

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

6 Section 5. The amount of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal
8 Development Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
9 Economic Opportunity to the owner of a generating station
10 located in Williamson County, Illinois using Illinois coal to
11 generate electricity for rural Southern Illinois communities
12 for the purposes specified in the Illinois Coal and Energy
13 Development Bond Act and Section 8.1 of the Energy
14 Conservation and Coal Development Bond Act.

15 Section 10. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal
17 Development Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
18 Economic Opportunity to the owner of a generating station
19 located in Sangamon County, Illinois using Illinois coal to
20 generate electricity for the purposes specified in the
21 Illinois Coal and Energy Development Bond Act and Section 8.1

1 of the Energy Conservation and Coal Development Bond Act.

2 Section 15. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal
4 Development Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
5 Economic Opportunity to the owner of a generating station
6 located in Washington County, Illinois using Illinois coal to
7 generate electricity for the purposes specified in the
8 Illinois Coal and Energy Development Bond Act and Section 8.1
9 of the Energy Conservation and Coal Development Bond Act.

10 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
11 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
12 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
13 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
14 Governor.

15 ARTICLE 2

16 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

17 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
18 thereof as may be necessary are appropriated to the
19 Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and
20 capital improvements including construction, reconstruction,
21 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,

1 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services
2 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

3 Payable from Agricultural Premium Fund:

4 For various projects at the State

5 Fairgrounds600,000

6 For various projects at the DuQuoin State

7 Fairgrounds250,000

8 Total \$850,000

9 Section 10. The amount of \$8,000,000, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Partners for
11 Conservation Projects Fund to the Department of Agriculture
12 for the Conservation Practices Cost-Share program.

13 ARTICLE 3

14 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

15 GRANTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS - GENERAL OFFICE

16 Section 10. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
18 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
19 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
20 units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of
21 boat access areas.

1 Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
3 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes
4 of the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
5 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
6 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
7 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
8 areas.

9 Section 20. To the extent federal funds including
10 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
11 \$3,175,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
12 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
13 Department of Natural Resources for all costs for
14 construction and development of facilities for transient,
15 non-trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such
16 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure
17 Grant Program.

18 Section 25. The sum of \$150,000, new appropriation, is
19 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
20 Department of Natural Resources for a grant to the Chain
21 O'Lakes - Fox River Waterway Management Agency for the
22 Agency's operational expenses.

1 Section 30. The following named sums, new appropriations,
 2 or so much thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the
 3 objects and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to
 4 the Department of Natural Resources:

5 Payable from State Boating Act Fund:

6 For multiple use facilities and programs
 7 for boating purposes provided by the
 8 Department of Natural Resources,
 9 Including construction and development,
 10 all costs for supplies, materials,
 11 labor, land acquisition, services, studies
 12 and all other expenses required to comply
 13 with the intent of this appropriation1,500,000

14 Payable from State Parks Fund:

15 For multiple use facilities and programs
 16 for park and trail purposes provided by
 17 the Department of Natural Resources, including
 18 construction and development, all costs
 19 for supplies, materials, labor, land
 20 acquisition, services, studies, and
 21 all other expenses required to comply with
 22 the intent of this appropriation150,000

23 Section 35. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
 24 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish

1 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for acquisition
 2 and development, including grants, for the implementation of
 3 the North American Waterfowl Management Plan within the
 4 Dominion of Canada or the United States which specifically
 5 provides waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway.

6 Section 40. To the extent federal funds including
 7 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
 8 \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
 9 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the
 10 Department of Natural Resources for construction and
 11 renovation of waste reception facilities for recreational
 12 boaters, including grants for such purposes authorized under
 13 the Clean Vessel Act.

14 Section 50. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 15 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 16 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 17 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
 18 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 19 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 20 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 21 refunds and the purposes stated:

22 Payable from Forest Reserve Fund:

23 For U.S. Forest Service Program500,000

1 Section 55. The sum of \$110,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Plugging and
3 Restoration Fund to the Department of Natural Resources,
4 Office of Mines and Minerals for the Landowner Grant Program
5 authorized under the Oil and Gas Act, as amended by Public
6 Act 90-0260.

