 6 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
 7 the Secretary of State for any operations, alterations,

 9 the interior and exterior of the various buildings and
 10 facilities under the jurisdiction of the Office of the
 11 Secretary of State, including sidewalks, terraces, and
 12 grounds and all labor, materials, and other costs incidental
 13 to the above work:

14 From General Revenue Fund425,000

15 Section 15. The sum of \$575,000, or so much of this
 16 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
 17 Development Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State for
 18 new construction and alterations, and maintenance of the
 19 interiors and exteriors of the following facilities under the
 20 jurisdiction of the Secretary of State: Chicago West
 21 Facility, 5301 N. Lexington Ave., Chicago, Illinois 60644;
 22 Roger McAuliffe Facility, 5401 N. Elston Ave., Chicago,
 23 Illinois 60630; Charles Chew Jr. Facility, 9901 S. King

1 Drive, Chicago, Illinois 60628; and Capitol Complex buildings
2 located in Springfield Illinois.

3 Section 20. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2009, from an appropriation heretofore
6 made for such purpose in Article 17, Section 15 of Public Act
7 95-0734, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
8 to the Office of the Secretary of State for new construction
9 and alterations, and maintenance of the interiors and
10 exteriors of the following facilities under the jurisdiction
11 of the Secretary of State: Chicago West Facility, 5301 N.

21 Secretary of State.

22 Section 30. The following amounts, or so much of these

1 amounts as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated
2 to the Office of the Secretary of State for the following
3 purposes:

4 For annual equalization grants, per capita and area grants to
5 library systems, and per capita grants to public libraries,
6 under Section 8 of the Illinois Library System Act. This
7 amount is in addition to any amount otherwise appropriated to
8 the Office of the Secretary of State:

11 Section 35. The following amounts, or so much of these

 3 school libraries under Section 8.4 of the Illinois Library

19 Section 80. The sum of \$250,000, or so much of this
 20 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
 21 Revenue Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State for the
 22 Penny Severns Summer Family Literacy Grants.

1 Section 85. In addition to any other amounts appropriated
 2 for such purposes, the sum of \$1,700,000, or so much of this
 3 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
 4 Revenue Fund to the Office of Secretary of State for a grant
 5 to the Chicago Public Library.

6 Section 90. The sum of \$325,000, or so much of this
 7 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
 8 Revenue Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State for all
 9 expenditures and grants to libraries for the Project Next
 10 Generation Program.

11 Section 95. The following amount, or so much of this
 12 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
 13 the Secretary of State from the Live and Learn Fund for the
 14 purpose of promotion of organ and tissue donations:

15 From Live and Learn Fund1,750,000

16 Section 100. The sum of \$50,000, or so much of this
 17 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
 18 Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund to the Office
 19 of the Secretary of State for grants to benefit Illinois
 20 Veterans Home libraries.

1 Section 105. The amount of \$50,000, or so much of this
2 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
3 the Secretary of State from the Master Mason Fund to provide
4 grants to the Illinois Masonic Foundation for the Prevention
5 of Drug and Alcohol Abuse Among Children, Inc., a not-for-
6 profit corporation, for the purpose of providing Model
7 Student Assistance Programs in public and private schools in
8 Illinois.

9 Section 110. The amount of \$45,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
11 from the Illinois Pan Hellenic Trust Fund to provide grants
12 for charitable purposes sponsored by African-American
13 fraternities and sororities.

14 Section 115. The amount of \$25,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
16 from the Park District Youth Program Fund to provide grants
17 for the Illinois Association of Park Districts: After School
18 Programming.

19 Section 120. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of
21 State from the Illinois Route 66 Heritage Project Fund to
22 provide grants for the development of tourism, education,

1 preservation and promotion of Route 66.

2 Section 125. The sum of \$125,000, or so much of this
3 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Police
4 Memorial Committee Fund to the Office of the Secretary of
5 State for grants to the Police Memorial Committee for
6 maintaining a memorial statue, holding an annual memorial
7 commemoration, and giving scholarships to children to police
8 officers killed in the line of duty.

9 Section 130. The sum of \$120,000, or so much of this
10 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
11 Mammogram Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State for
12 grants to the Susan G. Komen Foundation for breast cancer
13 research, education, screening, and treatment.

14 Section 135. The following amounts, or so much of these
15 amounts as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated
16 to the Office of the Secretary of State for such purposes in
17 Section 3-646 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5), for
18 grants to the Regional Organ Bank of Illinois and to Mid-
19 America Transplant Services for the purpose of promotion of
20 organ and tissue donation awareness. These amounts are in
21 addition to any amounts otherwise appropriated to the Office
22 of the Secretary of State:

1 From Organ Donor Awareness Fund200,000

2 Section 140. The amount of \$500, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
4 from the Chicago and Northeast Illinois District Council of
5 Carpenters Fund to provide grants for charitable purposes.

6 Section 145. The amount of \$60,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
8 from the U.S. Marine Corps Scholarship Fund to provide grants
9 for scholarships for Higher Education.

10 Section 155. The amount of \$200,000, or so much of this
11 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the SOS
12 Federal Projects Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State
13 for the payment of any operational expenses relating to the
14 cost incident to augmenting the Illinois Commercial Motor
15 Vehicle safety program by assuring and verifying the identity
16 of drivers prior to licensure, including CDL operators; for
17 improved security for Drivers Licenses and Personal
18 Identification Cards; and any other related program deemed
19 appropriate by the Office of the Secretary of State.

20 Section 160. The amount of \$1,333,500, or so much of this
21 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of

1 the Secretary of State from the Securities Investors
2 Education Fund for any expenses used to promote public
3 awareness of the dangers of securities fraud.

4 Section 165. The amount of \$5,000, or so much of this
5 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
6 the Secretary of State from the Secretary of State Evidence
7 Fund for the purchase of evidence, for the employment of
8 persons to obtain evidence, and for the payment for any goods
9 or services related to obtaining evidence.

10 Section 170. The amount of \$225,000, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Alternate Fuels
12 Fund to the Office of Secretary of State for the cost of
13 administering the Alternate Fuels Act.

14 Section 175. The amount of \$17,003,300, or so much of
15 this amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
16 Secretary of State Special Services Fund to the Office of the
17 Secretary of State for office automation and technology.

18 Section 180. The amount of \$17,000,000, or so much of
19 this amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
20 Motor Vehicle License Plate Fund to the Office of the
21 Secretary of State for the cost incident to providing new or

1 replacement plates for motor vehicles.

2 Section 185. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much of this
3 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
4 Secretary of State DUI Administration Fund to the Office of
5 Secretary of State for operation of the Department of
6 Administrative Hearings of the Office of Secretary of State
7 and for no other purpose.

8 Section 190. The amount of \$30,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Secretary of State
10 Police DUI Fund to the Secretary of State for the payments of
11 goods and services that will assist in the prevention of
12 alcohol-related criminal violence throughout the State.

13 Section 195. The amount of \$60,000 is appropriated from
14 the Secretary of State Police Services Fund to the Secretary
15 of State for purposes as indicated by the grantor or
16 contractor or, in the case of money bequeathed or granted for
17 no specific purpose, for any purpose as deemed appropriate by
18 the Director of Police, Secretary of State in administering
19 the responsibilities of the Secretary of State Department of
20 Police.

21 Section 200. The amount of \$500,000, or so much of this

1 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Office
 2 of the Secretary of State Grant Fund to the Office of the
 3 Secretary of State to be expended in accordance with the
 4 terms and conditions upon which such funds were received.

5 Section 205. The amount of \$12,000, or so much of this
 6 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
 7 the Secretary of State from the State Library Fund to
 8 increase the collection of books, records, and holdings; to
 9 hold public forums; to purchase equipment and resource
 10 materials for the State Library; and for the upkeep, repair,
 11 and maintenance of the State Library building and grounds.

12 Section 210. The following amount, or so much of this
 13 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
 14 the Secretary of State for any operations, alterations,
 15 rehabilitation, new construction, and maintenance of the
 16 interior and exterior of the various buildings and facilities
 17 under the jurisdiction of the Secretary of State to enhance
 18 security measures in the Capitol Complex:

19 From the General Revenue Fund3,500,000

20 Section 220. The amount of \$9,500,000, or so much of
 21 that amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
 22 Secretary of State Identification Security and Theft

1 Prevention Fund to the Office of Secretary of State for all
2 costs related to implementing identification security and
3 theft prevention measures.

4 Section 235. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much of this
5 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
6 Monitoring Device Driving Permit Administration Fee Fund to
7 the Office of the Secretary of State for all Secretary of
8 State costs associated with administering Monitoring Device
9 Driving Permits per Public Act 95-0400.

10 Section 240. The sum of \$500,000, or so much of this
11 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Indigent
12 BAIID Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State to
13 reimburse ignition interlock device providers per Public Act
14 95-0400.

15 Section 250. The amount of \$10,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
17 from the Illinois Professional Golfers Association Junior
18 Golf Fund for grants to the Illinois Professional Golfers
19 Association Foundation to help Association members expose
20 Illinois youngsters to the game of golf.
