1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 1239

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 1239 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Sections
5 10-20.53 and 34-18.45 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/10-20.53 new)

7 Sec. 10-20.53. Prohibition on industrially produced trans
8 fat.

9 (a) For purposes of this Section:

10 "Food containing industrially produced trans fat" means a
11 food that contains vegetable shortening, margarine, or any kind
12 of partially hydrogenated vegetable oil, unless the
13 manufacturer's documentation or the label required on the food,
14 pursuant to applicable federal laws and regulations, lists the
15 trans fat content as zero grams of trans fat per serving.

16 "School food service establishment" means a place that

1 regularly sells or serves a food item or meal on a school
2 campus.

3 (b) Each school district must not make available food
4 containing industrially produced trans fat or use food
5 containing industrially produced trans fat in the preparation
6 of a food item served to students from any source, including,
7 but not limited to, school stores, school vending machines,
8 school cafeterias, school food service establishments, and
9 fundraising activities on school premises.

10 (c) Subsection (b) of this Section applies to all food and
11 beverages sold on school grounds during the regular and
12 extended school day. The extended school day shall include
13 activities such as clubs, yearbook, band and choir practice,
14 student government, drama, and childcare and latchkey
15 programs.

16 (d) This Section does not apply to food provided through a
17 United States Department of Agriculture meal program. This
18 Section does not apply to activities or programs organized and
19 supervised by a private or not-for-profit organization on
20 school premises.

22 Sec. 34-18.45. Prohibition on industrially produced trans
23 fat.

24 (a) For purposes of this Section:

25 "Food containing industrially produced trans fat" means a

1 food that contains vegetable shortening, margarine, or any kind
2 of partially hydrogenated vegetable oil, unless the
3 manufacturer's documentation or the label required on the food,
4 pursuant to applicable federal laws and regulations, lists the
5 trans fat content as zero grams of trans fat per serving.

8 campus.

9 (b) The school district must not make available food
