SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

30 ILCS 105/13.2

from Ch. 127, par. 149.2

Amends the State Finance Act. Authorizes the State Board of Education to make transfers between the following line item appropriations regardless of the treasury fund from which it is appropriated: General State Aid and General State Aid - Hold Harmless. Provides that such transfers shall be made only when the balance remaining in one or more such line item appropriations is insufficient for the purpose for which the appropriation was made and provided that no such transfer may be made unless the amount transferred is no longer required for the purpose for which that appropriation was made. Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The State Finance Act is amended by changing
Section 13.2 as follows:

6 (30 ILCS 105/13.2) (from Ch. 127, par. 149.2)

7 Sec. 13.2. Transfers among line item appropriations.

8 (a) Transfers among line item appropriations from the same 9 treasury fund for the objects specified in this Section may be 10 made in the manner provided in this Section when the balance 11 remaining in one or more such line item appropriations is 12 insufficient for the purpose for which the appropriation was 13 made.

14 (a-1) No transfers may be made from one agency to another 15 agency, nor may transfers be made from one institution of 16 higher education to another institution of higher education.

17 Except as otherwise provided in this (a-2) Section, transfers may be made only among the objects of expenditure 18 enumerated in this Section, except that no funds may be 19 20 transferred from any appropriation for personal services, from 21 any appropriation for State contributions to the State 22 Employees' Retirement System, from any separate appropriation for employee retirement contributions paid by the employer, nor 23

from any appropriation for State contribution for employee 1 2 group insurance. During State fiscal year 2005, an agency may 3 transfer amounts among its appropriations within the same treasury fund for personal services, employee retirement 4 5 contributions paid by employer, and State Contributions to retirement systems; notwithstanding and in addition to the 6 7 transfers authorized in subsection (c) of this Section, the fiscal year 2005 transfers authorized in this sentence may be 8 9 made in an amount not to exceed 2% of the aggregate amount 10 appropriated to an agency within the same treasury fund. During 11 State fiscal year 2007, the Departments of Children and Family 12 Services, Corrections, Human Services, and Juvenile Justice 13 may transfer amounts among their respective appropriations 14 within the same treasury fund for personal services, employee 15 retirement contributions paid by employer, and State 16 contributions to retirement systems. Notwithstanding, and in 17 addition to, the transfers authorized in subsection (c) of this Section, these transfers may be made in an amount not to exceed 18 19 2% of the aggregate amount appropriated to an agency within the 20 same treasury fund.

21 (a-3) Further, if an agency receives а separate 22 appropriation for employee retirement contributions paid by 23 the employer, any transfer by that agency into an appropriation for personal services must be accompanied by a corresponding 24 transfer into the appropriation for employee retirement 25 26 contributions paid by the employer, in an amount sufficient to

- meet the employer share of the employee contributions required
 to be remitted to the retirement system.
- 3 (b) In addition to the general transfer authority provided 4 under subsection (c), the following agencies have the specific 5 transfer authority granted in this subsection:

6 The Department of Healthcare and Family Services is 7 authorized to make transfers representing savings attributable 8 to not increasing grants due to the births of additional 9 children from line items for payments of cash grants to line 10 items for payments for employment and social services for the 11 purposes outlined in subsection (f) of Section 4-2 of the 12 Illinois Public Aid Code.

13 Department of Children and Family Services The is authorized to make transfers not exceeding 2% of the aggregate 14 15 amount appropriated to it within the same treasury fund for the 16 following line items among these same line items: Foster Home 17 and Specialized Foster Care and Prevention, Institutions and Group Homes and Prevention, and Purchase of Adoption and 18 19 Guardianship Services.

20 The Department on Aging is authorized to make transfers not exceeding 2% of the aggregate amount appropriated to it within 21 22 the same treasury fund for the following Community Care Program 23 line items among these same line items: Homemaker and Senior 24 Companion Services, Alternative Senior Services, Case 25 Coordination Units, and Adult Day Care Services.

26 The State Treasurer is authorized to make transfers among

line item appropriations from the Capital Litigation Trust Fund, with respect to costs incurred in fiscal years 2002 and 2003 only, when the balance remaining in one or more such line item appropriations is insufficient for the purpose for which the appropriation was made, provided that no such transfer may be made unless the amount transferred is no longer required for the purpose for which that appropriation was made.

State Board of Education is authorized to 8 The make 9 transfers from line item appropriations within the same 10 treasury fund for General State Aid and General State Aid -11 Hold Harmless, provided that no such transfer may be made 12 unless the amount transferred is no longer required for the purpose for which that appropriation was made, to the line item 13 14 appropriation for Transitional Assistance when the balance 15 remaining in such line item appropriation is insufficient for 16 the purpose for which the appropriation was made.

