2	(a) The Department shall study the issue of insurance
3	claims for medical services submitted by nonparticipating
4	facility-based physicians and providers addressed in Section
5	356z.3a of the Illinois Insurance Code as added by Public Act
6	96-1523. The Department shall have the authority to request
7	insurers, health plans, and applicable nonparticipating
8	facility-based physician and provider trade associations to
9	assemble and submit information needed for the purposes of this
10	study.
11	(b) The Department shall report its findings and
12	recommendations to the General Assembly no later than November
13	<u>1, 2011.</u>
14	Section 15. The Illinois Insurance Code is amended by
15	adding Section 356z.3b as follows:
16	(215 ILCS 5/356z.3b new)
17	Sec. 356z.3b. Facility-based physicians and providers;
18	reimbursement rate. From June 1, 2011 to December 31, 2011,
19	facility-based physicians and providers shall be reimbursed at
20	the highest contract reimbursement rate for the same services
21	in the same geographic area by an insurer or a health plan for
22	claims for medical services submitted for the services
23	addressed in Section 356z.3a of the Illinois Insurance Code as
24	added by Public Act 96-1523.
