- WHEREAS, She was born on August 28, 1938, in Memphis,
 Tennessee, to Clarence and Mattie Mae Smith; she was baptized
 at an early age; she attended White Station Grammar School and
 graduated from Manassas High School in Memphis; and
 - WHEREAS, She moved to Chicago and met her husband, Quentin Puckett; she attended Marion Business College and earned a degree in Medical Assistance; she earned an Associate of Arts degree from Olive Harvey College; she completed courses in Sociology and Psychology at Chicago State University; she held certificated in nutrition, food service, and sanitation from Olive Harvey College; she was a licensed beautician and pursued Cosmetology; through home study, she also obtained credentials in Physical Therapy; and
- 19 WHEREAS, She was a community liaison for All Chicago Focus
 20 Newspaper, and one of the pioneers who helped elect Harold
 21 Washington as Chicago's first black Mayor; she worked

 she was a member of the Power Circle Congregation, where she
 also participated in the Writer's Guild and Praise Dance
 Ministry; she was a member of Quaker House and Brothers of the
 Elderly; she was known for her diligent service and longtime
 membership in the TAGers, an organization working on behalf of
 Chicago State University; she was a member and volunteer at
 Operation PUSH and a member of the Creation and Conservation of

 - WHEREAS, She was devoted to community improvement and was an advocate for seniors; she worked with the Chicago Department on Aging and Disability; she started a Grand Parents Group dedicated to lighten the load of caring for grandchildren; she was active in the Girl Scouts of Chicago, a volunteer and supporter of the Meatchem Youth Center, and held office in the United Black Youth Council of America; and
 - WHEREAS, She was the co-host the radio talk show "Consumer Eye,"; she spoke on many occasions to groups; she started her company, Mattie's Caring Hands, a full-scale maid and maintenance service; she founded Universal Networking Consultants in 1982; she established the Think Tank Ministry and the College Care Package Program; she also taught arts and crafts while working as an assistant teacher at the St. Carthage Day Care and Woodlawn Day Care Centers; and
