1 AN ACT concerning employment.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Community Youth Employment Act.
- Section 5. Program; eligibility. Subject to appropriation,
 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity shall
 administer a competitive grant program that will provide 5,000
 youths with stipends or wages, or both, and supervision for up
 to a 10-week summer work period. The grants shall be awarded
 only to summer programs, of no more than 100 youths, that:
- 12 (1) are created and administered by a community-based 13 organization, not-for-profit organization, educational 14 institution, or governmental entity in Illinois;
- 15 (2) employ low-income youths in Illinois between the 16 ages of 14 and 21; and
- 17 (3) involve age-appropriate, ability-appropriate, and 18 experience-appropriate:
 - (A) job training;
- 20 (B) life skills;

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- 21 (C) education counseling;
- 22 (D) work readiness skills; or
- 23 (E) supervised meaningful work experience

1 projects.

- 2 Section 10. Eligible costs. Grant money awarded under this 3 Act shall be used as follows:
- 4 (1) a stipend of \$7.50 per hour for learning activities 5 and at least minimum wage for meaningful work experience 6 for a maximum of 200 hours per participating youth, to be 7 paid over a 10-week period;
- 8 (2) to provide salary for supervisors for each summer 9 program;
- 10 (3) supportive services, including but not limited to 11 transportation and child care; and
- 12 (4) a 10% overhead, per summer program, to provide for insurance and business necessities.
- 14 Section 15. Grantee responsibilities. Any entity receiving 15 a grant under this Act must provide services to the youths receiving stipends or wages, or both, under this Act. In 16 17 providing the following services, the entity must expend, out of the entity's budget, at least 20% of any amount awarded in 18 paragraphs (2) through (4) of Section 10 to provide for 19 20 services under this Section. The services provided must 21 include:
 - (1) job assessment services;
- 23 (2) recreation services;

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24 (3) job placement services; or

- (4) administration of this youth program. 1
- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 2
