WHEREAS, Joseph Anlauf graduated from Fenwick High School in Oak Park and attended Providence College in Providence, Rhode Island, on scholarship before enlisting in the United States Navy; and

WHEREAS, Joseph Anlauf served with distinction as a member of the United States Navy in World War II from July 1943 to June 1946; as a member of UDT 18, he received the Bronze Star for operations in Balikpapan, Borneo; and

WHEREAS, Joseph Anlauf began his career in consumer electronics with the Philco Corporation; he ended his career 50 years later as the National Executive Director of the Associated Volume Buyers (AVB); and

1 WHEREAS, Joseph Anlauf was named Humanitarian of the Year
2 by the City of Hope in 1988; he devoted his life to Catholic
3 programs and services and was a long-time member of the St.
4 Lawrence Martyr Catholic Church; and

6 lived in California, he continued to support the Chicago sports
7 teams and the University of Notre Dame football team; he also
8 enjoyed March Madness and the various Bowl games; and
