

1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**  
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The University of Illinois Act is amended by  
5 changing Section 25 as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 305/25)

7 Sec. 25. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section  
8 applies only to those students who first enroll after the  
9 2003-2004 academic year. For 4 continuous academic years  
10 following initial enrollment (or for undergraduate programs  
11 that require more than 4 years to complete, for the normal time  
12 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the  
13 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois  
14 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was  
15 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.  
16 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,  
17 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the  
18 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to  
19 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An  
20 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has  
21 for 4 continuous academic years been charged no more than the  
22 tuition amount that he or she was charged at the time he or she  
23 first enrolled in the University shall be charged tuition not

1 to exceed the amount the University charged students who first  
2 enrolled in the University for the academic year following the  
3 academic year the student first enrolled in the University for  
4 a maximum of 2 additional continuous academic years.

6 Section 10. The Southern Illinois University Management  
7 Act is amended by changing Section 15 as follows:

8 (110 ILCS 520/15)

9 Sec. 15. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section  
10 applies only to those students who first enroll after the  
11 2003-2004 academic year. For 4 continuous academic years  
12 following initial enrollment (or for undergraduate programs  
13 that require more than 4 years to complete, for the normal time  
14 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the  
15 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois  
16 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was  
17 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.  
18 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,  
19 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the  
20 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to  
21 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An  
22 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has  
23 for 4 continuous academic years been charged no more than the  
24 tuition amount that he or she was charged at the time he or she

1 first enrolled in the University shall be charged tuition not  
2 to exceed the amount the University charged students who first  
3 enrolled in the University for the academic year following the  
4 academic year the student first enrolled in the University for  
5 a maximum of 2 additional continuous academic years.

7 Section 15. The Chicago State University Law is amended by  
8 changing Section 5-120 as follows:

9 (110 ILCS 660/5-120)

10 Sec. 5-120. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section  
11 applies only to those students who first enroll after the  
12 2003-2004 academic year. For 4 continuous academic years  
13 following initial enrollment (or for undergraduate programs  
14 that require more than 4 years to complete, for the normal time  
15 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the  
16 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois  
17 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was  
18 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.  
19 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,  
20 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the  
21 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to  
22 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An  
23 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has  
24 for 4 continuous academic years been charged no more than the

1 tuition amount that he or she was charged at the time he or she  
2 first enrolled in the University shall be charged tuition not  
3 to exceed the amount the University charged students who first  
4 enrolled in the University for the academic year following the  
5 academic year the student first enrolled in the University for  
6 a maximum of 2 additional continuous academic years.

8 Section 20. The Eastern Illinois University Law is amended  
9 by changing Section 10-120 as follows:

10 (110 ILCS 665/10-120)

11 Sec. 10-120. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section  
12 applies only to those students who first enroll after the  
13 2003-2004 academic year. For 4 continuous academic years  
14 following initial enrollment (or for undergraduate programs  
15 that require more than 4 years to complete, for the normal time  
16 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the  
17 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois  
18 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was  
19 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.  
20 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,  
21 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the  
22 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to  
23 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An  
24 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has

1 for 4 continuous academic years been charged no more than the  
2 tuition amount that he or she was charged at the time he or she  
3 first enrolled in the University shall be charged tuition not  
4 to exceed the amount the University charged students who first  
5 enrolled in the University for the academic year following the  
6 academic year the student first enrolled in the University for  
7 a maximum of 2 additional continuous academic years.

9 Section 25. The Governors State University Law is amended  
10 by changing Section 15-120 as follows:

11 (110 ILCS 670/15-120)

12 Sec. 15-120. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section  
13 applies only to those students who first enroll after the  
14 2003-2004 academic year. For 4 continuous academic years  
15 following initial enrollment (or for undergraduate programs  
16 that require more than 4 years to complete, for the normal time  
17 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the  
18 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois  
19 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was  
20 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.  
21 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,  
22 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the  
23 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to  
24 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An

1 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has  
2 for 4 continuous academic years been charged no more than the  
3 tuition amount that he or she was charged at the time he or she  
4 first enrolled in the University shall be charged tuition not  
5 to exceed the amount the University charged students who first  
6 enrolled in the University for the academic year following the  
7 academic year the student first enrolled in the University for  
8 a maximum of 2 additional continuous academic years.