17 State Board of Education is authorized to make The transfers between the following line item appropriations 18 19 within the same treasury fund: Disabled Student 20 (Section 14-13.01 of the School Code), Services/Materials 21 Disabled Student Transportation Reimbursement (Section 14-13.01 of the School Code), Disabled Student Tuition -22 Tuition 23 (Section 14-7.02 of the School Private Code). Extraordinary Special Education (Section 14-7.02b of 24 the 25 School Code), Reimbursement for Free Lunch/Breakfast Program, 26 Summer School Payments (Section 18-4.3 of the School Code), and

1 Transportation - Regular/Vocational Reimbursement (Section 2 29-5 of the School Code). Such transfers shall be made only 3 when the balance remaining in one or more such line item 4 appropriations is insufficient for the purpose for which the 5 appropriation was made and provided that no such transfer may 6 be made unless the amount transferred is no longer required for 7 the purpose for which that appropriation was made.

8 The State Board of Education is authorized to make 9 transfers between the following line item appropriations 10 regardless of the treasury fund from which it is appropriated: 11 General State Aid and General State Aid - Hold Harmless. Such 12 transfers shall be made only when the balance remaining in one 13 or more such line item appropriations is insufficient for the purpose for which the appropriation was made and provided that 14 no such transfer may be made unless the amount transferred is 15 16 no longer required for the purpose for which that appropriation 17 was made.

(c) The sum of such transfers for an agency in a fiscal 18 year shall not exceed 2% of the aggregate amount appropriated 19 20 to it within the same treasury fund for the following objects: 21 Services; Personal Extra Help; Student and Inmate 22 Compensation; State Contributions to Retirement Systems; State 23 Contributions to Social Security; State Contribution for Employee Group Insurance; Contractual Services; 24 Travel: 25 Commodities; Printing; Equipment; Electronic Data Processing; 26 Operation of Automotive Equipment; Telecommunications - 6 - LRB096 03626 NHT 13654 b

Services; Travel and Allowance for Committed, Paroled and 1 2 Discharged Prisoners; Library Books; Federal Matching Grants 3 for Student Loans; Refunds; Workers' Compensation, Occupational Disease, and Tort Claims; and, in appropriations 4 5 institutions of higher education, Awards and Grants. above, any amounts 6 Notwithstanding the appropriated for 7 payment of workers' compensation claims to an agency to which 8 the authority to evaluate, administer and pay such claims has 9 been delegated by the Department of Central Management Services 10 may be transferred to any other expenditure object where such 11 amounts exceed the amount necessary for the payment of such 12 claims.

13 Special provisions for State fiscal year 2003. (c-1)14 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section to the 15 contrary, for State fiscal year 2003 only, transfers among line 16 item appropriations to an agency from the same treasury fund 17 may be made provided that the sum of such transfers for an agency in State fiscal year 2003 shall not exceed 3% of the 18 19 aggregate amount appropriated to that State agency for State 20 fiscal year 2003 for the following objects: personal services, except that no transfer may be approved which reduces the 21 22 aggregate appropriations for personal services within an 23 agency; extra help; student and inmate compensation; State contributions to retirement systems; State contributions to 24 25 social security; State contributions for employee group 26 insurance; contractual services; travel; commodities;

printing; equipment; electronic data processing; operation of automotive equipment; telecommunications services; travel and allowance for committed, paroled, and discharged prisoners; library books; federal matching grants for student loans; refunds; workers' compensation, occupational disease, and tort claims; and, in appropriations to institutions of higher education, awards and grants.

8 (c-2) Special provisions for State fiscal year 2005. 9 Notwithstanding subsections (a), (a-2), and (c), for State 10 fiscal year 2005 only, transfers may be made among any line 11 item appropriations from the same or any other treasury fund 12 for any objects or purposes, without limitation, when the balance remaining in one or more such line item appropriations 13 14 is insufficient for the purpose for which the appropriation was 15 made, provided that the sum of those transfers by a State 16 agency shall not exceed 4% of the aggregate amount appropriated 17 to that State agency for fiscal year 2005.

(d) Transfers among appropriations made to agencies of the 18 19 Legislative and Judicial departments and to the 20 constitutionally elected officers in the Executive branch require the approval of the officer authorized in Section 10 of 21 22 this Act to approve and certify vouchers. Transfers among 23 appropriations made to the University of Illinois, Southern University, Chicago 24 Illinois State University, Eastern 25 Illinois University, Governors State University, Illinois 26 State University, Northeastern Illinois University, Northern

Illinois University, Western Illinois University, the Illinois
 Mathematics and Science Academy and the Board of Higher
 Education require the approval of the Board of Higher Education
 and the Governor. Transfers among appropriations to all other
 agencies require the approval of the Governor.

6 The officer responsible for approval shall certify that the 7 transfer is necessary to carry out the programs and purposes 8 for which the appropriations were made by the General Assembly 9 and shall transmit to the State Comptroller a certified copy of 10 the approval which shall set forth the specific amounts 11 transferred so that the Comptroller may change his records 12 accordingly. The Comptroller shall furnish the Governor with 13 information copies of all transfers approved for agencies of 14 Legislative and Judicial departments and transfers the 15 approved by the constitutionally elected officials of the 16 Executive branch other than the Governor, showing the amounts 17 transferred and indicating the dates such changes were entered on the Comptroller's records. 18

(e) The State Board of Education, in consultation with the
State Comptroller, may transfer line item appropriations for
General State Aid from the Common School Fund to the Education
Assistance Fund.