7 Section 60. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
9 Natural Resources from the Abandoned Mined Lands Set Aside
10 Fund for grants and contracts to conduct research, planning
11 and construction to eliminate hazards created by abandoned
12 mines and any other expenses necessary for emergency
13 response.

14 Section 65. The sum of \$110,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
16 Natural Resources from the State Furbearer Fund for the
17 conservation of fur bearing mammals in accordance with the
18 provisions of Section 5/1.32 of the "Wildlife Code", as now
19 or hereafter amended.

20 Section 70. The following named sums, new appropriations,
21 or so much thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the

1 objects and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to
2 the Department of Natural Resources:

3 Payable from Natural Areas Acquisition Fund:

4 For the acquisition, preservation and
5 stewardship of natural areas, including habitats
6 for endangered and threatened species, high
7 quality natural communities, wetlands
8 and other areas with unique or unusual
9 natural heritage qualities1,000,000

10 Section 75. The sum of \$11,000,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Open Space Lands
12 Acquisition and Development Fund to the Department of Natural
13 Resources for expenses connected with and to make grants to
14 local governments and to distressed communities as provided
15 in the "Open Space Lands Acquisition and Development Act".

16 Section 80. The sum of \$550,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Pheasant
18 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
19 conservation of pheasants in accordance with the provisions
20 of Section 5/1.31 of the "Wildlife Code", as now or hereafter
21 amended.

22 FOR ILLINOIS HABITAT FUND PROGRAM

1 Section 85. The sum of \$1,350,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
3 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
4 preservation and maintenance of high quality habitat lands in
5 accordance with the provisions of the "Habitat Endowment
6 Act", as now or hereafter amended.

7 Section 90. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
9 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
10 preservation and maintenance of a high quality fish and
11 wildlife habitat and to promote the heritage of outdoor
12 sports in Illinois from revenue derived from the sale of
13 Sportsmen Series license plates.

14 Section 95. The sum of \$900,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
16 Natural Resources for expenditure by the Office of Water
17 Resources from the Flood Control Land Lease Fund for
18 disbursement of monies received pursuant to Act of Congress
19 dated September 3, 1954 (68 Statutes 1266, same as appears in
20 Section 701c-3, Title 33, United States Code Annotated),
21 provided such disbursement shall be in compliance with 15
22 ILCS 515/1 Illinois Compiled Statutes.

1 Section 100. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 2 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 3 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 4 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
 5 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 6 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 7 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 8 refunds and the purposes stated:

9 Payable from Land and Water Recreation Fund:

10 For Outdoor Recreation Programs2,500,000

11 Section 105. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as
 12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Off-Highway
 13 Vehicle Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
 14 for grants to units of local governments, not-for-profit
 15 organizations, and other groups to operate, maintain and
 16 acquire land for off-highway vehicle trails and parks as
 17 provided for in the Recreational Trails of Illinois Act,
 18 including administration, enforcement, planning and
 19 implementation of this Act.

20 Section 110. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 21 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 22 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 23 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or

1 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 2 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 3 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 4 refunds and the purposes stated:

5 Payable from Federal Title IV Fire
 6 Protection Assistance Fund:
 7 For Rural Community Fire Protection
 8 Programs325,000

9 Section 115. The sum of \$80,000, or so much thereof as
 10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail
 11 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 12 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit
 13 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction,
 14 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and
 15 areas for the use of snowmobiles.

16 Section 120. The sum of \$625,000, or so much thereof as
 17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
 18 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 19 the payment of grants to timber growers for implementation of
 20 acceptable forestry management practices as provided in the
 21 "Illinois Forestry Development Act" as now or hereafter
 22 amended.

1 Section 125. To the extent Federal Funds including
2 reimbursements are made available for such purposes, the sum
3 of \$300,000, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
4 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
5 Forest Stewardship Technical Assistance.

6 Section 130. The sum of \$160,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
8 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
9 for the payment of grants for the implementation of the North
10 American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of
11 Canada or the United States which specifically provides
12 waterfowl to the Mississippi Flyway as provided in the
13 "Wildlife Code", as amended.

14 Section 135. The sum of \$160,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
16 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
17 for the payment of grants for the development of waterfowl
18 propagation areas within the Dominion of Canada or the United
19 States which specifically provide waterfowl for the
20 Mississippi Flyway as provided in the "Wildlife Code", as
21 amended.