10 Section 30. The Illinois State University Law is amended by  
11 changing Section 20-125 as follows:

12 (110 ILCS 675/20-125)

13 Sec. 20-125. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section  
14 applies only to those students who first enroll after the  
15 2003-2004 academic year. For 4 continuous academic years  
16 following initial enrollment (or for undergraduate programs  
17 that require more than 4 years to complete, for the normal time  
18 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the  
19 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois  
20 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was  
21 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.  
22 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,  
23 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the  
24 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to

1 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An  
2 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has  
3 for 4 continuous academic years been charged no more than the  
4 tuition amount that he or she was charged at the time he or she  
5 first enrolled in the University shall be charged tuition not  
6 to exceed the amount the University charged students who first  
7 enrolled in the University for the academic year following the  
8 academic year the student first enrolled in the University for  
9 a maximum of 2 additional continuous academic years.

11 Section 35. The Northeastern Illinois University Law is  
12 amended by changing Section 25-120 as follows:

13 (110 ILCS 680/25-120)

14 Sec. 25-120. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section  
15 applies only to those students who first enroll after the  
16 2003-2004 academic year. For 4 continuous academic years  
17 following initial enrollment (or for undergraduate programs  
18 that require more than 4 years to complete, for the normal time  
19 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the  
20 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois  
21 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was  
22 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.  
23 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,  
24 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the

1 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to  
2 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An  
3 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has  
4 for 4 continuous academic years been charged no more than the  
5 tuition amount that he or she was charged at the time he or she  
6 first enrolled in the University shall be charged tuition not  
7 to exceed the amount the University charged students who first  
8 enrolled in the University for the academic year following the  
9 academic year the student first enrolled in the University for  
10 a maximum of 2 additional continuous academic years.

12 Section 40. The Northern Illinois University Law is amended  
13 by changing Section 30-130 as follows:

14 (110 ILCS 685/30-130)

15 Sec. 30-130. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section  
16 applies only to those students who first enroll after the  
17 2003-2004 academic year. For 4 continuous academic years  
18 following initial enrollment (or for undergraduate programs  
19 that require more than 4 years to complete, for the normal time  
20 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the  
21 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois  
22 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was  
23 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.  
24 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,



1 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the  
2 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to  
3 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An  
4 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has  
5 for 4 continuous academic years been charged no more than the  
6 tuition amount that he or she was charged at the time he or she  
7 first enrolled in the University shall be charged tuition not  
8 to exceed the amount the University charged students who first  
9 enrolled in the University for the academic year following the  
10 academic year the student first enrolled in the University for  
11 a maximum of 2 additional continuous academic years.

13 Section 45. The Western Illinois University Law is amended  
14 by changing Section 35-125 as follows:

15 (110 ILCS 690/35-125)

16 Sec. 35-125. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section  
17 applies only to those students who first enroll after the  
18 2003-2004 academic year. For 4 continuous academic years  
19 following initial enrollment (or for undergraduate programs  
20 that require more than 4 years to complete, for the normal time  
21 to complete the program, as determined by the University), the  
22 tuition charged an undergraduate student who is an Illinois  
23 resident shall not exceed the amount that the student was  
24 charged at the time he or she first enrolled in the University.

1 However, if the student changes majors during this time period,  
2 the tuition charged the student shall equal the amount the  
3 student would have been charged had he or she been admitted to  
4 the changed major when he or she first enrolled. An  
5 undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident and who has  
6 for 4 continuous academic years been charged no more than the  
7 tuition amount that he or she was charged at the time he or she  
8 first enrolled in the University shall be charged tuition not  
9 to exceed the amount the University charged students who first  
10 enrolled in the University for the academic year following the  
11 academic year the student first enrolled in the University for  
12 a maximum of 2 additional continuous academic years.
