Section 5. 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Section 10. Section 15. Section 20. No contract shall be entered into obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY

Section 5.
