SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

815 ILCS 505/10e new 815 ILCS 510/3.5 new

Amends the Consumer Fraud and Deceptive Business Practices Act and the Uniform Deceptive Trade Practices Act. Provides the allowable hourly rates for attorney's fees awarded under both Acts. Provides a calculation to adjust the prices annually starting in calendar year 2013. Effective immediately.

- 8 (a) The hourly rate of reasonable attorney's fees awarded 9 under this Act shall be calculated as follows:
- (1) \$475 an hour for very experienced litigators, i.e.,