22 Section 140. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
2 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
3 for the purpose of attracting waterfowl and improving public
4 migratory waterfowl areas within the State.

5 Section 145. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
7 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
8 grants to units of local government for the acquisition and
9 development of bike paths.

10 Section 150. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
12 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
13 land acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths
14 and all other related expenses connected with the
15 acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths.

16 Section 155. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
18 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
19 the development and maintenance, and other related expenses
20 of recreational trails and trail-related projects authorized
21 under the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of
22 1991, provided such amount shall not exceed funds to be made

1 available for such purposes from State or federal sources.

2 Section 160. The following named sum, new appropriation,
3 or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the object and
4 purpose hereinafter named, is appropriated to the Department
5 of Natural Resources:

6 Payable from the Park and Conservation Fund:

7 For multiple use facilities and programs
8 for park and trail purposes provided by
9 the Department of Natural Resources, including
10 construction and development, all costs
11 for supplies, materials, labor, land
12 acquisition, services, studies, and
13 all other expenses required to comply with
14 the intent of this appropriation1,000,000

15 Section 165. The following named sums, new
16 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
17 respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named,
18 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources:

19 Payable from the Adeline Jay Geo-Karis

20 Illinois Beach Marina Fund:

21 For rehabilitation, reconstruction, repair,
22 replacing, fixed assets, and improvement
23 of facilities at North Point Marina at

1 Winthrop Harbor375,000

2 Section 170. The sum of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
4 Natural Resources from the Abandoned Mined Lands Reclamation
5 Council Federal Trust Fund for grants and contracts to
6 conduct research, planning and construction to eliminate
7 hazards created by abandoned mines, and any other expenses
8 necessary for emergency response.

9 Section 175. No contract shall be entered into or
10 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from
11 appropriations herein made in Sections 100, 175, 180, 195,
12 200 and 205 of this Article until after the purpose and
13 amount of such expenditure has been approved in writing by
14 the Governor.

15 Total, this Article \$170,215,000

16 ARTICLE 4

17 ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY

18 Section 5. The sum of \$330,000,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Water Revolving
20 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for financial
21 assistance to units of local government for sewer systems and

1 wastewater treatment facilities pursuant to rules defining
2 the Water Pollution Control Revolving Loan program and for
3 transfer of funds to establish reserve accounts, construction
4 accounts or any other necessary funds or accounts in order to
5 implement a leveraged loan program.

6 Section 10. The sum of \$110,000,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Water Revolving
8 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for financial
9 assistance to units of local government and privately owned
10 community water supplies for drinking water infrastructure
11 projects pursuant to the Safe Drinking Water Act, as amended,
12 and for transfer of funds to establish reserve accounts,
13 construction accounts or any other necessary funds or
14 accounts in order to implement a leveraged program.

15 Section 15. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Water Revolving
17 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for a green
18 infrastructure financial assistance program to address water
19 quality issues.

20 Section 20. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Water Revolving
22 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for a small

1 community water supply financial assistance program to
2 address compliance problems.

3 Section 25. No contract shall be entered into or
4 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
5 in Section 1 of this Article until after the purposes and
6 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

7 Total, this Article \$447,000,000

8 ARTICLE 5

9 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

10 Section 237. The sum of \$5,000,002, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation
12 Bond Series B Fund to the Department of Transportation to
13 extend the metrolink rail-line to Mid-America Airport,
14 including but not limited to, general infrastructure
15 improvements authorized under Section 2705-305 of the
16 Department of Transportation Law (20 ILCS 2705/2705-305) such
17 as parking lot infrastructure upgrades, pedestrian access
18 improvements, ingress and egress infrastructure and
19 construction of a pedestrian overpass at the Southwestern
20 Illinois College metrolink station.

21 ARTICLE 6

1 Section 5. In addition to other amounts appropriated for
 2 this purpose, the sum of \$180,000, or so much thereof as may
 3 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
 4 to the Architect of the Capitol to meet its operational
 5 expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011.

6 Section 10. In addition to other amounts appropriated
 7 for this purpose, the following named sum, or so much thereof
