1 AN ACT concerning education.

## 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
2-3.153 as follows:

(105 ILCS 5/2-3.153 new) 6 7 Sec. 2-3.153. Textbook block grant program. (a) The provisions of this Section are in the public 8 9 interest, for the public benefit, and serve secular public 10 purposes. (b) As used in this Section, "textbook" means any book or 11 12 book substitute that a pupil uses as a text or text substitute, including electronic textbooks. "Textbook" includes books, 13 14 reusable workbooks, manuals, whether bound or in loose-leaf form, instructional computer software, and electronic 15 textbooks and the technological equipment necessary to gain 16 17 access to and use electronic textbooks intended as a principal source of study material for a given class or group of 18 19 students. "Textbook" also includes science curriculum 20 materials in a kit format that includes pre-packaged consumable 21 materials if (i) it is shown that the materials serve as a 22 textbook substitute, (ii) the materials are for use by the pupils as a principal learning source, (iii) each component of 23

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the materials is integrally necessary to teach the requirements of the intended course, (iv) the kit includes teacher guidance materials, and (v) the purchase of individual consumable materials is not allowed.

5 (c) Beginning July 1, 2011, subject to annual appropriation by the General Assembly, the State Board of Education is 6 7 authorized to provide annual funding to public school districts and State-recognized, non-public schools serving students in 8 9 grades kindergarten through 12 for the purchase of secular textbooks. Each public school district and State-recognized, 10 non-public school shall, subject to appropriations for that 11 12 purpose, receive a per pupil grant for the purchase of secular 13 textbooks. The per pupil grant amount must be calculated by the 14 State Board of Education utilizing the most current student enrollment data available divided by the total appropriation 15 16 made for these purposes.

## 17 (d) The State Board of Education may adopt rules as 18 necessary for the implementation of this Section.
