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#### 3 ARTICLE 3

- Section 5. The amount of \$65,044,700, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Education Assistance Fund to the Public School Teachers' Pension and Retirement Fund of Chicago for the state's contribution for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008.
- 9 Section 10. The amount of \$10,058,000, or so much thereof 10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue 11 Fund to the Public School Teachers' Pension and Retirement 12 Fund of Chicago for the state's contribution for retirement 13 contributions under Section 17-127 of the Pension Code for 14 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008.
