1 court of the county in which such private employer circuit. maintains a place of business, or of the county where such 2 State employee performs most of his duties, has power, upon the 3 4 filing of a complaint by the person entitled to the benefits of 5 this Act, to specifically require such employer to comply with 6 this Act and to compensate such person for any loss of wages or benefits suffered by reason of such employer's unlawful action, 7 together with reasonable attorney's fees and costs. No fees or 8 9 court costs shall be taxed against any person applying for the 10 benefits of this Act. The court shall, in its sound discretion, give preference 11 to the hearing and disposition of such cases over other matters 12 13 then pending before it. The Attorney 16 General shall establish and maintain a statewide list of 17 employers who have been convicted of violating this Act. The 18 19 Attorney General shall make the information in the list available to the public on its official web site and by any 20 21 other means the Attorney General deems appropriate.

22 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 23 becoming law.".
