

97TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2011 and 2012 HB0202

Introduced 01/18/11, by Rep. Angelo Saviano

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 3955/4 20 ILCS 3955/14 from Ch. 91 1/2, par. 704 from Ch. 91 1/2, par. 714

Amends the Guardianship and Advocacy Act. Provides that a simple majority of the members serving on the Guardianship and Advocacy Commission shall constitute a quorum (now, 6 members constitute a quorum). Adds that a member of the Commission shall serve for a term ending on June 30 and until his or her successor is appointed and has qualified or until the member resigns and the resignation is filed with the Secretary of State. Provides that a simple majority of the members serving on a regional human rights authority shall constitute a quorum (now, 5 members constitute a quorum). Effective immediately.

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1 AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Guardianship and Advocacy Act is amended by changing Sections 4 and 14 as follows:
- 6 (20 ILCS 3955/4) (from Ch. 91 1/2, par. 704)
- 7 Sec. 4. <u>Commission; membership; term of office.</u>
- 8 (a) The Commission shall consist of 11 members, one of whom
 9 shall be a senior citizen age 60 or over, who shall be
 10 appointed by the Governor, taking into account the requirements
 11 of State and federal statutes, with the advice and consent of
 12 the Senate.
 - All appointments shall be filed with the Secretary of State by the appointing authority.
- (b) The terms of the original members shall be 3 one year 15 terms, 3 two year terms, and 3 three year terms, all terms to 16 17 continue until a successor is appointed and qualified. The length of the terms of the original members shall be drawn by 18 19 lot of the first meeting held by the Commission. The members first appointed under this amendatory Act of 1984 shall serve 20 21 for a term of 3 years. Thereafter all terms shall be for 3 22 years, with each member serving no more than 2 consecutive terms. Vacancies in the membership are to be filled in the same 23

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- 1 as original appointments. Appointments to fill manner 2 vacancies occurring before the expiration of a term are for the remainder of the unexpired term. A member of the Commission 3 shall serve for a term ending on June 30 and until his or her 4 5 successor is appointed and has qualified or until the member resigns and the resignation is filed with the Secretary of 6 7 State.
 - (c) The Commission shall annually elect a Chairman and any other officers it deems necessary. The Commission shall meet at least once every 3 months with the times and places of meetings determined by the Chairman. Additional meetings may be called by the Chairman upon written notice 7 days before the meeting or by written petition of 5 members to the Chairman. A simple majority of the members serving on Six members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum.
 - (d) Members of the Commission are not entitled to compensation but shall receive reimbursement for actual expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

- Sec. 14. Regional authorities; membership; term of office.

 Each regional authority shall consist of the 9 members

 appointed by the Director, in accordance with this Section.

 Each regional authority shall include insofar as possible one

 professionally knowledgeable and broadly experienced employee

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or officer of a provider of each of the following services: mental health, developmental disabilities, and vocational rehabilitation. No other employee or officer of a service provider shall be appointed to a regional authority. In making Director appointments, the shall strive representation of minority groups and of eligible persons, and shall give due consideration to recommendations of persons and groups assisting eligible persons. The Director may remove for incompetence, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office any member of a regional authority. All actions taken by the Director to appoint or remove members shall be reported to the Commission at the next scheduled Commission meeting.

Each regional authority shall annually elect a chairman and any other officers it deems necessary. Members of the regional authorities shall serve for a term of 3 years, except that the terms of the first appointees shall be as follows: 3 members serving for a 1 year term; 3 members serving for a 2 year term; and 3 members serving for a 3 year term. Assignment of terms of such first appointees shall be by lot. No member shall serve for more than 2 consecutive 3 year terms. A simple majority of the members serving on a regional authority Five members shall constitute a quorum.

Vacancies in the regional authorities shall be filled in the same manner as original appointments.

Members of the regional authorities shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for actual expenses

- 2 Each regional authority shall meet not less than once every
- 3 2 months. Meetings may also be held upon call of the Regional
- 4 Chairman or upon written request of a simple majority of the
- 5 members serving on any 5 members of the regional authority.
