuel and gasohol.

13 Beginning January 1, 1990, each month the Department shall
14 pay into the Local Government Tax Fund 16% of the net revenue
15 realized for the preceding month from the 6.25% general rate on
16 the selling price of tangible personal property.

17 Beginning August 1, 2000, each month the Department shall
18 pay into the Local Government Tax Fund 80% of the net revenue
19 realized for the preceding month from the 1.25% rate on the
20 selling price of motor fuel and gasohol.

21 Of the remainder of the moneys received by the Department
22 pursuant to this Act, (a) 1.75% thereof shall be paid into the
23 Build Illinois Fund and (b) prior to July 1, 1989, 2.2% and on
24 and after July 1, 1989, 3.8% thereof shall be paid into the
25 Build Illinois Fund; provided, however, that if in any fiscal
26 year the sum of (1) the aggregate of 2.2% or 3.8%, as the case

1 may be, of the moneys received by the Department and required
2 to be paid into the Build Illinois Fund pursuant to this Act,
3 Section 9 of the Use Tax Act, Section 9 of the Service Use Tax
4 Act, and Section 9 of the Service Occupation Tax Act, such Acts
5 being hereinafter called the "Tax Acts" and such aggregate of
6 2.2% or 3.8%, as the case may be, of moneys being hereinafter
7 called the "Tax Act Amount", and (2) the amount transferred to
8 the Build Illinois Fund from the State and Local Sales Tax
9 Reform Fund shall be less than the Annual Specified Amount (as
10 hereinafter defined), an amount equal to the difference shall
11 be immediately paid into the Build Illinois Fund from other
12 moneys received by the Department pursuant to the Tax Acts; the
13 "Annual Specified Amount" means the amounts specified below for
14 fiscal years 1986 through 1993:

24 and means the Certified Annual Debt Service Requirement (as
25 defined in Section 13 of the Build Illinois Bond Act) or the
26 Tax Act Amount, whichever is greater, for fiscal year 1994 and

1 each fiscal year thereafter; and further provided, that if on
2 the last business day of any month the sum of (1) the Tax Act
3 Amount required to be deposited into the Build Illinois Bond
4 Account in the Build Illinois Fund during such month and (2)
5 the amount transferred to the Build Illinois Fund from the
6 State and Local Sales Tax Reform Fund shall have been less than
7 1/12 of the Annual Specified Amount, an amount equal to the
8 difference shall be immediately paid into the Build Illinois
9 Fund from other moneys received by the Department pursuant to
10 the Tax Acts; and, further provided, that in no event shall the
11 payments required under the preceding proviso result in
12 aggregate payments into the Build Illinois Fund pursuant to
13 this clause (b) for any fiscal year in excess of the greater of
14 (i) the Tax Act Amount or (ii) the Annual Specified Amount for
15 such fiscal year. The amounts payable into the Build Illinois
16 Fund under clause (b) of the first sentence in this paragraph
17 shall be payable only until such time as the aggregate amount
18 on deposit under each trust indenture securing Bonds issued and
19 outstanding pursuant to the Build Illinois Bond Act is
20 sufficient, taking into account any future investment income,
21 to fully provide, in accordance with such indenture, for the
22 defeasance of or the payment of the principal of, premium, if
23 any, and interest on the Bonds secured by such indenture and on
24 any Bonds expected to be issued thereafter and all fees and
25 costs payable with respect thereto, all as certified by the
26 Director of the Bureau of the Budget (now Governor's Office of

1 Management and Budget). If on the last business day of any
2 month in which Bonds are outstanding pursuant to the Build
3 Illinois Bond Act, the aggregate of moneys deposited in the
4 Build Illinois Bond Account in the Build Illinois Fund in such
5 month shall be less than the amount required to be transferred
6 in such month from the Build Illinois Bond Account to the Build
7 Illinois Bond Retirement and Interest Fund pursuant to Section
8 13 of the Build Illinois Bond Act, an amount equal to such
9 deficiency shall be immediately paid from other moneys received
10 by the Department pursuant to the Tax Acts to the Build
11 Illinois Fund; provided, however, that any amounts paid to the
12 Build Illinois Fund in any fiscal year pursuant to this
13 sentence shall be deemed to constitute payments pursuant to
14 clause (b) of the first sentence of this paragraph and shall
15 reduce the amount otherwise payable for such fiscal year
16 pursuant to that clause (b). The moneys received by the
17 Department pursuant to this Act and required to be deposited
18 into the Build Illinois Fund are subject to the pledge, claim
19 and charge set forth in Section 12 of the Build Illinois Bond
20 Act.

