# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

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5 ARTICLE 1

Section 5. The sum of \$3,000,000, new appropriation, is 6 appropriated, and the sum of \$15,244,372, or so much thereof 7 as may be necessary and as remains unexpended at the close of 8 business on June 30, 2009, from appropriations heretofore 9 made in Article 30, Section 5 of Public Act 95-731, are 10 reappropriated from the Partners for Conservation Fund to the 11 Resources for the 12 Department of Natural Partners for 13 Conservation Program to implement ecosystem-based management for Illinois' natural resources. 14

Section 10. The sum of \$2,473,300, new appropriation, is appropriated from the Partners for Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for expenses of the Partners for Conservation Program.

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#### ILLINOIS RIVER INITIATIVES

The sum of \$250,000, new appropriation, is Section 55. appropriated and the sum of \$132,977, or so much thereof as 5 6 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2008 from appropriations heretofore made 7 in Article 30, Section 55 of Public Act 95-731, as amended, 8 are appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the 9 10 Department of Natural Resources for the non-federal cost 11 share of a Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program to 12 establish long-term contracts and permanent conservation 13 easements in the Illinois River Basin; to fund cost share assistance to landowners to encourage approved conservation 14 practices in environmentally sensitive and highly erodible 15 16 areas of the Illinois River Basin; and to fund the monitoring 17 of long-term improvements of these conservation practices as 18 required in the Memorandum of Agreement between the State of Illinois and the United States Department of Agriculture. 19
