

97TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2011 and 2012 HB3090

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

410 ILCS 620/3.24 new 410 ILCS 620/28 new

Amends the Illinois Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act. Provides that notwithstanding any provision of law, any person who is authorized to dispense prescription drugs in the State must accept, free of charge, expired or unwanted prescription drugs for proper disposal. Provides that the prescription drug dispenser shall make available to its customers or patients a container suitable for use as a receptacle that only permits for the deposit of items and the contents of which are locked and secured for the expired or unwanted prescription drugs. Provides that if a patient or customer is issued a prescription drug from a person who is authorized to dispense prescription drugs in the State and that prescription drug causes an adverse reaction and the patient or customer returns the remainder of the prescription drug to the dispenser, then the dispenser shall refund the full cost of the prescription drug to the patient or customer.

1 AN ACT concerning public health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act is amended by adding Sections 3.24 and 28 as follows:
- 6 (410 ILCS 620/3.24 new)
- 7 Sec. 3.24. Expired prescription drug disposal. Notwithstanding any provision of law, any person who is 8 9 authorized to dispense prescription drugs in this State must accept, free of charge, expired or unwanted prescription drugs 10 from a customer or patient for proper disposal. The 11 12 prescription drug dispenser shall make available to its customers or patients a container suitable for use as a 13 14 receptacle that only permits for the deposit of items and the contents of which are locked and secured for the expired or 15 unwanted prescription drugs. The container shall be accessible 16 to customers and patients and shall have posted clearly legible 17 signage indicating that expired or unwanted prescription drugs 18 19 may be disposed of in the container.

- Sec. 28. Prescription drug; adverse reaction. If a patient or customer is issued a prescription drug from a person who is

- 1 <u>authorized to dispense prescription drugs in this State and</u>
- 2 <u>that prescription drug causes an adverse reaction and the</u>
- 3 patient or customer returns the remainder of the prescription
- 4 <u>drug to the dispenser, then the dispenser shall refund the full</u>
- 5 cost of the prescription drug to the patient or customer.