21 Subject to payment of amounts into the Build Illinois Fund
22 as provided in the preceding paragraph or in any amendment
23 thereto hereafter enacted, the following specified monthly
24 installment of the amount requested in the certificate of the
25 Chairman of the Metropolitan Pier and Exposition Authority
26 provided under Section 8.25f of the State Finance Act, but not

1 in excess of sums designated as "Total Deposit", shall be
 2 deposited in the aggregate from collections under Section 9 of
 3 the Use Tax Act, Section 9 of the Service Use Tax Act, Section
 4 9 of the Service Occupation Tax Act, and Section 3 of the
 5 Retailers' Occupation Tax Act into the McCormick Place
 6 Expansion Project Fund in the specified fiscal years.

8 Subject to payment of amounts into the Build Illinois Fund
9 and the McCormick Place Expansion Project Fund under the
10 preceding paragraphs, each month the Department shall, subject
11 to appropriation, pay into the Local Government Distributive
12 Fund 0.4% of the net revenue realized for the preceding month
13 from the 5% general rate, or 0.4% of 80% of the net revenue
14 realized for the preceding month from the 6.25% general rate,
15 as the case may be, on the selling price of tangible personal
16 property. That amount shall, subject to appropriation, be
17 distributed as provided in Section 2 of the State Revenue
18 Sharing Act. No payments or distributions under this paragraph

23 Subject to payment of amounts into the Build Illinois Fund,
24 ~~and~~ the McCormick Place Expansion Project Fund, and the Local

26 paragraphs or in any amendments thereto hereafter enacted,

1 beginning July 1, 1993, the Department shall each month pay
2 into the Illinois Tax Increment Fund 0.27% of 80% of the net
3 revenue realized for the preceding month from the 6.25% general
4 rate on the selling price of tangible personal property.

5 Subject to payment of amounts into the Build Illinois Fund,
6 ~~and~~ the McCormick Place Expansion Project Fund, and the Local
7 Government Distributive Fund pursuant to the preceding
8 paragraphs or in any amendments thereto hereafter enacted,
9 beginning with the receipt of the first report of taxes paid by
10 an eligible business and continuing for a 25-year period, the
11 Department shall each month pay into the Energy Infrastructure
12 Fund 80% of the net revenue realized from the 6.25% general
13 rate on the selling price of Illinois-mined coal that was sold
14 to an eligible business. For purposes of this paragraph, the
15 term "eligible business" means a new electric generating
16 facility certified pursuant to Section 605-332 of the
17 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity Law of the
18 Civil Administrative Code of Illinois.

19 Of the remainder of the moneys received by the Department
20 pursuant to this Act, 75% thereof shall be paid into the State
21 Treasury and 25% shall be reserved in a special account and
22 used only for the transfer to the Common School Fund as part of
23 the monthly transfer from the General Revenue Fund in
24 accordance with Section 8a of the State Finance Act.

25 The Department may, upon separate written notice to a
26 taxpayer, require the taxpayer to prepare and file with the

1 Department on a form prescribed by the Department within not
2 less than 60 days after receipt of the notice an annual
3 information return for the tax year specified in the notice.
4 Such annual return to the Department shall include a statement
5 of gross receipts as shown by the retailer's last Federal
6 income tax return. If the total receipts of the business as
7 reported in the Federal income tax return do not agree with the
8 gross receipts reported to the Department of Revenue for the
9 same period, the retailer shall attach to his annual return a
10 schedule showing a reconciliation of the 2 amounts and the
11 reasons for the difference. The retailer's annual return to the
12 Department shall also disclose the cost of goods sold by the
13 retailer during the year covered by such return, opening and
14 closing inventories of such goods for such year, costs of goods
15 used from stock or taken from stock and given away by the
16 retailer during such year, payroll information of the
17 retailer's business during such year and any additional
18 reasonable information which the Department deems would be
19 helpful in determining the accuracy of the monthly, quarterly
20 or annual returns filed by such retailer as provided for in
21 this Section.

