1 rebuild, rehabilitate, improve, maintain and operate its 2 aquarium or museum or museums within any public park now or hereafter under the control or supervision of any city or park 3 4 district, and to contract with any such directors or trustees 5 of any such aquarium, museum or museums relative to the 6 erection, enlargement, ornamentation, building, rebuilding, improvement, maintenance 7 rehabilitation, and operation 8 thereof. Any city or park district may charge, or permit such 9 an aquarium or museum to charge, an admission fee. Any such 10 aquarium or museum, however, shall be open without charge, when 11 accompanied by a teacher, to the children in actual attendance upon grades kindergarten through twelve in any of the schools 12 13 in this State at all times. Any such aquarium or museum in a 14 county with a population of less than 3,000,000 inhabitants, 15 however, must be open to the public without charge for a period 16 equivalent to 26 $\frac{52}{52}$ days, at least 6 of which must be during the period from June through August, each year. Any such 17 aquarium or museum in a county with a population of 3,000,000 18 19 or more inhabitants, however, must be open to the public 20 without charge for a period equivalent to 52 days, at least 6 21 of which must be during the period from June through August, 22 each year. Notwithstanding said provisions, charges may be made 23 at any time for special services and for admission to special 24 facilities within any aquarium or museum for the education, 25 entertainment or convenience of visitors. The proceeds of such 26 admission fees and charges for special services and special

1 facilities shall be devoted exclusively to the purposes for 2 which the tax authorized by Section 2 hereof may be used. If any owner or owners of any lands or lots abutting or fronting 3 4 on any such public park, or adjacent thereto, have any private 5 right, easement, interest or property in such public park 6 appurtenant to their lands or lots or otherwise, which would be 7 interfered with by the erection and maintenance of any aquarium or museum as hereinbefore provided, or any right to have such 8 9 public park remain open or vacant and free from buildings, the 10 corporate authorities of the city or park district having control of such park, may condemn the same in the manner 11 prescribed for the exercise of the right of eminent domain 12 13 under the Eminent Domain Act.
