SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Make supplemental appropriations to the FY 09 budget of the State Board of Education

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A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. Public Act 95-734, as vetoed, reduced, and
5 restored, is amended by changing Section 10 of Article 7 as
6 follows:

7 (P.A. 95-734, Art. 7, Sec. 10)

8 Sec. 10. The following amounts or so much thereof as may
9 be necessary, which shall be used by the Illinois State Board
10 of Education exclusively for the foregoing purposes and not,
11 under any circumstances, for personal services expenditures
12 or other operational or administrative costs, are
13 appropriated to the Illinois State Board of Education for the
14 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008:
