A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

6 Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of this
7 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30,
8 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose
9 in Section 5 of Article 105 of Public Act 96-0956, is
10 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
11 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for plans,
12 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the
13 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural,
14 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This
15 is for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol
16 Building.

17 Section 10. The sum of \$548,180, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 105 of Public

1 Act 96-0956, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
2 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for
3 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, and
4 other related expenses, including architectural and
5 engineering fees associated with construction, for the
6 remodeling of office space and other support areas under the
7 jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

8 Section 15. The sum of \$49,758,619, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation heretofore
11 made for such purpose in Article 105, Section 15 of Public
12 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
13 Development Fund to the Office of the Architect of the
14 Capitol for all costs associated with capital upgrades and
15 improvements.

16 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
17 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
18 in Sections 5, 10 and 15 of this Article until after the
19 purposes and amounts have been approved in writing by the
20 Governor.

appropriations in this Article until after the purposes and
amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

10 Section 5. The sum of \$6,521,890, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation heretofore
13 made for such purpose in Article 107, Section 5 of Public Act
14 96-0956, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
15 to the Department of Central Management Services for
16 Information Technology infrastructure expenses including but
17 not limited to related hardware and equipment.

18 Section 10. The amount of \$13,500,000, or so much
19 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the

1 close of business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation
2 heretofore made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article
3 107 of Public Act 96-0956, is reappropriated from the Capital
4 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
5 Services for infrastructure improvement, hardware and related
6 costs.

7 Section 15. The sum of \$26,000,000, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation heretofore
10 made for such purpose in Article 107, Section 15 of Public
11 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
12 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
13 Services for the Illinois Century Network.

14 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
15 obligation incurred or any expenditures made from
16 appropriations in this Article until after the purposes and
17 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

19 ARTICLE 14

20 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

1 Section 10. The sum of \$6,300,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
3 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
4 Opportunity for a grant for infrastructure to match Federal
5 funds.

6 Section 15. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
8 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
9 Opportunity to develop a grant program for new and existing
10 commercial fisheries and processing facilities to reduce or
11 eliminate Asian Carp populations in Illinois.

12 Section 40. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
14 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
15 Opportunity for the University of Chicago Medical Center for
16 costs related to the Center for Community Health and for a
17 community-based facility for job training and education.

18 Section 45. The sum of \$1,800,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
20 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
21 Opportunity for the YMCA of Metropolitan Chicago for Camp
22 Duncan for capital costs for Camp Independence.

1 Section 50. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
3 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
4 Opportunity for a grant to the H-Group for construction of a
5 laundry facility and related equipment for job creation for
6 the developmentally disabled to match federal funds.

7

8 Section 55. The sum of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
10 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
11 Opportunity for a grant to Southern Illinois Regional Social
12 Services for a new facility.

13

14 Section 56. The sum of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
16 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
17 Opportunity for a grant to Morton East School for permanent
18 improvements.

19

20 Section 57. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
22 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
23 Opportunity for a grant to Lindenwood University for
24 permanent improvements.

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2 Section 60. No contract shall be entered into or
3 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
4 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
5 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
6 Governor.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

11 Section 1. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation heretofore
14 made for such purposes in Section 1 of Article 108 of Public
15 Act 96-0956, from the Port Development Revolving Loan Fund to
16 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
17 grants and loans associated with the Port Development
18 Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS 750/9-11.

18

19 Section 20. The amount of \$25,000,000 or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
21 business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation heretofore
22 made for such purposes in Section 20 of Article 108 of Public
23 Act 96-0956, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
24 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity

1 for grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield
2 sites.

3 Section 25. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
6 made in Article 108, Section 25 of Public Act 96-0956, is
7 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
8 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
9 pursuant to 20 ILCS 605/605-332 - Coal Revival Program.

10 Section 30. The sum of \$1,975,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
13 made in Article 108, Section 30 of Public Act 96-0956, is
14 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
15 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
16 associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Act.

17 Section 35. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
18 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made in Article 108, Section 35 of Public Act 96-0956, as
21 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
22 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a

1 grant to Argonne National Laboratory for bondable
2 infrastructure improvements to match federal and private
3 funds of equal or greater value.

4 Section 40. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
6 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
7 made in Article 108, Section 40 of Public Act 96-0956, is
8 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
9 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
10 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
11 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
12 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
13 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
14 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
15 within the State.

16 Section 50. The amount of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof
17 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
19 made in Article 108, Section 50 of Public Act 96-0956, is
20 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
21 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
22 to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced Protein
23 Crystallization Facility.

1 Section 55. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
2 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
3 close of business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation
4 heretofore made in Article 108, Section 55 of Public Act 96-
5 0956, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
6 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
7 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park.

8 Section 65. The amount of \$20,000,000, or so much
9 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
10 close of business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation
11 heretofore made in Article 108, Section 65 of Public Act 96-
12 0956, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
13 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
14 grants associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels
15 Development Act.

16 Section 70. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
17 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
18 close of business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation
19 heretofore made in Article 108, Section 70 of Public Act 96-
20 0956, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
21 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
22 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

1 Section 75. The amount of \$17,000,000, or so much
2 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
3 close of business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation
4 heretofore made in Article 108, Section 75 of Public Act 96-
5 0956, is reappropriated from the Coal Development Bond Fund
6 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
7 the purpose of facility cost reports prepared pursuant to
8 Section 1-75(d)(4) of the Illinois Power Agency Act.

9 Section 80. The sum of \$3,980,704, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
11 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
12 made in Article 108, Section 80 of Public Act 96-0956, as
13 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
14 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
15 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8,
16 Article 9 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

17 Section 85. The sum of \$3,130,040, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 85 of Public
21 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
22 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
2 Article 8 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

3 Section 90. The sum of \$2,600,251, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
6 made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 90 of Public
7 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
8 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

2 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
3 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to

5 Section 105. The sum of \$159,691,078, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 105 of Public
9 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
10 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
11 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to
12 local governments for planning, engineering, acquisition,
13 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and
14 extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other
15 purposes authorized in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the
16 Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for
17 such purposes.

18 Section 110. The sum of \$47,500,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 110 of Public
22 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
23 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for the purpose of fostering economic development
2 and increased employment and the well being of the citizens
3 of Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized in
4 subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
5 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

6 Section 115. The sum of \$20,537,276, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
8 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
9 made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 115 of Public
10 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
11 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
12 Opportunity for the development and improvement of
13 educational, scientific, technical and vocational programs
14 and facilities and the expansion of health and human
15 services, and for any other purposes authorized in subsection
16 (c) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for
17 grants to State agencies for such purposes.

18 Section 120. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 120 of Public
22 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
23 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for open spaces, recreational and conservation
2 purposes and the protection of land and for deposits into the
3 Conservation 2000 Projects Fund as authorized by subsection
4 (c) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for
5 grants to State agencies for such purposes.

6 Section 125. The sum of \$33,209,688, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
8 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
9 made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 125 of Public
10 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
11 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
12 Opportunity for grants to local governments for the
13 acquisition, financing, architectural planning, development,
14 alteration, installation, and construction of capital
15 facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable
16 equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of
17 Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to
18 State agencies for such purposes.

19 Section 130. The amount of \$10,000,000, or so much
20 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
21 close of business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation
22 heretofore made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 130
23 of Public Act 96-0956, is reappropriated from the Capital

1 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
2 Opportunity for grants to local governments for the
3 acquisition, financing, architectural planning, development,
4 alteration, installation, and construction of capital
5 facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable
6 equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of
7 Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to
8 State agencies for such purposes.

9 Section 135. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
10 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
11 close of business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation
12 heretofore made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 135
13 of Public Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the
14 Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
15 Economic Opportunity for grants pursuant but not limited to
16 Article 8, Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois
17 Act.

18 Section 140. The sum of \$13,745,450, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2011, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 140 of Public
22 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for
23 Illinois' Future to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for grants to units of government, educational
 2 facilities and not-for-profit organizations for education and
 3 training, infrastructure improvements and other capital
 4 projects including but not limited to planning, construction,
 5 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
 6 costs associated with economic development programs,
 7 community service programs, public health programs, public
 8 safety programs, other programs and activities, and for
 9 grants to other State agencies for any capital or operating
 10 purposes.

11 Section 145. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
 12 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
 13 close of business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation
 14 heretofore made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 145
 15 of Public Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the
 16 Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
 17 Economic Opportunity for grants to local governments for
 18 capital improvements to civic centers for the projects

 4 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
 5 business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation heretofore
 6 made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 150 of Public
 7 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
 8 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 9 Opportunity for a grant to the Chicago Zoological Society for
 10 capital improvements.

11 Section 155. The sum of \$11,700,000, or so much thereof
 12 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
 13 business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation heretofore
 14 made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 155 of Public
 15 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
 16 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 17 Opportunity for a grant to the Chicago Housing Authority for
 18 LeClaire Courts.

19 Section 160. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof
 20 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
 21 business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation heretofore
 22 made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 160 of Public

1 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
2 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

19 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
20 Opportunity for grants awarded under the Urban Weatherization
21 Initiative Act.

22 Section 175. The amount of \$29,590,932, or so much

1 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
2 close of business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation
3 heretofore made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 175
4 of Public Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the
5 Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
6 Economic Opportunity for grants and loans including but not
7 limited to broadband deployment to expand and strengthen
8 existing broadband network infrastructure, health information
9 technology, telemedicine, distance learning, and public
10 safety.

11 Section 180. The amount of \$9,739,250, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation heretofore
14 made for such purpose in Article 108, Section 180 of Public
15 Act 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
16 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
17 Opportunity for grants and loans for transportation
18 electrification infrastructure projects; including, but not
19 limited to grants and loans for the purpose of encouraging
20 electric car manufacturing and infrastructure for electric
21 vehicles.
