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AN ACT concerning public health.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Food Handling Regulation Enforcement Act is
amended by changing Section 3 as follows:

6 (410 ILCS 625/3) (from Ch. 56 1/2, par. 333)

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Sec. 3. Food service sanitation manager.

8 <u>(a)</u> Each food service establishment shall be under the 9 operational supervision of a certified food service sanitation 10 manager in accordance with rules promulgated under this Act.

(b) By July 1, 1990, the Director of the Department of 11 Public Health in accordance with this Act, shall promulgate 12 13 rules for the education, examination, and certification of food 14 service establishment managers and instructors of the food service sanitation manager certification education programs. A 15 16 food service sanitation manager certificate and a food service 17 sanitation manager instructor certificate shall be valid for 5 years, unless revoked by the Department of Public Health, and 18 19 shall not be transferable from the individual to whom it was 20 issued. Recertification shall be accomplished by presenting 21 evidence of ongoing food safety and food sanitation education 22 or re-examination, in compliance with rules promulgated by the Director. Existing certificates shall expire on the printed 23

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expiration date or 5 years from the effective date of this
 amendatory Act of 1989.

3 Any individual may elect to take the Department of Public 4 Health food service sanitation manager certification 5 examination or take an accredited certification examination 6 administered by a testing authority previously approved by the 7 Department. The Department shall charge a fee of \$35 for each 8 new and renewed food service sanitation manager certificate and 9 \$10 for each replacement certificate. All fees collected under 10 this Section shall be deposited into the Food and Drug Safety 11 Fund.

Any fee received by the Department under this Section that is submitted for the renewal of an expired food service sanitation manager certificate may be returned by the Director after recording the receipt of the fee and the reason for its return.

17 (c) Beginning July 1, 2011, any individual seeking initial 18 certification shall be required to complete a minimum of 7 19 hours of certification training approved by the Department and 20 successfully pass a certification examination pursuant to 21 subsection (b) of this Section.

(d) Beginning July 1, 2011, any individual who has a current valid food service sanitation manager certification from another state where that state required the individual to successfully pass a food service sanitation manager accredited certification examination in order to obtain the certification SB3377 Engrossed - 3 - LRB096 16678 RPM 31962 b

1 shall be issued an Illinois food service sanitation manager 2 certification upon proof of residency in the state where 3 certification was issued, application, and payment of the fee 4 established in subsection (b) of this Section.

5 (e) For the purposes of this Section:
6 "Accredited certification examination" means a food
7 protection certification examination that meets the
8 criteria established by the Conference for Food
9 Protection, or its successor, as determined by an
10 accrediting organization.

11 <u>"Accrediting organization" means an independent</u> 12 <u>organization, such as the American National Standards</u> 13 <u>Institute, that determines whether a food protection</u> 14 <u>certification examination meets the standards established</u> 15 <u>by the Conference for Food Protection or its successor.</u> 16 (Source: P.A. 89-641, eff. 8-9-96.)