22 If the annual information return required by this Section
23 is not filed when and as required, the taxpayer shall be liable
24 as follows:

- 25 (i) Until January 1, 1994, the taxpayer shall be liable
26 for a penalty equal to 1/6 of 1% of the tax due from such

1 taxpayer under this Act during the period to be covered by
2 the annual return for each month or fraction of a month
3 until such return is filed as required, the penalty to be
4 assessed and collected in the same manner as any other
5 penalty provided for in this Act.

6 (ii) On and after January 1, 1994, the taxpayer shall
7 be liable for a penalty as described in Section 3-4 of the
8 Uniform Penalty and Interest Act.

9 The chief executive officer, proprietor, owner or highest
10 ranking manager shall sign the annual return to certify the
11 accuracy of the information contained therein. Any person who
12 willfully signs the annual return containing false or
13 inaccurate information shall be guilty of perjury and punished
14 accordingly. The annual return form prescribed by the
15 Department shall include a warning that the person signing the
16 return may be liable for perjury.

17 The provisions of this Section concerning the filing of an
18 annual information return do not apply to a retailer who is not
19 required to file an income tax return with the United States
20 Government.

21 As soon as possible after the first day of each month, upon
22 certification of the Department of Revenue, the Comptroller
23 shall order transferred and the Treasurer shall transfer from
24 the General Revenue Fund to the Motor Fuel Tax Fund an amount
25 equal to 1.7% of 80% of the net revenue realized under this Act
26 for the second preceding month. Beginning April 1, 2000, this

1 transfer is no longer required and shall not be made.

2 Net revenue realized for a month shall be the revenue
3 collected by the State pursuant to this Act, less the amount
4 paid out during that month as refunds to taxpayers for
5 overpayment of liability.

6 For greater simplicity of administration, manufacturers,
7 importers and wholesalers whose products are sold at retail in
8 Illinois by numerous retailers, and who wish to do so, may
9 assume the responsibility for accounting and paying to the
10 Department all tax accruing under this Act with respect to such
11 sales, if the retailers who are affected do not make written
12 objection to the Department to this arrangement.

13 Any person who promotes, organizes, provides retail
14 selling space for concessionaires or other types of sellers at
15 the Illinois State Fair, DuQuoin State Fair, county fairs,
16 local fairs, art shows, flea markets and similar exhibitions or
17 events, including any transient merchant as defined by Section
18 2 of the Transient Merchant Act of 1987, is required to file a
19 report with the Department providing the name of the merchant's
20 business, the name of the person or persons engaged in
21 merchant's business, the permanent address and Illinois
22 Retailers Occupation Tax Registration Number of the merchant,
23 the dates and location of the event and other reasonable
24 information that the Department may require. The report must be
25 filed not later than the 20th day of the month next following
26 the month during which the event with retail sales was held.

1 Any person who fails to file a report required by this Section
2 commits a business offense and is subject to a fine not to
3 exceed \$250.

4 Any person engaged in the business of selling tangible
5 personal property at retail as a concessionaire or other type
6 of seller at the Illinois State Fair, county fairs, art shows,
7 flea markets and similar exhibitions or events, or any
8 transient merchants, as defined by Section 2 of the Transient
9 Merchant Act of 1987, may be required to make a daily report of
10 the amount of such sales to the Department and to make a daily
11 payment of the full amount of tax due. The Department shall
12 impose this requirement when it finds that there is a
13 significant risk of loss of revenue to the State at such an
14 exhibition or event. Such a finding shall be based on evidence
15 that a substantial number of concessionaires or other sellers
16 who are not residents of Illinois will be engaging in the
17 business of selling tangible personal property at retail at the
18 exhibition or event, or other evidence of a significant risk of
19 loss of revenue to the State. The Department shall notify
20 concessionaires and other sellers affected by the imposition of
21 this requirement. In the absence of notification by the
22 Department, the concessionaires and other sellers shall file
23 their returns as otherwise required in this Section.
